



I Calvin Richardson investigated the case above.

Nobody in the town of Moncel knew about X the body in the tanks wreckage, but on searching the wreckage, i found the remains. I had a sketch of this case (3254) the tanks wreckage coresponded exactly with the sketch but the number of the tank don't correspond with the case. 

(BLACK OUT PARTS OF BODY RECEIVED AT CEMETERY)







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
