


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

This company's mission was to occupy Meijel, Holland. At 3:30 p.m. that day your husband moved back to the command post about 500 yards to the rear of the area where the glatoon was dug in. He left the command post about fifteen minutes later to rejoin his platoon, but failed to report there. The area where he was last seen was about 3000 yards south of Liesel, Holland, and was under heavy mostar and artillery fire. When nothing could be learned of the whereabouts of Lieutenant Hannabury he was reported missing in action as of 30 October 1944 and remained in that status until a presumptive date of death as of 31 October 1945 was established under Public Law 490. 77th Congress, as amended. Early in 1947 an official report was issued that your husband had been killed in action on 30 October 1944. This report was based on the recovery of Lieutenant Hannabury's remains from a grave at 51° 27' N - 0° 35' E about eleven miles east of Kindhoven, Holland, and his re-burial after proper identification in the United States Military Cometery at Margraten, Holland.

I am referring a copy of your letter to the Quartermaster General, Washington 25, D. C., for definite information as to how the remains were finally identified as that official has jurisdiction over such matters.

The operations in which Lleutenant Hannabury was engaged at the time of his death occurred on the right flank of the Hijmegen salient in the area southeast of Eindhoven, Holland. Meijel and Liesel were towns in this vicinity, located approximately 20 Miles from Eindhoven. During the last weeks of October, German counterattagks made on this side of the salient forced the allied troops to withdraw from Meijel on 28 October. The next day Liesel, 5 miles north of Meijel, was also lost to the enemy, but on the 30th the enemy's attacks made no gains and progress was made



My heartfalt sympathy is with you in the great loss you have been called upon to bear and I trust that the foregoing information may serve to lessen, in some degree, the anxiety you have suffered.

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This dental chart is very important and should be filled in with great care. There are 32 teeth to be accounted for, as shown by the numbers on the chart. Beginning at the middle line in both upper and lower jaws, the teeth are arranged symmetrically on either side and classed as incisors (cutting teeth), cuspids or canines (tearing teeth), bicuspids (chewing teeth), and molars (principal chewing teeth). An examination should be made and findings charted to cover the following basic conditions: Lost teeth, crowned teeth, bridge work, fillings, caries (cavities of decay), dentures (plates), and any deformity of jaws found. 

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

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
