An investigation was conducted in the vicinity of HABKIRCHEN, (K-50, 5989), Germany, and the following information was obtained:

Upon arrival at HABKIRCHEN, Germany, I contacted OTTO ZAPP, local farmhand. He stated that he does not have any knowledge of American graves believed to be buried on the German side of the BLIES River, in the district of HABKIRCHEN. In the Summer of 1945, he saw an American raincoat lying on the German side of the BLIES River, just opposite the town of BLIES-EBERSINGEN. This area is still mined. (See Exhibit "A").

I then contacted the Burgermeister of BLIES-EBERSINGEN, France. According to his statement, there were four (4) American soldiers buried in this town. They were identified and disinterred by the 3049th QM, AGRC. A Notice of Disinterment was left with the Burgermeister. (See Exhibit "B").

We then proceeded to BLIESBRUCK, France and contacted the Burgermeister. He stated that six (6) American soldiers had been disinterred from the district of BLIESBRUCK and evacuated to a Military cemetery at St. Avold, France. Four (4) of the bodies were identified and two (2) remained unknown. (See Exhibit "C").

We then contacted JEAN BECK, official of the town hall in Saargemund, France. He gave us a copy of the local cemetery files. According to the files, an Allied soldier dressed in American clothes, approximately 20 to 30 years of age, 5'11" tall and two (2) teeth missing from the upper jaw, had been found in the BLIES River in February 1946. The body was buried in the local cemetery and was disinterred in May 1946 by the 535th QM, AGRC, and evacuated to St. Avold, France. The name of the deceased remained unknown.

CONCLUSION:

According to statements from persons interviewed, all American soldiers who had been buried along the BLIES River, in the districts of HABKIRCHEN, Germany, BLIESBRUCK, France and BLIES-EBERSINGEN, France, have been disinterred and evacuated to the Military Cemetery in St. Avold, France.

I, Hugo Breyer, Bürgermeister of the community of Habkirchen, declare the following:

As to my knowledge, all Americans who were killed in action within the community district, during the period from December 1944 to March 1945, were removed by American units immediately after the battle. The number of deceased soldiers is unknown to me. In the Summer of 1946, investigations for Allied soldiers were conducted by a French or American unit within the area of the Blies River. I do not know whether any deceased were recovered.

During the time I have been in office, (since October 1946), no American Graves Registration Command has been here. It is possible, however, that there are still bodies in the area of the Reinheimer Wald (between Reinheim and Habkirchen), which has not yet been demined. I do not know anything definite though.
