- 1. Reference is made to peragraph 1, previous indorsement.
- 2. A Corrected Report of Eurial effecting an administrative concentration of remains for any reason creates an additional Unknown designation and alters the population of the constaries concerned. This mecasitates a change in the audit of remains par constary, an amendment of Machine Record Locator Cards, Flot Mapy and Master of Unknown Remains in this Office. Further an adjustment is necessary in all related reports and statistics so that an accurate balance is maintained and the disposition of the remains is indicated.
- 3. There a develory is closed to Further interments, the audit and statistics may also be considered closed pertaining to ressing interred and it is most desirable to avoid further changes where possible. In this respect, it would be advantageous to record all future interments in UENC Neuville-en-Condros, Polgium.
- 4. The simultaneous subsission of Corrected Reports of Surial with Hoard Findings for Group Burisls would not facilitate the above action, however, it would create a further unnecessary accedent of records in your headquarters in such cases where the Board Findings could not be approved by this Office.
- It is requested that the original Genetery and Unknown designation be retained in such cases where remains are involved in Group Furial identifications.

He declared that in August and July 1947 Mr. Chatelain, investigator from Liege, First Zone, conducted a very extensive and thorough investigation in the Overloon - Vierlingsbeek area.

Each and every tank was examined and charred human remains were recovered from three of them.

Each and every isolated grave of which the nationality of the body in it was not definitely known was investigated by Mr. Chatelain, Mr. Hilljegerdes and Lt. Richard Yunck, all this Headquarters. One American was found. All the other graves contained German bodies.

Since this last investigation no other graves or tanks have been found.

Result investigation: Negative.
