SYNOPSIS: The casualties listed on attached roster are reported by official records as Missing In Action or Killed In Action during ground air or naval operations in the department of Manche, France, from the period of 5 June 1944 to 15 August 1944. Extensive area searches as well as individual investigations have to date failed to furnish information as to the ultimate disposition of their remains. Efforts to effect association with unidentified recoveries from the area, now interred in U.S. Military Cemeteries, have also proven negative. The lack of specific information regarding the death or burial, limited search in most instances to general localities, however, documents on file in this Office and Office of The Quartermaster General substantiate the fact that numerous investigations covering the entire department of the Manche, have been conducted in the course of search operations for all losses, both recovered and unrecovered. The terrain of the Manche department, for the most part, consists of farm and pasture land which has been under constant cultivation and daily use since the cessation of hostilities, thus the possibility of undiscovered graves is remote. It can therefore only be concluded that the remains of the deceased in question were reduced by battle action to a state which precludes recovery or identification. The absence of specific information concerning their deaths, the failure of Field Investigations to provide evidence, and the lack of association with recovered unknowns would tend to substantiate these

conclusions. It is recommended that the remains of the individuals listed in these Board Proceedings be considered Non-Recoverable under the provisions of paragraph 3b, Letter, Office of The Quartermaster General, file QMGMP 293, Subject: Processing Board Findings of Non-Recoverability Return of World War II Dead Program, dated 25 March 1949.

MEMORANDUM FOR RECORD

SUBJECT: Review of Circumstances Surrounding the Disappearance
of Personnel Presumed Dead.

1. Private Samuel Forman, 32960099, Medical Detachment, 320th Infantry Regiment, was reported missing in action, in France, on 13 August 1944, by ETO Shipment No. 173, and was presumed dead as of 14 August 1945, under the provisions of Section 5 of the Missing Persons Act, by SR&D No. 3848.

2. In the AG 201 file of subject soldier is a "Missing Report", dated 18 August 1944, signed by Major Lloyd A. Smith, which states that on 13 August 1944, Private Forman was assigned as aid man to company "M" and departed from Class 2 highway southwest of Mortain to Railroad track section, also southwest of Mortain (approximately thirty five miles southeast of St. Lo, in northwestern France). Private Forman was seen near the Railroad track with three wounded men by Private Barberis, who later returned to lend aid but could find neither Private Forman nor the wounded men.

3. Also filed in Private Forman's AG 201 file are records of award of the Bronze and Silver Star. The citation for these awards states that on the day he became missing he voluntarily attached himself to a patrol, when his own company was inactive, and accompanied that patrol into enemy territory in order to administer first aid to the wounded. He sent one aid man back for a litter squad but when they arrived no trace could be found of any of the men.

4. Subject enlisted man was posthumously awarded the Combat Infantryman Badge by Circular 151, WD 1945.

5. Private Forman was never reported as a prisoner of war, an internee, or as having returned to duty.

6. The Memorial Division, OCMG, reports that there is no burial information of record pertaining to Private Forman. However, the following is quoted from a notation in file:

"Form 371 for Forman, Samuel #32960099, returned by the Field, reads as follows:

"Records of this Headquarters indicate that one of the following unknowns may be associated with Forman:

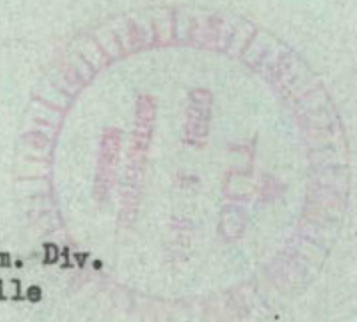

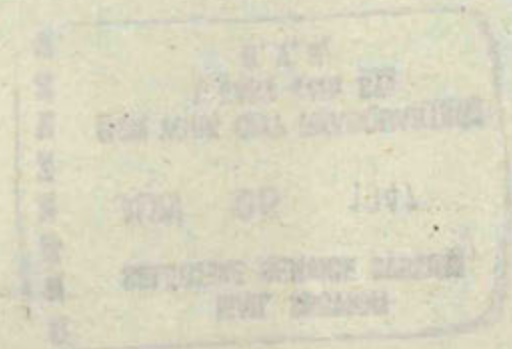

Dear Miss Forman:

I am referring to your letter of 27 February 1946, concerning your brother, Private Samuel Forman, in whose case a finding of death has been made under the provisions of Public Law 490, 77th Congress, as amended, the presumed date of death having been set as 14 August 1945.

The feelings which prompted your communication are most understandable and I wish to advise you that the War Department does not deem it a sound policy to make a finding of death while any reasonable ground remains for presuming that an individual may still be alive. Full consideration was given to all available information regarding the circumstances surrounding your brother's disappearance before a finding of death was made. There is no record in this office showing that Private Forman was ever a prisoner of war.

I wish to advise you that at the present time specially trained searching units are being utilized in the European Theater for the purpose of obtaining additional information regarding all missing personnel, including those in whose cases official findings of death have been made. These search units interrogate public officials and the native populace, examine cemetery records, and contact civil authorities. Searches and investigations conducted by the overseas authorities have resulted in the location of many isolated graves, and the establishment of conclusive evidence of death in a number of cases. I can assure you that any further data received concerning your son will be promptly communicated to you.

The Quartermaster General, Washington 25, D. C., has jurisdiction over matters pertaining to the burial of our military personnel who die overseas and I am, therefore, forwarding your inquiry regarding this matter, to that official for appropriate attention and direct reply to you.

Your letter to The Adjutant General concerning your brother, the late Private Samuel Forman, has been received in this office.

I regret that I must inform you that information concerning the burial of the remains of your brother has not yet been received in this office. However, our Graves Registration Forces in the field are making a complete and thorough search of all areas over which our men fought. All available information such as enemy reports of death and burial, either captured or transmitted through the International Red Cross, results of interrogation of returned Prisoners of War, statements made by natives of the localities being searched, and reports submitted by Commanding Officers and fellow soldiers who were in the vicinity at the time of the fatality, are being used to implement their efforts. It is contemplated that all remains so recovered will be interred in established American Military Cemeteries pending the initiation of the Program of Repatriation. I sincerely hope that this intensive search will result in the discovery and the identification of your brother's remains. Please be assured that when information is received that this is accomplished and his remains have been properly interred, you will be informed without delay.

This office regrets the delay in answering your letter and extends its sincere sympathy in the loss of your brother.

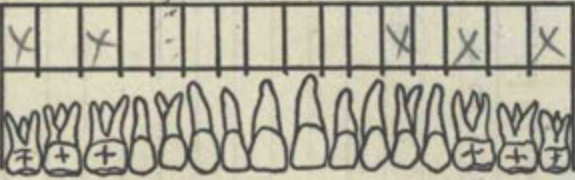

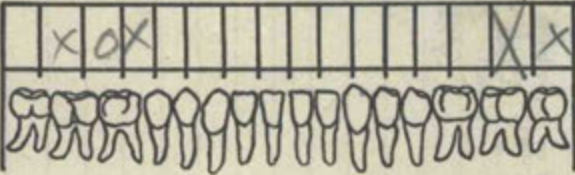
