2. Unknown X-2 was disinterred this date and following information was obtained:

a. The following clothes sizes:

(1) O.D. Trousers	30-31
(2) Cotton Drawers	32
(3) G.I. Shoes	9C or 9D
(4) O.D. Shirt	15-32 (Est.)
(5) Combat Jacket	34S (Est.)

b. Laundry mark in waistband of trousers that appeared to be P-4977.

c. Envelope with postmark of Brooklyn, N.Y., Dyker Heights. Address and return address were not legible.

d. There were no members missing on body.

e. There was no shoulder patch or other insignia.

f. Height--5'8" Weight--150lbs. Color of hair--Brown Race--White. Height and weight were estimated in as much as remains were badly decomposed.

g. Tooth chart was taken and is enclosed herewith.

3. There is no information in cemetery records as to where remains were recovered or by whom. GR 1 has fingerprints of deceased which should identify him.

4. It is believed that this is all the information that can be obtained by this headquarters.

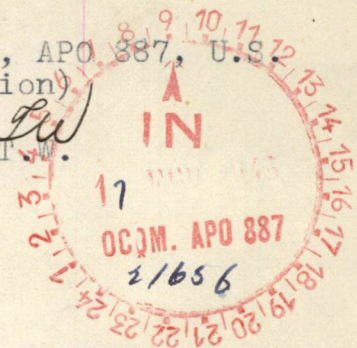

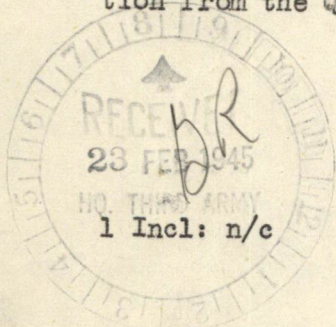

1. Attention is invited to the attached report of burial of Unknown X-2, U. S. Military Cemetery No. 1, Champigneul, France and the 3d Indorsement hereon.

2. It is believed that the remains buried as Unknown X-2 are those of Pvt Joseph E. Pozolante, 32984977, 23d Armored Infantry Battalion, who was reported KIA 1 September 1944, on Battle Casualty Report dated 6 September 1944, for the following reasons:

a. There is no other report of burial on file for Pvt Pozolante although he has been reported KIA.

b. The trousers of Unknown X-2 were marked "P-4977" which is the clothing mark of Pvt. Pozolante.

c. The postmark found on the envelope indicates that Unknown X-2 probably came from New York. The Army Serial Number of Pvt Pozolante indicates that he may have come from New York.

d. George E. McClure, Paul E. Scott, and William Wilson were all reported KIA 1 September on the same Battle Casualty Report as Pvt Pozolante. Their remains were buried on the same day and at approximately the same time of the day as Pvt Pozolante.

3. It is requested that appropriate action be taken to determine if Unknown X-2 can be identified as Pvt Pozolante, and that all information which may serve as a basis for identification be forwarded to this headquarters. It is requested that the physical description and clothing sizes of Pvt Pozolante be entered on the attached Comparative Chart (Incl No. 3).



1. In compliance with paragraph 3, 6th Indorsement, an investigation, with a view towards possibly identifying the remains of Unknown X-2, buried in U. S. Military Cemetery No. 1, Champignuel, France, as being those of Pvt Joseph V. Pozolante, 32 984 977, former member of Company "C", 23d Armored Infantry Battalion, a unit of this command, was conducted by this headquarters, and revealed the following facts:

a. Pvt Joseph V. Pozolante, 32 984 977, Company "C", 23d Armored Infantry Battalion, was reported as being "KIA" in France, as of 1 September 1944, on Battle Casualty Report No. 15, of that headquarters, dated 6 September 1944.

b. Pfc George E. McClure, 38 516 244, Pfc Paul E. Scott, 34 197 069, and Pvt William E. Wilson, 32 284 975, also former members of Company "C", 23d Armored Infantry Battalion, were likewise reported as being "KIA" in France, as of 1 September 1944, on Battle Casualty Report No. 15, of that headquarters, dated 6 September 1944.

c. Unknown X-2, Pfc McClure, Pfc Scott and Pvt Wilson were all buried on the same day, at approximately the same time of day and in the same cemetery.

d. Pvt Pozolante, Pfc McClure, Pfc Scott and Pvt Wilson were reported on the same Division Admission and Disposition Report, being the basis for the entries made on the Battle Casualty Report referred to in paragraphs 1a and b, above. (See Inclosure No. 3).

e. Pvt Pozolante, Pfc McClure, Pfc Scott and Pvt Wilson were all "killed in action" on the same day, 1 September 1944; at the same place, Germanville, France; and were members of the same company and platoon. Pvt Pozolante, Pvt Wilson and Pfc McClure were members of the same squad.

f. The trousers found on Unknown X-2 contained the laundry or clothing mark, "P-4977". "P-4977" is the clothing mark of Pvt Pozolante.

g. An envelope found on the body of Unknown X-2, address and return address being illegible, bore the post-mark of Brooklyn, N. Y., Dyker Heights. The home address of Pvt Pozolante and that of his mother is 7501 15th Avenue, Brooklyn, New York, believed to be in the Dyker Heights section of Brooklyn.

h. Records pertaining to the physical description and clothing sizes of Pvt Pozolante are no longer available at this headquarters. Information furnished in comparative chart, are estimated and based upon information received from friends of Pvt Pozolante. (See Inclosure No. 1).

2. In view of the foregoing and based upon the information disclosed in the attached inclosures, it is the opinion of this headquarters that Unknown X-2 and Pvt Joseph V. Pozolante, 32 984 977, are one and the same person.

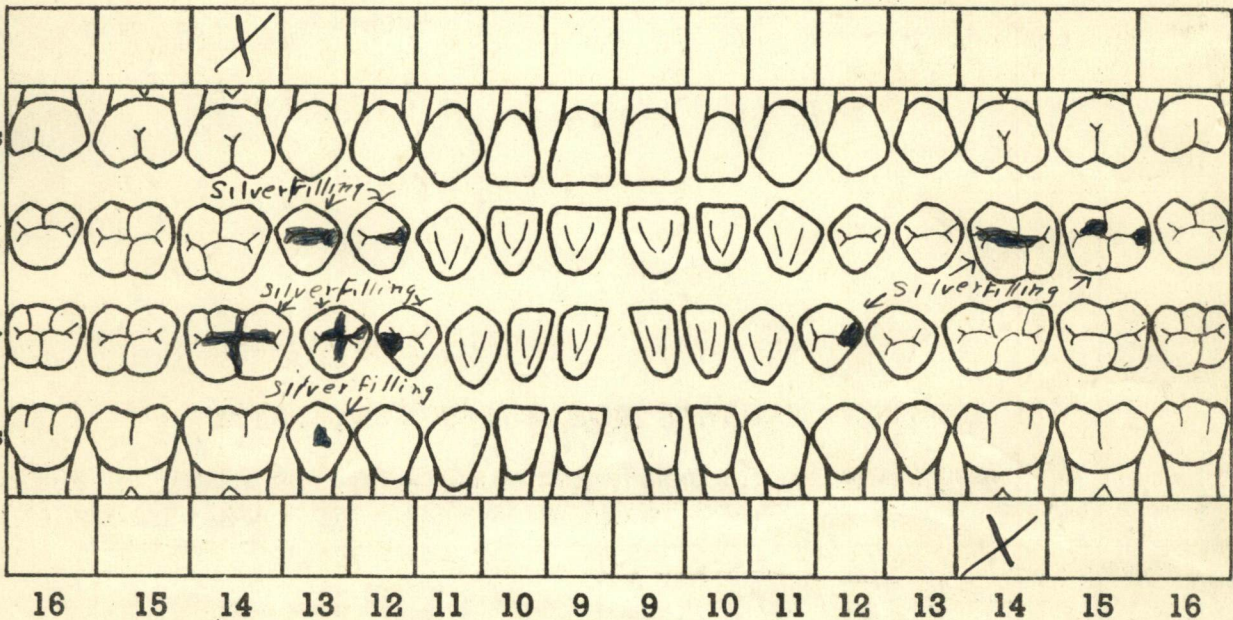

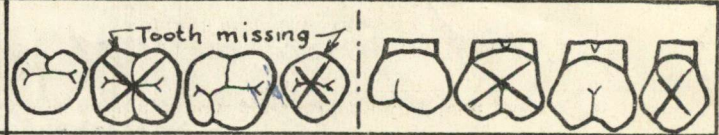

This dental chart is very important and should be filled in with great care. There are 32 teeth to be accounted for, as shown by the numbers on the chart. Beginning at the middle line in both upper and lower jaws, the teeth are arranged symmetrically on either side and classed as incisors (cutting teeth), cuspids or canines (tearing teeth), bicuspids (chewing teeth), and molars (principal chewing teeth). An examination should be made and findings charted to cover the following basic conditions: Lost teeth, crowned teeth, bridge work, fillings, caries (cavities of decay), dentures (plates), and any deformity of jaws found. 1. In compliance with paragraph 3, 6th Indorsement, an investigation, with a view towards possibly identifying the remains of Unknown X-2, buried in U.S. Military Cemetery No. 1, Champigneul, France, as being those of Pvt Joseph V. Pozolante 32 984 977, former member of Company "C", 23d Armored Infantry Battalion, a unit of this command, was conducted by this headquarters, and revealed the following facts:

a. Pvt Joseph V. Pozolante, 32984 977, Company "C", 23d Armored Infantry Battalion was reported as being "KIA" in France, as of 1 September 1944, on Battle Casualty Report No. 15, of that headquarters, dated 6 September 1944.

b. Pfc George E. McClure, 38 516 244, Pfc Paul E. Scott, 34 197 069 and Pvt William E. Wilson, 32 284 975, also former members of Company "C", 23d Armored Infantry Battalion, were likewise reported as being "KIA" in France, as of 1 September 1944, on Battle Casualty Report No. 15, of that headquarters, dated 6 September 1944.

c. Unknown X-2, Pfc McClure, Pfc Scott and Pvt Wilson were all buried on the same day, at approximately the same time of day and in the same cemetery.

d. Pvt Pozolante, Pfc McClure, Pfc Scott and Pvt Wilson were reported on the same Division Admission and Disposition Report, being the basis for the entries made on the Battle Casualty Report referred to in paragraphs 1a and b, above. (See Inclosure No. 3).

e. Pvt Pozolante, Pfc McClure, Pfc Scott and Pvt Wilson were all "killed in action" on the same day, 1 September 1944; at the same place, Germanville, France; and were members of the same company and platoon. Pvt Pozolante, Pvt Wilson and Pfc McClure were members of the same squad.

f. The trousers found on Unknown X-2 contained the laundry or clothing mark, "P-4977". "P-4977" is the clothing mark of Pvt Pozolante.

g. An envelope found on the body of Unknown X-2, address and return address being illegible, bore the post-mark of Brooklyn, N.Y., Dyker Heights. The home address of Pvt Pozolante and that of his mother is 7501 15th Avenue, Brooklyn, New York, believed to be in the Dyker Heights section of Brooklyn.

h. Records pertaining to the physical description and clothing sizes of Pvt Pozolante are no longer available at this headquarters. Information furnished in comparative chart, are estimated and based upon information received from friends of Pvt Pozolante. (See Inclosure No. 1).

a. There is no other report of burial on file for Pvt Pozolante although he has been reported KIA.

b. The trousers of Unknown X-2 were marked "P-4977" which is the clothing mark of Pvt. Pozolante.

c. The postmark found on the envelope indicates that Unknown X-2 probably came from New-York. The Army serial Number of Pvt Pozolante indicates that he may come from New York.

d. George E. McClure, Paul E. Scott, and William Wilson were all reported KIA 1 September on the same Battle Casualty Report as Pvt Pozolante. Their remains were buried on the same day and at approximately the same time of the day as Pvt Pozolante.
