Report of Burial for Unknown X-462, U.S. Military Cemetery #1, Henri Chapelle, Belgium, indicates that deceased was disinterred from a common grave of 5 remains at coordinates P-803888, 1 mile west of Sart-Lez-St. Vith, Belgium. The remains of Milton E. Fein, Lawrence D. Smith, Unknown X-55 and Unknown X-57 were disinterred from the same grave. Fein and Smith were members of the 48th Armored Infantry Battalion.
