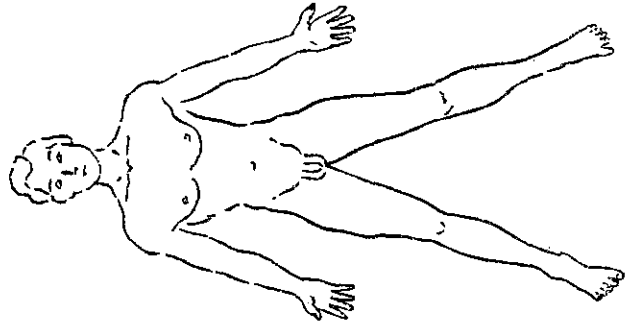

On 15 August 1946 I was dispatched to Torfhaus-Oderbrueck, Ger. to investigate the case of tank destroyer 1 A-604 TD. I found the wreck of the tank destroyer off the highway Braunlage-Bad Harzburg about 400 meters north of Oderbrueck, Ger, and obtained the following information.

On 14 April 1945 combat activities along the above mentioned highway began between Bad Harzburg and Torfhaus. On 15 April they reached Torfhaus and on 16 April Oderbrueck. The Germans defended the hills east of the road. Tank destroyer 1 A-604 TD was destroyed either on 15 or 16 April 1945 certainly by the German heavy antiaircraft battery located 400 meters far from the place where tank was hit, having good aim as the trees were cut at that place. German tanks were not seen on the 15th or 16th of April 1945. Tank destroyer came from Torfhaus and was hit by two 8.8 cm shells on the left side and burned out.

No information about the crew members could be received, as no civilians were at the scene on that or the following day. Combat activities were very strong, nobody dared to leave the house. Later on no bodies were seen or found, if there were any they were taken away by American Military.

A thorough search of the tank wreckage showed the following picture. Tank was laying on the left side and had no tracks. Part of one was laying about 3 meters away on a lane. Equipment like spoon, knife, fork, messkit, shells, magazines and remains of blankets were laying around the tank destroyer. Number of machine gun and other equipment was taken. One pocket knife, an OD-undershirt and some bones were found inside the wreck, they might belong to Merk, John W., 37423061.

No further information could be obtained.




STATEMENT

In April 1945 I was the manager of the "Magdeburger Shihuette" (house). On 16 April 1945 at about 0700 hrs in the morning the first Americans came here. There was very much fighting on that day. The German troops defended the hills east of the road Bad Harzburg-Braunlage. At about noon American tanks took part in the fighting, they were standing east of the road. German tanks must have taken part in the fight too, because six German tanks were destroyed on the road between Torfhaus and here. A German heavy Anti-aircraft battery and a light one were located on the hill behind the hut, they probably have destroyed the tank in question. I myself came to the place of accident about 7 days later. I could not see any bodies if there were any they surely were taken away by their comrades. 70 Germans were killed in action, but there are no Americans buried here.






STATEMENT

On 19 April, 1945, three days after the heavy combat activities in Oderbrueck, I walked from Bad Harzburg to Oderbrueck. Between Torfhaus and Oderbrueck I found 6 destroyed German tanks and one American. The American tank is laying about 500 meters north of the Gesthaus Oderbrueck in direction of Torfhaus. I could not see any American deceased in or near the tank, though I personally looked into it. The tank was burnt and turned over. I could not see special signs or markings, because I didn't pay too much attention to that. I do not know, if members of the crew of that tank were killed or not. I presume that the tank was destroyed by the German anti aircraft battery (heavy) which was standing about 400 meters away from this place, because they had open field as the trees were cut. Very much equipment was laying around not only near the tank.

I certify to the best of my knowledge that the above statement is true and correct.

Am 19. April 1945, drei Tage nach den schweren Kampfhandlungen in Odenbrück, kam ich von ^{Bodys} Glatby zu Fuß nach hier. Zwischen Torfhaus und Odenbrück fand ich 6 abgekommene deutsche und einen amerikanischen Panzerwagen. Der amerikanische Panzer liegt etwa 500 Meter nördlich des Gasthauses Odenbrück in Richtung auf Torfhaus. Ich konnte keinerlei Tote Amerikaner in der Nähe oder im Panzer selbst sehen, obwohl ich selbst hineingesehen habe. Das Panzer war ausgebrannt und umgekippt. Ich habe keine besonderen Merkmale wie Einheitszeichen erkennen können, zumal ich nicht so stark darauf geachtet habe. Es ist mir nicht bekannt, ob überhaupt Besatzungsmitglieder des Panzers getötet worden sind. Ich vermutete, daß die etwa 400 Meter von der Stelle entfernte deutsche Flakbatterie den Panzer kampfunfähig geschossen hat, denn sie hatte freies Schussfeld, da der Wald abgeholzt war. An Ausstattungsgegenständen lagen

sehr sehr viele Säulen mit nur in
