When the remains are delivered for interment in a civilian or private cemetery, you are responsible for paying all interment expenses. In this connection, you are entitled to the allowance mentioned in paragraph 2 below.

2. Il Governo degli Stati Uniti concede un'indennità non superiore a 75 dollari, in moneta Italiana al tasso di cambio ufficiale in vigore, a copertura delle spese effettive in caso di sepoltura definitiva dei resti in un cimitero civile o privato.

An amount not to exceed 75 dollars local currency at the current rate of exchange is allowed by the United States government toward actual interment expenses when final interment of the remains is in a private or civilian cemetery.

3.
