2. A review of the files of the identified deceased crew members,  
of the four (4) aircraft which crashed in the vicinity of Buchenberg,  
18 July 1944, who were disinterred from the same isolated grave as the  
above listed Unknowns reveals the following:

a. Tooth chart dated 7 July 1949 submitted for Unknown X-6238,  
previously with X-6251A, compares favorably with Army dental records for  
S/Sgt. John H. Huntley, 16160362 (crew member of A/C 42-102923) who was  
identified by tags and negatively with Army records of the eleven (11)  
unidentified deceased,

b. Tooth chart dated 23 May 1946 submitted for the remains  
identified by a laundry mark as T/Sgt. Angelo R. Mazzacane, 32724304  
(crew member of A/C 42-102923) compares negatively with his dental records.

c. Seven (7) of the deceased from these four (4) aircraft have been reprocessed and two (2) have been repatriated.

3. In view of the facts outlined above, it is requested that the following action be completed:

a. The following deceased, now permanently interred in St. Avold, be reprocessed for verification of original identifications:

b. The individual identifications of 1st Lt. Don R. Maclin, 0-751560 and S/Sgt. Charles N. Thompson, 38320064, as indicated in basic communication, be established and all case papers including anthropologist's report, indicating articulation of remains, forwarded this Office at the earliest practicable date.

c. If individual identifications cannot be established for the remaining Unknowns that, upon resolution of all casualties involved in the raid on Memmingen, Germany on 18 July 1944, they be identified as the only recoverable remains of the unaccounted for crew members of the four (4) aircraft which crashed in the vicinity of Buchenberg.

4. A Presidential Inquiry has been received for Lt. Gunn; therefore, it is also requested that the above action be given priority.

1. Reference is made to radio, your office, WCL 25748 and radio AGRC 7419 dated 21 December 1949.
2. Copy of Reprocessing Report for 1/Lt Don R. Maclin, O-751560 dated 23 January 1950 is forwarded herewith as requested.
3. A comparison of skeletal charts indicates the possibility that Unknown X-6239 (St Avold) may be consolidated with Lt Don R. Maclin.
4. A review of case Unknown X-6242 (St Avold) indicates that the tooth chart dated 7 July 1949 is in almost perfect agreement with dental data for S/Sgt Charles R. THOMPSON, 38320064, an unresolved casualty who parachuted from A/C 42-107179 on 18 July 1944 in the same area from which Unknown X-6242 and associated unknowns were recovered.
5. It is the belief of this headquarters that Unknown X-6242 should be individually identified as S/Sgt Charles R. THOMPSON, and that if the consolidation mentioned in paragraph 3, above, can be accomplished, the remaining nine (9) unknowns should be identified as the only recoverable remains of the subject eleven (11) casualties. However, action on these cases will be suspended pending reply from your office.
6. It is requested that QM Form 371 or physical characteristics for Lt Don R. Maclin be forwarded with your reply.
