

MEMOR ANDUM FOR RECORD

SUBJECT: Review of Circumstances Surrounding the Disappearance of Private Eulys F. Slate, 39,417,088, Infantry

- 1. Private Eulys F. Slate, 39 417 088, Hq Co, 17th Tank Bn, was reported missing in action in Belgium on 20 December 1944 and was presumed dead as of 21 December 1945 by SR&D No. 4949.
- 2. The Service Record, under Remarks-Administrative, contains the following entry: MIA Recht, Belgium 20 Dec 44."
- 3. The Casualty file of the subject person contains the Missing Report of his organisation, dated, 1 anuary 1945, which discloses that the subject enlisted man was a member of Hq Co, 17th Tank Bn, and on 20 December 1944 was taking part in a mission moving to a new bivouac area, the destination being Recht, Belgium, and the date and place last seen being 20 December 1944 north of La Roche, Belgium, headed toward Samree. The Report includes the following resume of circumstances:

"This man was member of crew of 105 A.G. that was sent to 129 Ord Bn, on 14 Dec 1944. He left Germany with Ord Bn for Belgium. The tank & crew were sent from ord Bn. to Div The at La Roche for defense. They were then dispatched to Samree to protect a road block. This was the last seen of tank or crew, as Samree is now in enemy hands it is impossible to investigate further to find tank in said town."

 The AG 201 file of the subject enlisted man contains a report, under the Casualty Clearance Plan, dated 18 August 1945, which gives the names of the tank crew and the report of the incident, as follows:

"1. Occupants of vehicle:

- *3. Cause of Lost of Vehicle: (b) Struck by A.T. Fire. Relative position of hit on vehicle to position of occupants unknown.
- "4. One man escaped, does not remember snything that took place.
- "5. Enemy occupied town in which tank was hit. It is not known whether soldier was wounded or captured as there are no witnesses.
 - "6. Search of area and investigation of vehicle was impossible.

 (a) The cemetery at Henri-Chapelle, Belgium, where the three men carried KIA are buried, had an unidentified body taken in at the same time from the same area. This may have been the body of the man in question.
- *7. The lack of information is due to the fact that the vehicle was with the 129th Ord. Bn and Div. Ths. These people can furnish no further particulars. They were in a different zone of action from this company.
- 5. A search of the captured German records has resulted in failure to locate any record of the subject enlisted man, nor has a record of burial been located in the Office of The Quartermaster General which can be identified as pertaining to him.
- Recht is located approximately six miles northwest of St. Vith, Belgium, Samree approximately 23 miles west-southwest of St. Vith, and Laroche approximately four miles southwest of Samree.
- 7. The subject enlisted man participated in a mission on 20 December 1944, moving to a new bivouac area. During the move the unit was attacked by the enemy and the tank was hit by anti-tank fire. The driver of the tank in which he was riding survived and returned to duty; three of the occupants were killed and Pvt Slate was reported missing in action. A possibility of capture, with death at a later date, exists and, therefore, it is concluded that sufficient evidence is not available at the present time to warrant issuance of a report of death under the provisions of Section 9 of the Missing Persons Act.

NARRATIVE

This case pertains to Pvt Eulys F. Slate, 39417088, missing 17 December 1944 at Samree, Belgium (6/P-58).

Investigations in the Samree area were conducted, however, with negative results. The following contacts were made in an effort to locate the remains of the above mentioned deceased: The town-hall, The Parish Priest, The Forest-Guard, and the Police at Le Roche. All certified to the effect that there was no knowledge of the deceased and that all tanks in the area had been removed by local salvage companies.

Further investigations, however, actually revealed the presence of four tanks in the community of Samree. Information concerning these tanks is as follows:

 Tank USA - 30101528, name of tenk "EMPRESS GIN IV", unit designation 2 67 E8 - at Samree

Tank USA - 3082021, name not indicated, unit designation.
 3 33 H-, at Samree.

 Tank USA - 3066357, name not indicated, unit designation 3 33 H -, at Bersismenil.

4. Tank USA - 3070647-S, name not indicated, unit designation 3 33 H -.

Careful inspection of these tanks did not reveal the presence of human remains.

TO: Non-Recoverable Board, AGRC

1. It is recommended that the Board take action on the following case:

NAME: SLATE, Eulys F. Pvt 39 417 088

ORGANIZATION: Headquarters 17th Tank Battalion

DATE OF DEATH: 20 December 1944

PLACE OF DEATH: Vicinity of Recht, Belgium

SYNOPSIS: Subject casualty was listed, in the Status. Review and Determination Report as missing in action, on the date indicated above. Further information indicated that the tank in which subject decement was a crew member was knocked out by enemy anti-tank fire, while establishing a road block in the vicinity of Samree, Belgium. This incident was the lest time decedent was seen as the enemy captured the area. One (1) crew member, Jack Parker, the driver escaped from the tank and returned to US Military control. Three (3) of the crew members, William E. Smith, Emery E. Weed, Michael A. Baez and one (1) unidentified remains were later recovered from the area and buried at USMC Henri Chapelle, Belgium, A Field Investigation conducted in the appropriate area, on 26 August 1947, failed to locate the remains or provide clues as to ultimate disposition. All attempts to associate recovered unknowns with subject decedent proved negative. It is logical to conclude Pvt Eulys F. Slate was killed when the enemy attacked his unit, his tank was hit by anti-tank fire; and his remains were disposed of by the enemy in an unknown manner and location which precludes recovery. It is, therefore, recommended this case be deemed non-recoverable.

- 2. All attached supporting documents are copied from records on file headquarters American Graves Registration Detachment.
- 3. Every effort has been made to correlate this case with records in this headquarters pertaining to unknown deceased interred in US Military Cemeteries and reported isolated buriels. The results are negative.
- 4. It is recommended that the remains based upon the above information and research, be declared non-recoverable.
