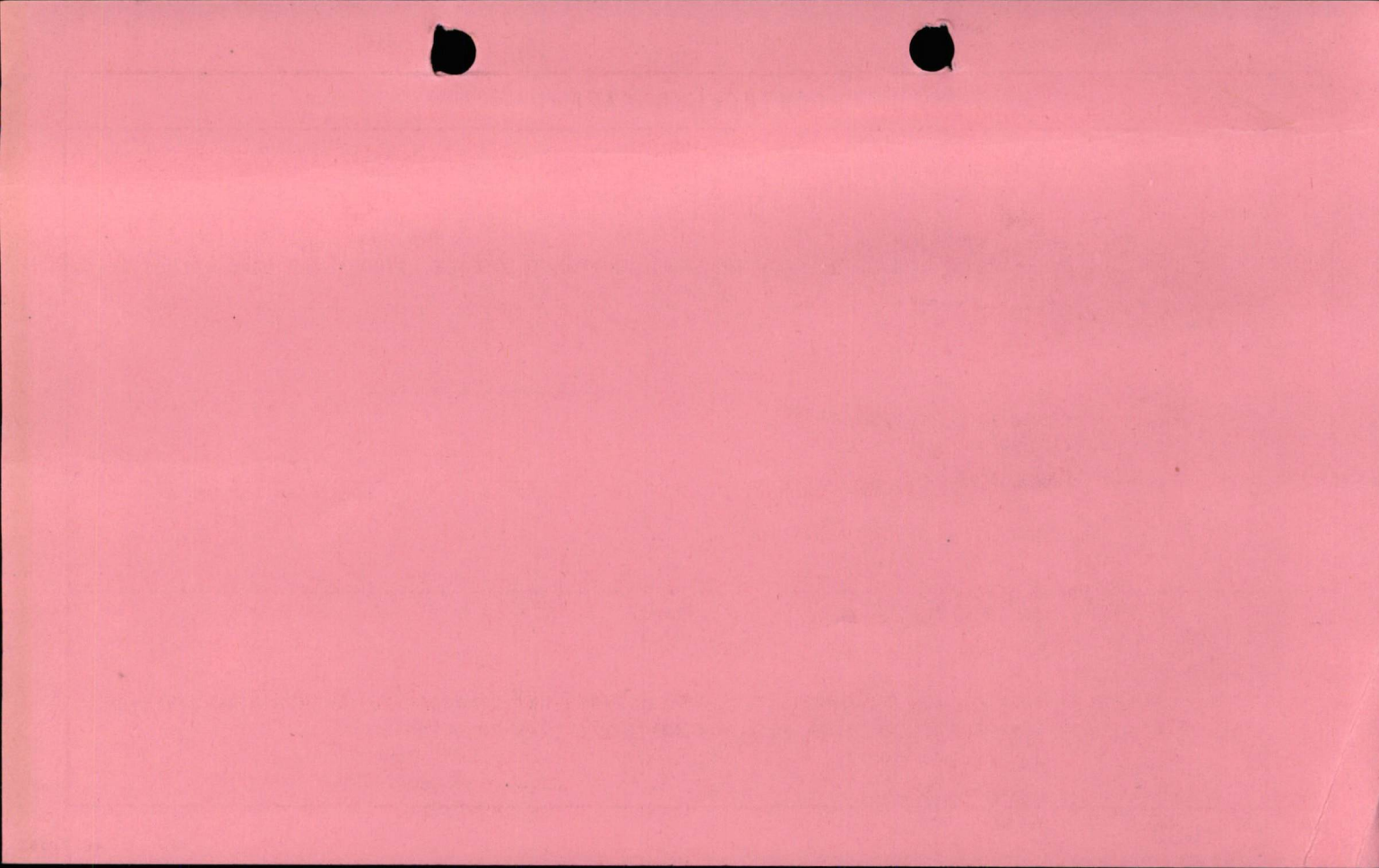

Proceedings of a Board of Officers appointed in accordance with letter AGAO-S 293.9 (27 Mar 47) D-M, War Dept, TAGO, 9 April 1947.

The Board convened pursuant to par 4, SO 139, headquarters, 788 Graves Registration Detachment, APO 757, US Army, 15 November 1950, at Liege, Belgium on . The purpose of the Board was to determine the non-recoverability status of certain casualties now under jurisdiction of this command.

1. It is recommended that the Board take Action on the following cases:

SYNOPSIS: The casualties listed on attached roster are reported by official records as Missing in Action or Killed in Action during ground or air operations in the department of Moselle, France, from the period 5 September 1944 to 16 March 1945. Extensive area searches as well as individual investigation have to date failed to furnish information as to the ultimate disposition of their remains. Efforts to effect association with unidentified recoveries from the area, now interred in U.S. Military Cemeteries, have also proven negative. The lack of specific information regarding the death or burial, limited search in most instances to general localities, however, documents on file in this Office and Office of The Quartermaster General substantiate the fact that numerous investigations covering the entire department of Moselle have been conducted in the course of search operations for all losses, both recovered and unrecovered. The terrain of the Moselle department, for the most part, consists of farm, pasture and forested areas which has been under constant cultivation and supervision by farmers and forest guards, since the cessation of hostilities, thus the possibility of undiscovered graves is remote. It can therefore be concluded that the remains of the deceased in question were reduced by battle action to a state which precludes recovery or identification. The absence of specific information concerning their deaths, the failure of Field Investigations to provide

evidence and the lack of association with recovered unknowns would tend to substantiate these conclusions. It is recommended that the remains of the individuals listed in these Board Proceedings be considered Non-Recoverable under the provisions of paragraph 3b, Letter, Office of The Quartermaster General, file QMGMP 293, Subject: Processing Board Findings of Non-Recoverability Return of World War II Dead Program, dated 25 March 1949.

Reference is made to: OQMG Forms 371; After Action Reports, and Casualty Clearance Plan; concerning each decedent; Reports of Field Investigations previously forwarded to The Office of The Quartermaster General, pertaining to resolved casualties who were killed in action in the Department of Moselle, France; on file in the Office of The Quartermaster General, Washington, D. C.



Acting under orders of Lt Col. Allison, the group of men left its dug-in position near the road and ran to the cover of a nearby forest. While running across a clearing between the road and the forest, the group was fired on by the guns mounted on the tanks, and William F. Holloran, 32 257 356, a member of the group, was hit and fell down.

Shortly after daybreak on the 9th of September, a member of the Fifth Infantry Division, whose organization was fighting in the same area, approached me and said that there was a member of our unit either seriously wounded or dead and asked me and Pfc Frank G. Branck, 32 252 741, also of Co "C", this battalion, to come and identify the wounded soldier.

The soldier from the 5th Infantry Division lead us to a spot where Halloran had just entered the forest and had been hit. He was dead when we got to him and had apparently died at least an hour earlier because rigor mortis had set in.

I had known Halloran for at least a year and recognized him immediately. Branck and I also examined his dog tags for identification.

Medical personnel from the 5th Infantry Division told us to leave the body and that someone would evacuate it. I do not know whether the body was tagged. Our unit was forced to withdraw to the west side of the Moselle river on the 11th of September 1944 and the body had not been evacuated at that time.
