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





Recovery #1

Identification tags recovered by Okinawan in September while digging for scrap metal. This Okinawan retained these tags at his home until 11 December at which time he turned them over to the Shuri Civilian Police. Although the general area of the recovery of these tags was known by the Shuri CP, apparently no attempt had been made to establish identity of the finder. This writer, the CI, and the Shuri CP, went to this area and found it to be completly dug over by additional Okinawans while seeking scrap metal. This turned-over area covered the entire side of a hill and a thorough search was conducted with the recovery of the enclosed mandible, femur, and calcaneus, which are not to be construed as bearing relation to recovery of ID Tags.

Recovery #2

This recovery was made on the side of a hill overlooking Yonabaru Air Strip which saw considerable action during World War II. Additional information is contained in attached DD Form 581 which was completed by Agent Beattie of Rycom GI.

Recovery #3

These eight remains were discovered by an Okinawan while searching for scrap metal. His statement reveals that these eight remains (each with individual tags), were in separate graves in a line running north and south on the west side of a hill as indicated on attached map. He further states that he removed all tags from remains along with Personal Effects and turned them over to USCAR authorities who in turn brought them to the mortuary. These ID tags and Personal Effects were consolidated in one container. This Okinawan further stated that he had removed the tags in such a manner that he was capable of returning each of them to the original grave. Although no enthusiasm was voiced by this writer, this method was adopted and tags returned as indicated. Personal Effects are forwarded as xeceived.

The eight (8) remains, recovery # 3-1 through # 3-8, were processed simultaneously for anthropological examination.

Upon examination it was found that these remains were being partially commingled.

The following skeletal interchanges have been made.

Recovery # 3-2 received the following part from Recovery # 3-4. One (1) pubis, right.

Recovery # 3-2 received the following parts from Recovery # 3-5. One (1) clavicle, left, portion of.

One (1) scapula, left, portion of. Eight (8) ribs, left, fragmentary. One (1) radius, left.

One (1) femur, left.

Recovery # 3-3 received the following part from Recovery # 3-8. One (1) tibia, left.

Recovery # 3-4 received the following parts from Recovery # 3-2. One (1) ilium, right, portions of.

Recovery # 3-5 received the following parts from Recovery # 3-2. One (1) parietal, right, portion of.

One (1) occipital, portion of.

Two (2) vertebrae, lumbar, # 2 & # 5, portions of.
One (1) ilium, left, portion of.
One (1) clavicle, left, portion of.
Two (2) scapulae, right & left, portions of.

Two (2) metacarpals, # 2 & # 3, right.

Unassociable parts were segregated from Recovery # 3-3, Recovery # 3-4, Recovery # 3-6 and were designated CIU Part # Y-7, CIU Part # Y-8, CIU Part # Y-9 as follows.

CIU Part # Y-7 removed from Recovery # 3-3.

Three (3) fragments of skull (portions of frontal, left parietal and occipital).

CIU Part # Y-8 removed from Recovery # 3-4.

One (1) femur, left, minus head and trochanters.

One (1) metatarsal, #3, left.

CIU Part # Y-9 removed from Recovery # 3-6.

One (1) mandible, left ramus and portion of body with one tooth, # 17.

One (1) ulna, right, portion of.

One (1) radius, right, portions of.

One (1) femoral condyle, left, a fragment.

Skeletal interchange and segregation were based on size, age, race, articulation and general bone-morphology.

The eight (8) remains, recovery # 3-1 through Recovery # 3-8, were designated respectively as Unknown XJ-1277 through Unknown XJ-1284.

The race determination of Unk XJ-1277 was based on crural and tarsal morphology.

The height of Unk XJ-1277 was computed to be approximately 5'8 1/8" from estimated length of left femur and tibia.

The race determination of Unk XJ-1280 was based on crural ratio and morphology.

The height of Unk XJ-1280 was computed to be approximately $5'10~7/8^n$ from the length of reconstructed right femur.

The height of Unk XJ-1281 was estimated to be approximately 5'6" - 5'8" from the comparative length of incomplete long bones.

The race of Unk XJ-1282 is questionable. Major cranial and pelvic characteristics and crural ratio are believed to be of Negroid, however the nasal area indicates remarkable Caucasoid characteristics, therefore, Unk XJ-1282 was determined Negroid-Caucasoid admixture.

The race and the height of Unk XJ-1283 are undeterminable due to the paucity of the remains.

The race of Unk XJ-1284 is believed to be Mongoloid based on bone-morphology of femur and tibia.

The height of Unk XJ-1284 was estimated to be approximately 5.3"-5.5" from the comparative length of incomplete long bones.

Necessary case papers have been prepared.
