1. The attached correspondence indorsed to this headquarters from Headquarters Seventh Army is returned for whatever action is desired.

2. The only information available to this headquarters is the currently assigned Unknown X numbers by the U.S. Military Cemetery at St. Avold, France, on those deceased originally buried at Bensheim, which information is also on record at your headquarters as covered by the Transfer List. (Bensheim to St. Avold).

3. The attached correspondence does not reveal date of death or the location from which remains were recovered, which can be obtained only from the Report of Burial at the reintering cemetery or Burial Record Section of your headquarters.

4. Upon availability of the above information, a research of records would be required to determine Army Units within the area at that time. It is possible that such records may be available in the G-2 Section of USFET.

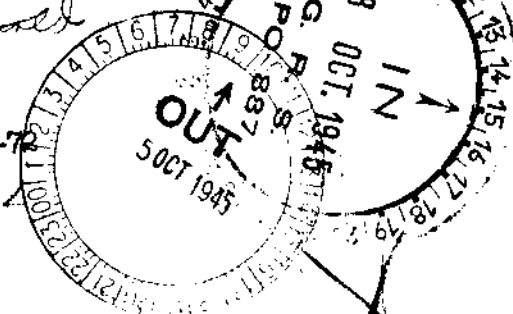
5. After the determination of the units concerned, it is highly probable that they are no longer in this theater. However, it is believed that copies of Unit Casualty Reports from the concerned units for the period involved could be obtained by your headquarters from the AG Casualty Section. Such lists would then require checking against Burial Records on file in your headquarters to eliminate those individuals on whom reports have not been submitted.

6. Inasmuch as these cases cannot be accomplished by field investigations, they are being returned to your headquarters, which it is believed has access to the records required to conduct the necessary research.
