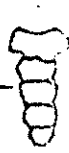

REPORT

11 May 1951

1. Case SK 78 has been processed and found to consist of skeletal portions for at least (3) deceased and possibly more.

2. Available information indicates that these are additional portions of casualties listed on Missing Air Crew Report No. 1-197 (MC QUARTY, SMITH, GRAY, ETC).

3. A study of skeletal charts previously made for recovered casualties of this Air Crew indicates that all portions now present in SK-78 actually are the portions shown as missing on those skeletal charts and consolidation thereof would be possible.

4. Available skeletal charts for cases identified as HADFIELD and MC BRIDE indicate that those cases are complete remains and would not be required at time of simultaneous reprocessing of remains concerned.

5. Segregation of SK-78 into four (4) cases (SK 78 A, B, C and D) has been accomplished pending further instructions.
