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

Proceedings of a Board of Officers appointed in accordance with letter AGAO-S 293.9 (27 Mar 47), D-M, War Dept, TAGO, 9 April 1947

The Board convened pursuant to par 2, SO No. 1, Head-quarters American Graves Registration Command, APO 757, U.S. Army, 2 January 1950, at the Astoria Hotel, Paris, France, on 16 JAN 1950 . The purpose of the Board was to determine the non-recoverability status of certain casualties now under jurisdiction of this command.

The Board reviewed report of investigation, statements of witnesses and other papers, contained in the files of American Graves Registration Command, ZA, pertaining to the case of the following named casualty/casualties, the remains of which have not been recovered. The case records and other data considered, are attached.

RECOMMENDATION: That the case concerning subject casualty/casualties be forwarded to the office of the Quarternaster General for final approval.



SUBJECT: Non-Recoverable Remains

1. It is recommended that the board take action on the following case:

NAMES: GREGORY, Jesse L., Pfc., 37 458 869 WAXT, Fred (NMI)., Pvt., 37 704 754

ORGANIZATION: Co "B" 814th Tank Dest.

PLACE OF DEATH: Vic. of Meijel, Holland

DATE OF DEATH: 29 October 1944

SYNOPSIS OF CASE: The above listed unresolved casualties were members of a Tank Destroyer company which was engaged in action against the enemy in the vicinity of Meijel, Holland; on 29 October 1944. There is no additional information available regarding the specific circumstances under which subject casualties became missing. A Field Investigation conducted in the appropriate area in February 1949 disclosed the fact that several American tanks were destroyed during a German counter-attack during the latter part of October 1944. The territory in which these tanks were located was captured by the enemy and occupied by them for several weeks. The damaged tanks were subsequently removed by American troops after the area had been retaken. Investigation also disclosed that there are no remains of American deceased in this area. It is logical to conclude that Pfc Jesse L. Gregory and Pvt Fred Wayt were killed in action against the enemy in the vicinity of Meijel, Holland, on 29 October 1944 and that their remains were disposed of by the enemy in a manner which precludes recovery. The fact that Field Investigation was negative and the fact that there are no Unknowns on record that may be associated with the subject casualties would tend to substantiate this conclusion: It is therefore recommended that this case be deemed Non-Recoverable.

Reference is made to: OQMG Forms 371; Report of Field Investigation, dated February 1949.

- 2. All attached supporting documents are copied from records on file headquarters American Graves Registration Command.
- 3. Every effort has been made to correlate this case with records in this headquarters pertaining to unknown deceased interred in U S Military Cemeteries and reported isolated burials. The results are negative.
- A. It is recommended that the remains, based upon the above information and research, be declared non-recoverable.

NARRATIVE

In order to locate the remains of Pvt WAYF, 3770475 an investigation was conducted in the MEYEL-ASTEN area.

Mr. L. SANDERS burgomaster of Meyel declared that no American Military are buried in his community. All remains in isolated graves were identified as German. The tanks that remained on the teritory of Meyel were taken away by American units.

Mr. P. AARTS, acting burgomaster of Asten declared same as Mr. Sanders.

Mr. G. J. GOODEN, former commandant of the Forces of the Interior at Meyel, declared that there are no American remains on the territory of the Community of Meyel. Several American tanks were destroyed during a German counterattack towards the end of October 1944. This German counterattack took place between Meyel and Asten. Mr. Gooden knows that several of these destroyed American tanks contained carbonized American remains. The territory in which these tanks were located as captured and held by the enemy for several weeks. After the second liberation of Meyel these tanks were removed by American troops. On removal several carbonized remains were still in the tanks. Mr. Gooden does not know what happened to these remains.

Mr. P. HOEFNAGEL; former commandant of the Forces of the Interior at Asten declared there are no American remains on the territory of the community of Asten, declared the same as Mr. Gooden.

Numerous people who lived in the front lines in October-November 1944 declared that no American remains are buried there.

CONCLUSION: According to OQMG Form 371 Pvt WAYT was a member of a T.D. Bn. None of the persons interrogated knew anything about American bubials. There are no more American vehicles (tanks. T.D. or otherwise) in the Meyel-Asten area. In view of these facts it is my opinion that remains of Pvt Fred WAYT 37704754 are non-recoverable



If, by any chance, the property has not reached you at the expiration of thirty days from this date, please notify me and tracer will be instituted.


