The records pertaining to Unknown X - 9014, Plot _____, Row _____, Grave 15, USMC Liege Mausoleum, have been reviewed in accordance with par 159, SR 830-110-5, DA dated 3 March 1949, and it is the opinion of the Board of Review appointed by par 4, SO No 32, this headquarters, dated 10 April 1951, that sufficient evidence is not available to establish the identity of the deceased concerned, and it is recommended these remains be classified as unidentifiable.

NARRATIVE OF INVESTIGATION & DISINTERMENT
AT ZIEGENHAIN (L-51/H-05), GERMANY

8 May 1951

I. AUTHORITY AND MATTERS INVESTIGATED:

In compliance with Investigation Directive # 669, dated 9 March 1951, Case Germany L-51/3639, issued by Headquarters, 7887 Graves Registration Detachment, APO 757 (Liege), US Army, an investigation was conducted at ZIEGENHAIN (L-51/H-05), Germany in an attempt to recover the remains of T/5 EUGENE R. DOLAN, 32960920, reported as having died while a prisoner at Stalag IXA at ZIEGENHAIN, Germany.

II. FACTS AND CIRCUMSTANCES:

Not applicable to SR-281. Actual facts and circumstances unable to determine. See paragraph # 3.

III. FINDINGS:

While conducting disinterments in Cemetery # 5, one of five (5) cemeteries used while Stalag IXA was used as a concentration camp for prisoners of war, a remains of American nationality was discovered in Grave # 205, Cemetery # 5, ZIEGENHAIN, Germany. The deceased was dressed in a complete wool OD uniform, and wool OD sweater. Comparison of both teeth and estimated age and height against two (2) missing Americans supposedly interred in this cemetery, T/5 DOLAN, 32960920, and Pvt SAMUEL E. HARRIS, 34311005 (Case 4497, proved negative. Short black hair, approximately two (2) inches in length, and straight, was found on the remains, together with several metal buttons of a US Army uniform (embossed with eagle). A thorough search was made of the grave, but only a few teeth could be found.

IV. CONCLUSIONS:

That this remains, SR-281, is that of an American deceased, but not that of either HARRIS, or DOLAN, but that this deceased was previously an inmate of ZIEGENHAIN Stalag IXA, and died there, being buried later in the prison cemetery.

V. RECOMMENDATIONS:

That this remains, SR-281, be processed by CIL Laboratory, 7887 Graves Registration Detachment, and an attempt be made to identify this remains as a possible missing third inmate of this prison camp.

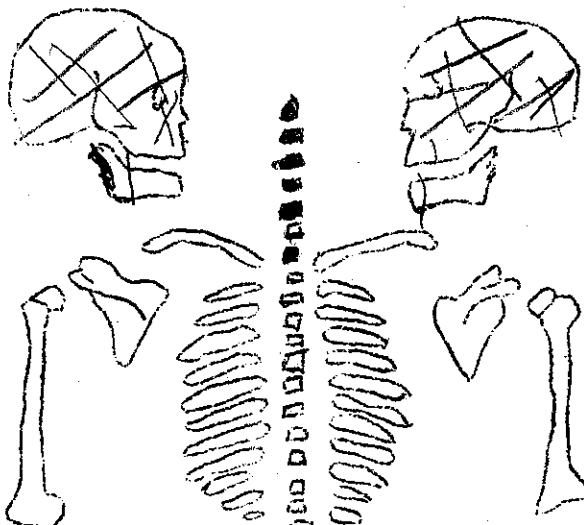

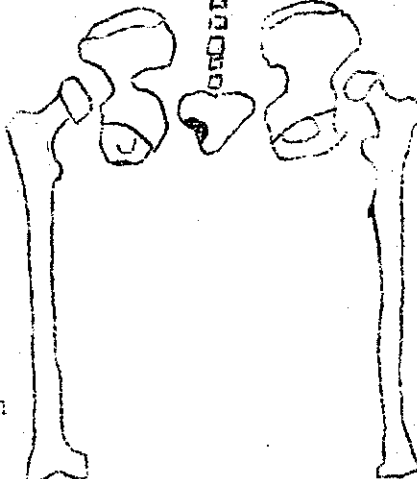

This dental chart is very important and should be filled in with great care. There are 32 teeth to be accounted for, as shown by the numbers on the chart. 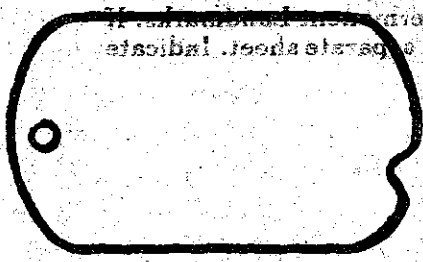
