Most of the bodies were removed at that time by members of the American Army, which was fighting at the time I discovered some remains of bodies forgotten by this troop as far as I, remember there were: 5 feet, 1 arm, 1 spinal column 1 skull

According to the advice of an American Claim Service Officer I Alone buried the remains at the spot designed on the enclosed sketch. There was no personal effects except one ring which was buried with the remains.

I guided the representatives of the GR Co to the spot and they took notice of the exact place.
