S U M M A R Y

Unknown X-9008

AGRS Liege Mausoleum

Unknown X-9008 was recovered from the vicinity of Puffendorf, Germany (50°56'N - 6°12'E) by a Graves Registration Search and Recovery Team on 18 April 1951.

The remains were associated with T/5 Wendall D. Reinhart, 37 193 011, Co "E", 66 Armored Regiment, who was KIA on 17 November 1944, in the vicinity of Puffendorf. Association was made by the recovery of an identification tag belonging to T/5 Reinhart in the proximity of recovery location of the remains, on 22 February 1951 by German civilian Adolph Meisen. However, the following facts preclude positive identification of the remains as T/5 Reinhart.

1. The remains of Unknown X-9008 consist of only one small portion of a right pelvis and a portion of a right sacrum, therefore, no comparison can be made with physical characteristics or age of T/5 Reinhart.

2. Available records indicate that T/5 Reinhart was KIA when a tank of which he was a crew member was destroyed by enemy fire. Statements of survivors indicate that he was in the tank when it exploded and burned, therefore, it cannot be established that remains of Unknown X-9008 actually came from the tank in question.

3. The area involved was searched for additional remains with negative results.

4. The paucity of the remains precludes association with any other unresolved casualty from the same area.

In view of the above, it is believed that the remains of Unknown X-9008 should be declared Unidentifiable.

## PROCESSING NARRATIVE

Remains of Unk X-6218 Plot Z Row 12 Grave 297 USMC Neuville and Unk X-9008 AGRS Mausoleum, Liege Grave 9 have been reprocessed for possible consolidation and association with one of two casualties.


There is no anthropological evidence to substantiate consolidation other than that both have been severely burned.

Teeth received with Unk X-6218 are contradictory for REINHART and not contradictory for BOYLAN, however, case history indicates BOYLAN was not in tank when killed.

Age estimation (23-25 Yrs) was taken from partially burned pubic symphysis and is favorable for both casualties.

Remains have not been consolidated because of too few anatomical portions and absence of articulations.

No recommendation as to individual identification can be made.

REPORT OF INVESTIGATION

I. AUTHORITY:

In compliance with the instructions contained in Investigation Directive # 082, dated 3 April 1951 an investigation was conducted at PUFFENDORF (2/4-60) Germany in an effort to recover the remains of T/5 EDUARD L. REIMMELT, 37 193 OLL reported killed in action in the vicinity on 17 November 1944.

II. FACTS AND CIRCUMSTANCES:

Information available indicates that T/5 REIMMELT was killed in action at PUFFENDORF, Germany when the tank in which he was a crew member was destroyed by enemy anti-tank fire.

A previous field investigation conducted in this area in November 1947 proved negative.

The Identification Tag of the subject casualty was found at the Dollman farm at Puffendorf and forwarded to this headquarters by the burgemeister of Inondorf through the British residents office by letter dated 22 February 1951.

III. FINDINGS:

A visit was made to the Dollman farm at Puffendorf and members of the family were interrogated. Information furnished indicated that the ID tag in question had actually been found by Mr. Adolph Weisen. Contact was made with Mr. Weisen and he stated that he had found the tag while searching for scrap brass and copper on the site when the tank had been destroyed. He further stated that he had not seen any indication of human remains while digging in this location.

Permission was obtained from the residents of the Dollman farm to excavate the area where the identification tag of the subject casualty had been found. This area was excavated to a depth where the clay sub-soil was reached over a surface of a plot approximately twenty (20) feet square and the soil was sifted. Two (2) small portions of human remains were found. These remains were evacuated to the OLP Morgue, Lido area, Liege, Belgium under the number SK-070. Remains consisted only of a portion of

the right pelvis and a portion of the right side of the sacrum. Remains also indicate that they had been partially burned. Several small impressions adjacent to this location were also investigated to preclude the possibility that any remains had been removed from the tank site and buried nearby. The results of this further search were negative. In addition the entire field was swept also with negative results.

An effort was also made, through the office of the British Accident at CHILDEB INCHEN, to trace the firm which removed the tanks in this area for salvage. This office is now closed but contact was made with the former secretary of this office Reinlein Strassen, now employed at the British Air Port at Willemath. The results of this investigation were negative as nothing could be definitely established regarding the concerns or individuals who actually performed the salvage work in this area.

Records on file at the burgoaster office at Immenorf were also checked. These records reveal that the only remains recovered from the Puffendorf area for which records were kept with local officials are those of a plane crew. These remains were evacuated by an American graves unit on 25 April 1940. (See Enc. 71).

III. CONCLUSION:

The site where a destroyed American tank was formerly located at the Puffendorf area, Puffendorf, Germany was thoroughly investigated. This investigation resulted in the recovery of two (2) small portions of human remains. These remains were taken from the spot when the identification tag of WILLIAM D. HATHAWAY was found in Dec. 1951 by Mr. ROBERT HISSON.

Records on file at the burgoaster's office at Immenorf do not indicate that the remains of any American deceased that may be associated with this case were ever evacuated from Puffendorf.

IV. RECOMMENDATION:

That an effort be made to locate the remains recovered from Puffendorf, Germany under G-4 (7) with T/5 WILLIAM D. HATHAWAY based upon the results of this investigation.

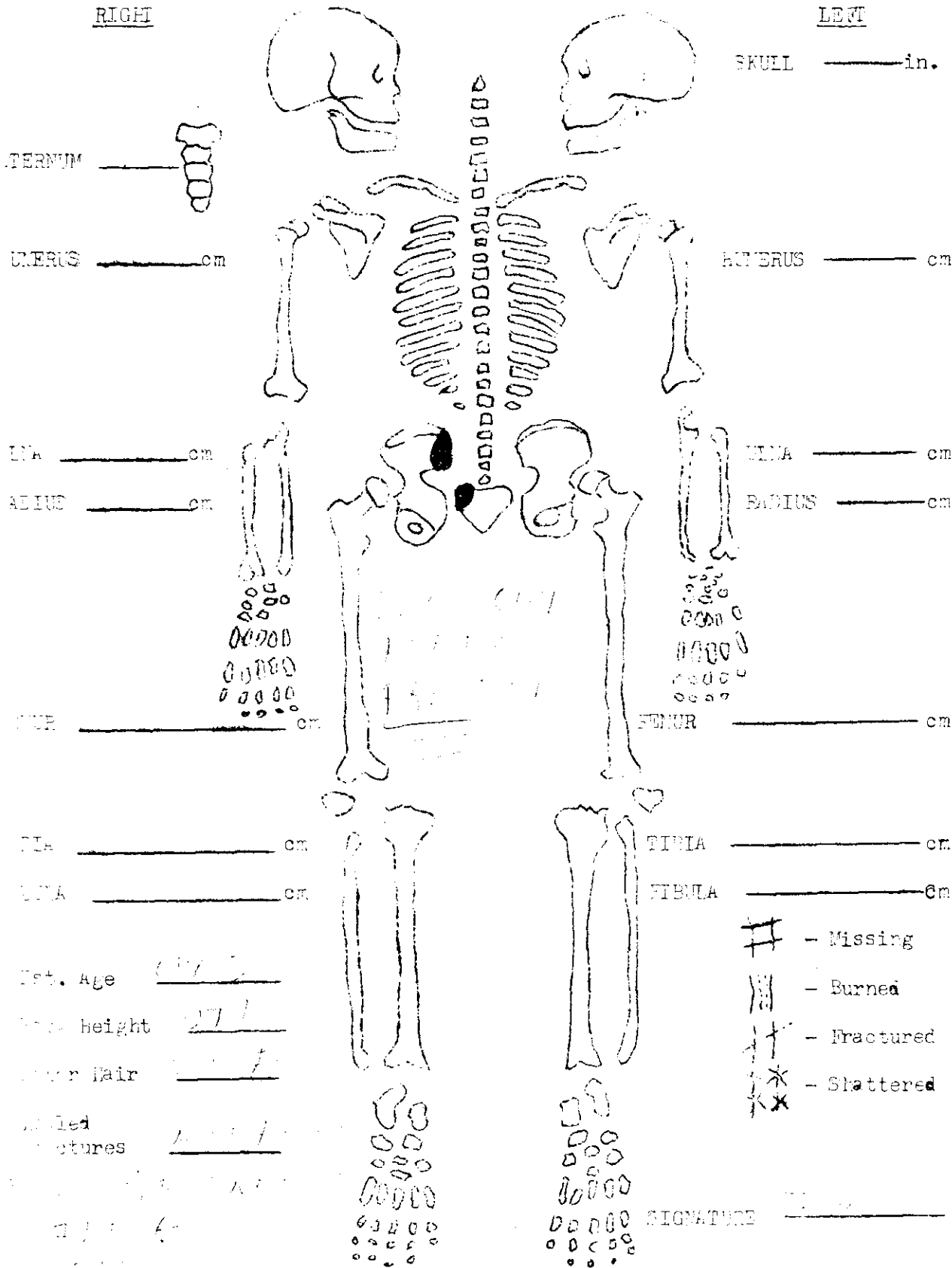

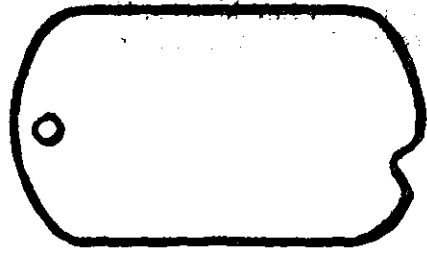
