- 1. Pfc Harry V. Cornett, 35791626, a member of Headquarters Company, 2nd Battalion, 10th Infantry Regiment was reported missing in action, not in flying pay status, in France on 12 September 1944 by ETO Shipment Number 202 and presumed dead as of 13 September 1945 under the provisions of Section 5, Missing Persons Act (SR&D Case No. 4059).
- 2. The Cesualty Section file of Private Cornett contains a Missing Report, dated 25 November 1944, signed by 1st Lt. Leo J. Gronek, Infantry which shows that Private Cornett's last known whereabouts was on a truck which was on a ferry crossing the Moselle River on 12 September 1944. A resume of circumstances surrounding his disappearance as set forth in the report follows:

"Pfc Harry V. Cornett was last seen sitting on top of a $2\frac{1}{2}$ truck prior to enemy shelling of the River. The truck on a ferry received one direct hit and several near hits throwing some of the occupants into the water. This occurred at approximately 0100 hours and due to darkness and smoke a search was difficult and although a search could not be made until the following morning until it was light enough to see, at that time a search was made and continued for five days."

a. The AG file of Private Cornett contains a memorandum, dated 31 March 1945, by Lieutenant Gronek which gives the following additional information concerning the extent of search:

"Searched both banks for five days and all known dead were carefully Bcrutinized but no trace could be found of Pfc Cornett. All aid stations were checked back to clearing station."

4. The Memorial Division, Office of the Quartermaster General recently forwarded to this office an approved copy of the Proceedings of a Board of Officers convened at Headquarters, American Graves Registration Command, European Area, relative to Private Cornett. The pertinent part of the Proceedings are quoted:

"Place of Death: Moselle River
"Date of Death: 12 September 1944

"Synopsis of Case: According to information available at this headquarters, the above was on a ferry crossing the Moselle River in the vicinity of Ponta-Mousson, Meurthe-et-Moselle, when the ferry received a direct hit by enemy artillery fire. Field investigation conducted on the case proved negative. It is believed that subject soldier was drowned and that the remains have to date, not been recovered."

- "2. All attached supporting documents are copied from records in file headquarters American Graves Registration Command.
- "3. Every effort has been made to correlate this case with records in this headquarters pertaining to unknown deceased interred in US Military Cemeteries and reported isolated burials. The results are negative.
- "4. It is recommended that the remains, based upon the above information, be declared non-recoverable."
- 5. The subject person was on a 2½ ton truck loaded with ammunition which was being ferried, at night, across the Moselle River near Pont-a-Mousson, France. The enemy shelled the crossing and the truck received a direct hit from enemy artillery fire and several near hits. "This occurred at approximately 0100 hrs." Search was made the following morning for Private Cornett and continued for five days, in this area along both banks of the Moselle River, without avail. The captured German records contain no information relative to Private Cornett. The American Graves Registration Command conducted an extensive search in the spring of 1947 without finding any trace of Private Cornett. Nothing has been seen or heard of him since he was reported missing. Considering the above facts and the lapse of time it is reasonable to believe that he was killed or drowned when the truck on which he was riding was hit by enemy artillery fire while crossing the Moselle River during the early morning of 12 September 1944.
- 6. Due to the darkness and smoke, a search could not be made until the next morning; at which time no trace of him could be found. The search continued for five days along the banks of the river and checks of all aid stations were unsuccessful.



- 2. All persons contacted declare that no more isolated graves are known to exist in the area and no deceased by the name of Cornett is or was buried in the communal cemetery, from which a number of American deceased have been disinterred by AGRC units in the past.
- 3. At Pagny-sur-Moselle, 6 miles to the north of Pont-a-Mousson, where the investigation was continued it was found that some American remains had been taken out of the Moselle river. They were also all identified as persons other than Pfc. Cornett. It may be assumed that subject deceased is buried as an Unknown at St. Avold.
- 4. Your attention is invited to inclosed statements and transcript of investigator's diary.

- 1400. At Pont a Mousson the mayor was contacted and interrogated concerning Pfc Cornett, who was supposed to be killed in action, while crossing the Moselle River near this town. The name did not exist in the records of the town-registar, neither in those of the cemetery. Some Americans were buried there before, but their mames were all known and other than that of subject deceased. Later on they have been disinterred by AGRC and transported to St. Avold.
- 1500. The Police-commissioner, Mr. Duisit, was interrogated and stated that never any discoveried were made and that the name did not exist in the records of the police.
- 1530. A similar statement was given by Mr. Hisler, commander of constabulary forces at Pont a Mousson, and vicinity.
- 1630. To investigate this case more thoroughly I contacted the chief of constabulary forces at Pagny sur Moselle, who checked the records and discovered some Americans, killed by drowning in the Moselle river. However none of them was Cornett.
