NARRATIVE OF INVESTIGATION

I. AUTHORITY:

In compliance with the instructions contained in ID # 482, dated 21 September 1950, an investigation was conducted in the vicinity of Diffembach, France in an effort to recover the remains of Pvt Woodrow W. HAMILTON, 39 604 664.

II. FACTS AND CIRCUMSTANCES:

The above listed decedent was a member of Co. "E" 137th Inf. Regt. and was missing in action on 23 November 1944 while participating in a patrol about five hundred yards East of Diffembach in a wooded area called Bois-Habst.

III. FINDINGS:

A visit was made to the following Town Halls: Diffembach: The Secretary for the Mayor and the town constable were questioned and both stated that there were no American graves in the area around Diffembach. They further stated that there were no Americans ever buried there. Puttelange: A visit was made to the town hall of the nearby town of Puttelange where the Mayor was questioned. The Mayor stated that he was there during the war and that during the fighting for that section that there were never any Americans killed within the commune of Puttelange. He also said that no graves of any kind have ever been reported. The only graves that ever were in the Commune were those of German Soldiers killed in air raids before November 1944. These were buried where they died by the towns people. The mayor informed us that the village of Diffembach was within the commune of Puttelange. St Jean-Rohrbach: Here the Secretary to the Mayor was questioned and also town constable. Both stated that there were no American graves in the area. They told us that all of the Americans killed in that area were evacuated the next day when the Americans occupied the town. The Mayor's secretary and the Constable have both explored the wooded area know as " Bois-Habst" and both say that there are no graves of any kind in the woods. The records of the town do not show any burials of Americans. Both the Secretary and the Constable stated that the only grave around the area was that of an unknown German. The Constable led us to this grave and it was opened. The remains were positively identified as those of a German Soldier. With this all means of investigation were exhausted.

IV. CONCLUSIONS:

From the evidence found in the investigation and contained in the attached statements it is concluded that:

- a. Until further information is found, such as an eye witness account, the remains of the subject decedent are unrecoverable.
- b. Until definite evidence to the contrary is discovered it must be assumed that Pvt. HAMILTON was taken prisoner rather than killed and if now dead in all likely hood at some other place while enroute to the German POW Camp.

V. RECOMMENDATIONS:

That the case be classed as unrecoverable.

STATEMENT OF THE MAYOR OF PUTTELANGE:

The undersigned mayor of Puttelange declare declare that during the fight of liberation there was not any fighting in the immediate vicinity of this city. I do not know of any Americans killed in or around Puttelange

Many German Soldiers have been killed during an air raid before the advance of the American troops, and they have been buried where they died by the civilians. The village of Diffembach is within the commune of PUTTELANGE.

STATEMENT OF THE MAYOR OF DIFFEMBACH:

The undersigned mayor of Diffembach declares that he has not had any American or German graves since November 1944. In the territory of Diffembach.

STATEMENT OF THE MAYOR OF ST. JEAN ROHRBACH:

The undersigned, Joseph Dross, Secretary of the Mayor declares that all American Soldiers killed in the vicinity were killed between 22 Nov. 1944 and 23 Nov. 1944 and further that all were evacuated by the American Troops.

The woods, "Bois Habst", has been often explored by the towns people and at no time has an American grave been found.

To my knowledge no American Soldiers have been buried in the Commune of St. Jean-Rohrbach

There is only one grave of any kind in the area and that is one of an unknown German Soldier. This one was opened today by the Americans and the remains within were found to be that of a German Soldier.



SYNOPSIS: The casualties listed on attached roster are reported by official records as Missing in Action or Killed in Action during ground or air operations in the department of Moselle, France, from the period 5 September 1944 to 16 March 1945. Extensive area searches as well as individual investigation have to date failed to furnish information as to the ultimate disposition of their remains. Efforts to effect association with unidentified recoveries from the area, now interred in U.S. Military Cemeteries, have also proven negative. The lack of specific information regarding the death or burial, limited search in most instances to general localities, however, documents on file in this Office and Office of The Quartermaster General substantiate the fact that numerous investigations covering the entire department of Moselle have been conducted in the course of search operations for all losses, both recovered and unrecovered. The terrain of the Moselle department, for the most part, consists of farm, pasture and forested areas which has been under constant cultivation and supervision by farmers and forest guards, since the cessation of hostilities, thus the possibility of undiscovered graves is remote. It can therefore be concluded that the remains of the deceased in question were reduced by battle action to a state which precludes recovery or identification. The absence of specific information concerning their deaths, the failure of Field Investigations to provide

evidence and the lack of association with recovered unknowns would tend to substantiate these conclusions. It is recommended that the remains of the individuals listed in these Board Proceedings be considered Non-Recoverable under the provisions of paragraph 3b, Letter, Office of The Quartermaster General, file QMGMP 293, Subject: Processing Board Findings of Non-Recoverability Return of World War II Dead Program, dated 25 March 1949.

Reference is made to: OQMG Forms 371; After Action Reports, and Casualty Clearance Plan; concerning each decedent; Reports of Field Investigations previously forwarded to The Office of The Quartermaster General, pertaining to resolved casualties who were killed in action in the Department of Moselle, France; on file in the Office of The Quartermaster General, Washington, D. 

SUBJECT: Review of Circumstances Surrounding the Disappearance of
Pfc Woodrow W. Hamilton, 39604664

1. Private First Class Woodrow W. Hamilton, 39604664, Infantry, was reported missing in France 23 November 1944, by ETO Shipment No. 026, and was presumed dead as of 24 November 1945, under the provisions of Section 5 of the Missing Persons Act. The initial report gave his grade as private; ETO Shipment No. 177 stated that the correct grade was private first class. An entry in his service record indicates that he was promoted to the higher grade effective 11 February 1945.

2. SR&D Case No. 4761, dated 24 November 1945, File: AG 704 Dead (24 Nov 45), reviewed the circumstances of the disappearance of the subject soldier, and others, and recommended that a finding of death be made, showing the presumed date of death, in each case, to be 24 November 1945. Information on which the presumption of death was based, in the case of Private Hamilton, was found in a "Missing Report" in his Casualty file. According to this report, he was a member of Company "E", 137th Infantry Regiment, and on 23 November 1944 was in command of a flank patrol assigned to protect the advance of a column of troops along the main road from Diffembach (Diffembach), France, to Gean Roervach (St. Jean-Rohrbach), France. He and the other members of the patrol were last seen entering a wood in which they were ambushed and taken prisoner by the Germans. All efforts to save them were unavailing.

3. Official records of the Department of the Army show that the 35th Division, of which the 137th Infantry Regiment was a part, was active at Leyviller, Diffembach, and St. Jean-Rohrbach on 22 November 1944, and that heavy resistance was encountered at St. Jean-Rohrbach. On 23 November the enemy counterattacked near Hilsprich, 1½ miles southeast of St. Jean-Rohrbach. The villages named are a few miles southeast of St. Avold, France.

4. Private Hamilton was in charge of a patrol assigned to protect the advance of troops along the road between Diffembach and St. Jean-Rohrbach, a few miles southeast of St. Avold, France, on 23 November 1944. The patrol was seen to enter a wood, where they were ambushed and (presumably) captured by the enemy. No further report regarding the subject soldier has been

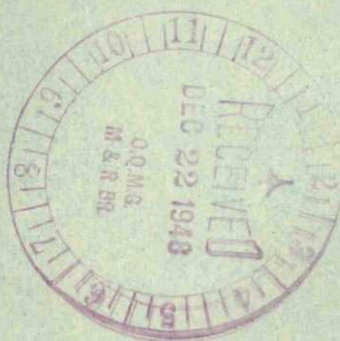

7. a. Private First Class Woodrow W. Hamilton was assigned to Company E, 137th Infantry. According to information contained in a Missing Report, dated 21 May 1945, submitted by his organization and filed in his Casualty Branch file, Private Hamilton was "In Command of Flank Patrol" and was last known to have been "500 yards east of Diffembach, France, in wooded area". The following brief resume of circumstances surrounding his disappearance is a part of the Missing Report:

"Pvt Hamilton was given a mission of a flank patrol to protect the advance of a column of troops which were advancing on the main road from Diffembach, (Diffembach) France to Gean Roervach, (Jean Rohrbach), France. Pvt Hamilton and his patrol were last seen entering a woods in which the Germans ambushed the patrol and took them prisoners. All efforts were made to save them but to no avail."

b. Filed with Private Hamilton's Service Record is a Morning Report Locator Card, dated 31 December 1945, showing him assigned to the 137th Infantry Regiment. March 1945 Rosters of Company E, 137th Infantry show him as a loss as of 23 November 1944.

Dear Mrs. Hamilton:

It distresses me to inform you that no report of any change in status has been received since my last letter to you concerning your husband, Private First Class Woodrow W. Hamilton, 39,604,664, who was reported missing in action on 23 November 1944.

A report, however, regarding the circumstances surrounding his disappearance now available in the War Department discloses that your husband was given a mission in command of a flank patrol to protect the advance of a column of troops which were advancing on the main road from Diffenbach, France to Gean, France. Private Hamilton was last seen entering a wooded area near Diffenbach, France.

If a missing person has not been accounted for at the termination of twelve months' absence in a missing status, all available information concerning his disappearance is reviewed pursuant to the provisions of Public Law 490, 77th Congress, as amended. Following that review the War Department is authorized to continue the person's missing status or to make a finding of death if the missing person may no longer reasonably be presumed to be living. In the process of reviewing the case of missing persons the War Department gives careful consideration to all pertinent data or evidence which can be collected from any available source. Occasionally relatives and friends of missing persons receive communications containing pertinent and reliable information which has not been reported officially to the War Department. If you have received any such communications, it will be greatly appreciated if you will forward the communications or photostatic copies thereof to this office. After examination they will be returned to you if you so desire.

The War Department is mindful of the anguish you have so long endured and you may rest assured that, without any further request on your part, you will be advised promptly if any additional information concerning your loved one is received. Should it become necessary to establish his status in accordance with the provisions of the Law cited, you will be notified of the findings shortly after the expiration of the twelve months' absence.

Dear Mrs. Hamilton:

Since your husband, Private First Class Woodrow W. Hamilton, 39,604,664, Infantry, was reported missing in action 23 November 1944, the War Department has entertained the hope that he survived and that information would be revealed dispelling the uncertainty surrounding his absence. However, as in many cases, the conditions of warfare deny us such information. The records of the War Department show that he took part in the drive into Germany in the Aachen area. He was in command of a flank patrol to protect a column of troops advancing along the main road from Diffembach, France, to Jean Rohrbach, France. He and his patrol were last seen entering a wooded area in which they were ambushed by the Germans who it was believed at the time captured them.

Full consideration has recently been given to all available information bearing on the absence of your husband, including all records, reports and circumstances. These have been carefully reviewed and considered. In view of the fact that twelve months have now expired without the receipt of evidence to support a continued presumption of survival, the War Department must terminate such absence by a presumptive finding of death. Accordingly, an official finding of death has been recorded under the provisions of Public Law 490, 77th Congress, approved March 7, 1942, as amended.

The finding does not establish an actual or probable date of death; however, as required by law, it includes a presumptive date of death for the termination of pay and allowances, settlement of accounts and payment of death gratuities. In the case of your husband this date has been set as 24 November 1945, the day following the expiration of twelve months' absence.

I regret the necessity for this message but trust that the ending of a long period of uncertainty may give at least some small measure of consolation. I hope you may find sustaining comfort in the thought that the uncertainty with which war has surrounded the absence of your husband has enhanced the honor of his service to his country and of his sacrifice.

Subject: Report after Action against Enemy.

23 November 1944

On the morning of November 23 all battalions were attacking. The 2d, jumping off at 0800 from the high ground midway between Diffembach and Hilsprich, moved through the Machweld Woods and swung right, to the southwest of Hilsprich. The 1st Battalion moved out from St Jean to approach Hilsprich from the northwest. The 3d Battalion, at Leyviller, moved their motorized platoon from Company I around through Freyhouse to clear Fremestroff. Other elements of the battalion moved on Altrippe, while another force attacked the Habst Woods to clean out those Germans which had escaped after their counter-attack on the 2d Battalion had failed the day before.

Fremestroff was cleared by 0900, and before noon the 3d Battalion had gained all objectives, with Company K occupying Altrippe, Company I occupying Fremestroff, and Company L returning to Leyviller after clearing the Habst Woods.

The 2d Battalion entered the woods north of Zellen at 0930, and by noon was emerging from the southeast tip of the woods. Here they received direct fire from the high ground to the east, and were pinned down and unable to advance during the afternoon.

The 1st Battalion encountered stiff resistance in their advance on Hilsprich. The town was well defended with heavy tanks and infantry, and surrounding high ground was bristling with dug-in enemy positions. Six hundred yards west of town the 1st Battalion ran into terrific fire from the German positions, and at 1330, with heavy tanks discovered operating in the town, the Battalion Commander requested that all artillery possible be thrown into the objective. The Germans threw back the first attempt to enter the town, and only after hard fighting and receiving heavy casualties were our forces able to get into the stronghold. Company A suffered serious losses, including Captain Sidney K Strong, their commanding officer, killed by 20 mm fire while leading his men in the attack.

The main enemy force withdrew to the east, but shortly before dusk came back into Hilsprich with tanks and inflicted further losses on troops of the battalion there. Breaking into the town at both ends of the main street, the enemy tanks worked toward the center of town, firing point blank on buildings and troops. Company C lost heavily, with twenty-nine missing, including 1st Lieutenant Alfred G Davis, Company Commander, and three company officers, 1st Lieutenant James M Lloyd, 2d Lieutenant Wilbur F Hobbs and 2d Lieutenant Ira C Austin. The remaining troops withdrew to St Jean.

The Hilsprich engagement was a costly one to the 1st Battalion, as they lost four men killed, twenty-six wounded and thirty-nine missing during the attack and the enemy counterattack that followed. Total casualties in the regiment were ten killed, seventy-six wounded and forty missing.

Sixteen Germans were captured on the 23d.

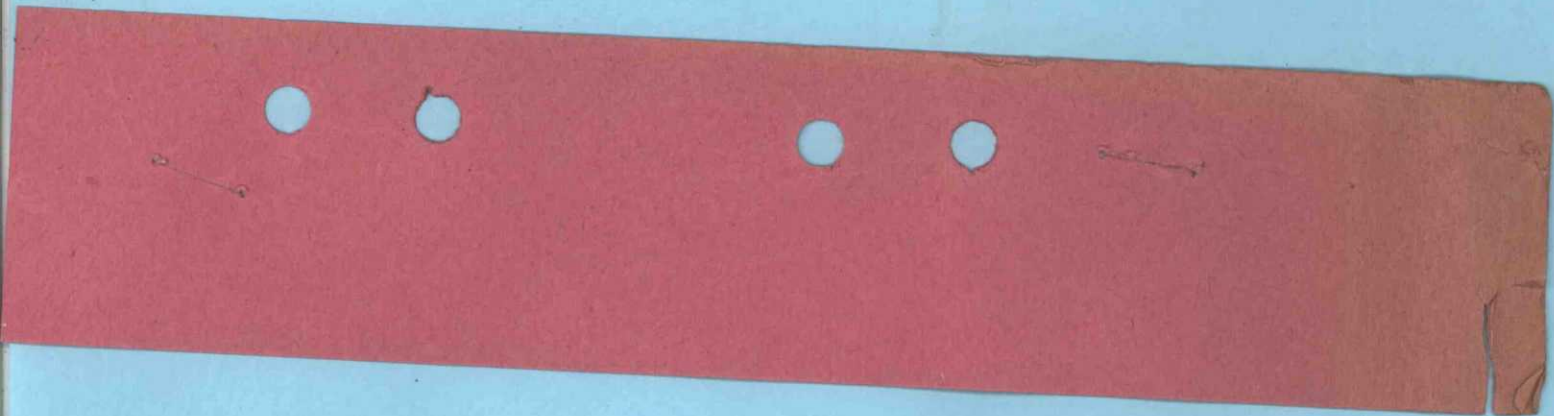
