## War Casualties From Area In Current Week Total 147

**The Summary Shows  
Twenty-five Killed,  
Eighty-one Wound-  
ed, Thirty-five Miss-  
ing and Three Pris-  
oners of War — To-  
day's List of Twenty-  
three Carries Names  
of Six Dead.**

With the addition today of twenty-three more service-  
men, including six dead, four  
missing and twelve wounded  
in action in various theaters  
of operation, the number of  
regional casualty reports published  
in The Times since Monday totals  
147. The summary shows twenty-five  
killed, eighty-one wounded, thirty-  
five missing, three prisoners of  
war and three returned to duty  
after being previously listed as miss-  
ing.

Among the dead reported today  
are two soldiers each in Belgium and  
Luxembourg and a sailor in the  
Western Pacific—the third regional  
member of the crew of the destroyer,  
U. S. S. Hull, lost in a typhoon on  
Dec. 18. Two of those reported miss-  
ing by the War Department are hos-  
pitalized, according to letters to  
members of their families. The  
wounded include two Scranton  
brothers, one in Germany and the  
other in Burma.

Pvt. Anthony A. Laskowski, thirty-  
one, husband of the former Miss  
Evelyn Polkoshnik, 113 Central Ave-  
nue, Newark, N. J., formerly of  
217½ George Street, Moosic, and  
son of Komynes Laskowski, Smith  
Street, Old Forge, who was pre-  
viously reported missing in action  
in France since Oct. 10, was killed  
on that date, according to a mes-  
sage to his wife from the War De-  
partment. He was in the army en-  
gineers.

Private Laskowski, a native of  
Greenwood, attended the Greenwood  
school and was a communicant of  
SS. Peter and Paul Church, Avoca.  
He entered the army on March 9,  
1944, received basic infantry training  
at Camp Blanding, Fla., and went  
overseas last August from Fort  
Meade, Md.

Also surviving are three sisters,  
Mrs. Anthony Gerlak, Dupont, and Mrs.  
John Konjula, Newark, three broth-  
ers, Joseph, this city; Chester,  
Newark, who was injured while  
serving in Panama and was hon-  
orably discharged from the army, and  
Private Frank, who was wounded  
in action in Italy and is now an in-  
structor at the Aberdeen, Md., Prov-  
ing Grounds.

### Sergt. Dellamalva Seriously Wounded

Sgt. John Dellamalva, 23, son of  
Mrs. Libera Dellamalva, Griffiths  
street, Hughestown, and brother of  
Peter (Daley) Dellamalva of 121  
Smith street, Dupont, was seriously  
wounded December 21, two days  
after returning to duty after an  
earlier mishap in Germany, accord-  
ing to a War Department message  
to his mother yesterday. He was first  
wounded slightly in Germany on De-  
cember 8th. His father, Thomas, was  
fatally injured Oct. 7 at the No. 9  
colliery, Hughestown. Sgt. Della-

SYNOPSIS: The casualties listed on attached roster are reported by official records as Missing in Action or Killed in Action during ground or air operations in the department of Moselle, France, from the period 5 September 1944 to 16 March 1945. Extensive area searches as well as individual investigation have to date failed to furnish information as to the ultimate disposition of their remains. Efforts to effect association with unidentified recoveries from the area, now interred in U.S. Military Cemeteries, have also proven negative. The lack of specific information regarding the death or burial, limited search in most instances to general localities, however, documents on file in this Office and Office of The Quartermaster General substantiate the fact that numerous investigations covering the entire department of Moselle have been conducted in the course of search operations for all losses, both recovered and unrecovered. The terrain of the Moselle department, for the most part, consists of farm, pasture and forested areas which has been under constant cultivation and supervision by farmers and forest guards, since the cessation of hostilities, thus the possibility of undiscovered graves is remote. It can therefore be concluded that the remains of the deceased in question were reduced by battle action to a state which precludes recovery or identification. The absence of specific information concerning their deaths, the failure of Field Investigations to provide

evidence and the lack of association with recovered unknowns would tend to substantiate these conclusions. 



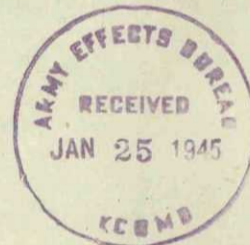
