Dear Mrs. Savignac:

This is to inform you that the remains of your loved one have been permanently interred, as recorded above, side by side with comrades who also gave their lives for their country.

Customary military funeral services were conducted over the grave at the time of burial.

After the Department of the Army has completed all final interments, the cemetery will be transferred, as authorized by the Congress, to the care and supervision of the American Battle Monuments Commission. The Commission also will have the responsibility for permanent construction and beautification of the cemetery, including erection of the permanent headstone. The headstone will be inscribed with the name exactly as recorded above, the rank or rating where appropriate, organization, State, and date of death. Any inquiries relative to the type of headstone or the spelling of the name to be inscribed thereon, should be addressed to the American Battle Monuments Commission, the central address of which is Room 713, 1712 "G" Street, N. W., Washington 25, D. C.

While interment and beautification activities are in progress, the cemetery will not be open to visitors. However, upon completion thereof, due notice will be carried by the press.

You may rest assured that this final interment was conducted with fitting dignity and solemnity and that the grave-site will be carefully and conscientiously maintained in perpetuity by the United States Government.

Dear Mrs. Savignac:

We have received the "Request for Disposition of Remains" form in regard to the final interment of the remains of your husband, the late First Lieutenant Benjamin J. Savignac, and official action is being taken on the decision rendered by you.

However, I must advise you it is not possible to inter the remains of your husband in the cemetery at Flanders Field, Belgium, inasmuch as this cemetery is one of the permanently established World War I cemeteries, and there is no additional grave space available for the interment of any of those who gave their lives in this last war. Neither could the remains of your husband be interred in the United States Military Cemetery, Brookwood, England, as this cemetery has not been designated as a permanent military cemetery for the interment of World War II Dead. There is a portion of this cemetery which is permanent, but, there is no additional grave space available.

In addition, the legislation governing the final interment of the remains of World War II Dead, does not provide for the remains of our deceased military personnel, whose next of kin desire that they be left overseas, to be transferred from one country to another unless it is the homeland of the decedent. It is the policy of the War Department that if the next of kin requests their loved one be left in a permanent military cemetery overseas, that the remains be interred in the permanent military cemetery nearest to the present place of burial.

The United States Military Cemetery, Henri-Chapelle, Belgium, in which the remains of your husband now rest, has recently been designated as a permanent military cemetery for the interment of World War II Dead, and the remains of your husband may rest permanently in the quiet beauty of this cemetery.

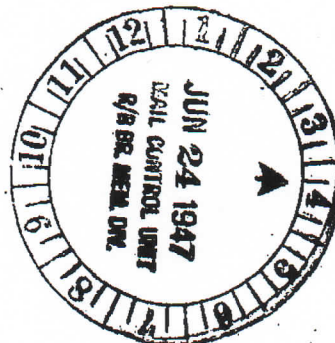

The people of the United States, through the Congress have authorized the disinterment and final burial of the heroic dead of World War II. The Quartermaster General of the Army has been entrusted with this sacred responsibility to the honored dead. The records of the War Department indicate that you may be the nearest relative of the above-named deceased, who gave his life in the service of his country.

The enclosed pamphlets, "Disposition of World War II Armed Forces Dead," and "American Cemeteries," explain the disposition, options and services made available to you by your Government. If you are the next of kin according to the line of kinship as set forth in the enclosed pamphlet, "Disposition of World War II Armed Forces Dead," you are invited to express your wishes as to the disposition of the remains of the deceased by completing Part I of the enclosed form "Request for Disposition of Remains." Should you desire to relinquish your rights to the next in line of kinship, please complete Part II of the enclosed form. If you are not the next of kin, please complete Part III of the enclosed form.

If you should elect Option 2, it is advised that no funeral arrangements or other personal arrangements be made until you are further notified by this office.

Will you please complete the enclosed form, "Request for Disposition of Remains" and mail in the enclosed self-addressed envelope, which requires no postage, within 30 days after its receipt by you? Its prompt return will avoid unnecessary delays.

The War Department is most desirous that you be furnished information regarding the burial location of your husband, the late First Lieutenant Benjamin J. Savignac, A.S.N. 01 322 269.

The records of this office disclose that his remains are interred in the U. S. Military Cemetery, Henri-Chapelle, Belgium, plot O, row 10, grave 183.

This cemetery is located approximately seven miles southwest of Aachen, Germany, five miles northwest of Eupen and eight miles east of Liege, both in Belgium, and is under the constant care and supervision of United States military personnel.

The War Department has now been authorized to comply, at Government expense, with your feasible wishes regarding final interment, here or abroad, of the remains of your loved one. At a later date, this office will, without any action on your part provide you with full information and solicit your detailed desires.

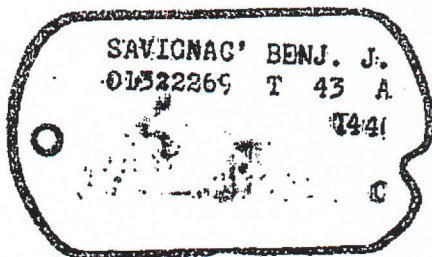

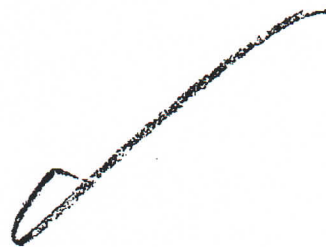

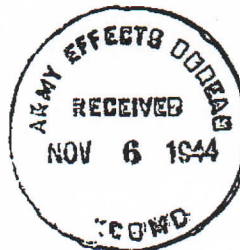
