He had been wounded in the stomach near Clefey, and brought to Ban-sur-Meurthe by American soldiers on, or about Nov. 22, 1944. We gave him first aid together with other wounded of the same outfit, especially an officer wounded at the throat. His papers have been taken away by American soldiers. Dog-tags are believed to be buried with the body.
