(1) On the spot named Hopfkehl commune og Lemberg, the identification papers have been sent to the Ministry of Prisoners, Deportees and Refugees at Metz. The named has been killed by shell splinters.

(2) On the spot named Spitzenberg soldier Blomberg Marvin 37578186 - T 44 -44 AP killed by shells splinters.

(3) Reuel B Stubrich 36971637 T 44 AP killed by shell splinters.

Besides I certify to have buried those three soldiers on the 21st of May 1945, in the afternoon at 1500 hours after having taken away all the papers and the dog tags, which I have given to day to the American commission.



Map of Europe 1 : 200,000




