2. In spite of a thorough search no means of identification could be found. Also no information was obtainable regarding the cause and circumstances of the death.

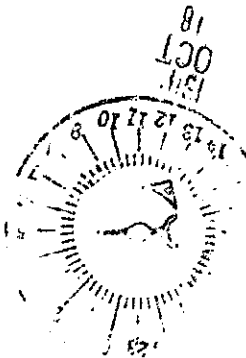

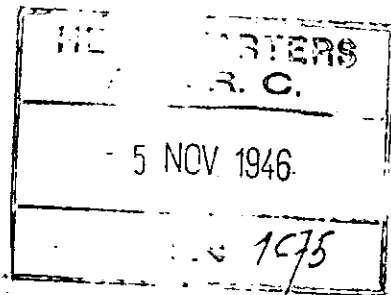

1. While investigating in the town of Baerenthal, France, an investigating team contacted a Mr. Burgun, forest guard, who stated that he had found the body of an American soldier in the forest between Munthal and Baerenthal. Investigation proved the remains to be those of an American soldier by clothing and equipment found on parts of the body. One identification tag was found on the body so that it could be identified as Mooney, Charles M., ASN 32566315.

2. It is possible that the subject soldier was killed in action in January, 1945. Very heavy fighting took place in the area at that time.

3. The remains were given Evacuation No III-Z-1 and accompanied by allied papers were transported to C.I.P. Strasbourg, France, for final processing and eventual reburial.

I, Louis A. BOCKSTAHLER, 2nd Lt. Inf, certify that when I arrived with a disinterring team in the Baerenthal forest between MUNZTHAL and BAERENTHAL in order to disinter the remains of a U.S. deceased, that later proved to be those of Charles M. MOONEY, ASN 32566315. We found in a foxhole about 10 feet from the place where the body of MOONEY was discovered, the remains of another American. He was disinterred but nothing could be found that enabled us to establish his identity, It is estimated that this man was killed in January 1945, as by that time heavy fighting was going on in the vicinity.

This dental chart is very important and should be filled in with great care. There are 32 teeth to be accounted for, as shown by the numbers on the chart. Beginning at the middle line in both upper and lower jaws, the teeth are arranged symmetrically on either side and classed as incisors (cutting teeth), cuspids or canines (tearing teeth), bicuspids (chewing teeth), and molars (principal chewing teeth). An examination should be made and findings charted to cover the following basic conditions: Lost teeth, crowned teeth, bridge work, fillings, caries (cavities of decay), dentures (plates), and any deformity of jaws found. 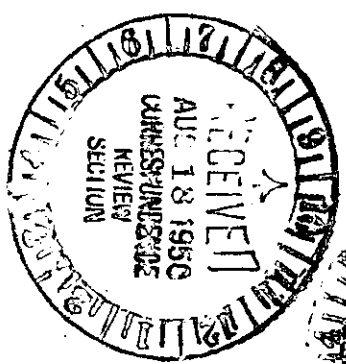
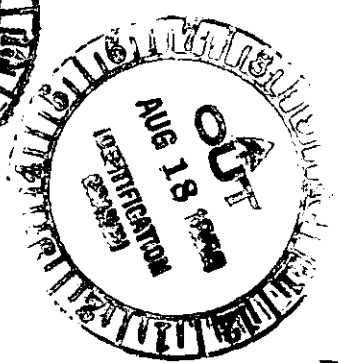



USMC ST AVOLD, FRANCE

Remains of X-7929 were recovered in the forest between Munthal and Baerenthal, France, (Map Sheet K-49/Q-84).

Physical and dental records of all casualties (United States Forces) known to have died in the territory embraced by Map Sheet K-49, which includes the area of Munthal and Baerenthal, have been accumulated and these records have been compared with dental and physical records, recorded on skeletal and tooth charts, for all cases representing unknown decedents recovered from the area here mentioned. The result of the physical records comparison was negative. All other means of effecting an association failed.

It is stated in the case papers that the remains were recovered in the vicinity of another decedent, now identified as Pfc Charles M. Mooney, 32566315, who was assigned to the 232nd Regiment of the 42nd Division. A special effort was made to associate the above mentioned remains with a casualty of that Division, the results were also negative.

In view of the negative results of this investigation, it is recommended that case designated X-7929 St Avold be declared UNIDENTIFIABLE.

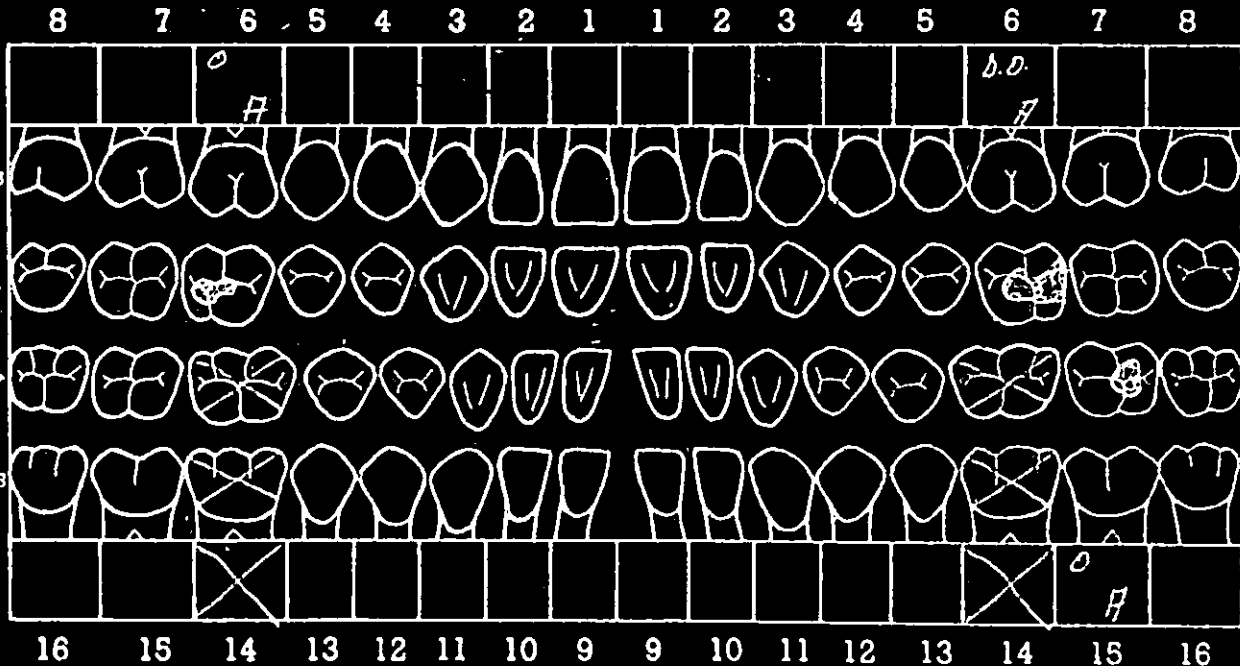

The remains of UNKNOWN (3Z-3) were discovered when a disinterring team under Lt. Louis A. BOCKSTAHLER removed the body of Charles M. MOONEY, ASN 32566315 from Section 81 of the Baerenthal forest between BARRENTAL and MUNZTHAL.


As in the case of MOONEY, this body was found in a foxhole, the two being approximately 10 feet apart. Although a thorough search was made, no means of identification could be found.

I, Louis A. BOCKSTAHLER, 2nd Lt. Inf, certify that when I arrived with a disinterring team in the Baerenthal forest between MUNZTHAL and BAERENTHAL in order to disinter the remains of a U.S. deceased, that later proved to be those of Charles M. MOONEY, ASN 32566315. We found in a foxhole about 10 feet from the place where the body of MOONEY was discovered, the remains of another American. He was disinterred but nothing could be found that enabled us to establish his identity, It is estimated that this man was killed in January 1945, as by that time heavy fighting was going on in the vicinity.

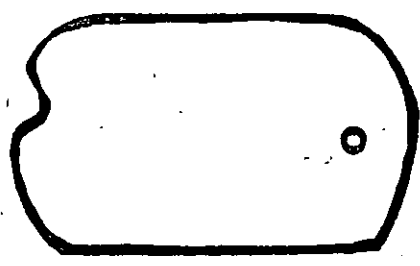

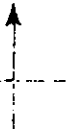
