The Board convened pursuant to par 4, SO 139, headquarters, 788 Graves Registration Detachment, APO 757, US Army, 15 November 1950, at Liege, Belgium on . The purpose of the Board was to determine the non-recoverability status of certain casualties now under jurisdiction of this command.

The Board reviewed report of investigation, statements of witness and other papers, contained in the files of 7887 Graves Registration Detachment, EA, pertaining to the case of the following named casualty/casualties, the remains of which have not been recovered. 1. It is recommended that the Board take action on the following cases:

SYNOPSIS: The casualties listed on attached roster are reported by official records as Missing in Action or Killed in Action during ground operations in the department of Meurthe-et-Moselle, France, from the period 7 September through 3 December 1944. Extensive area searches as well as individual investigations have to date failed to furnish information as to the ultimate disposition of their remains. Efforts to effect association with unidentified recoveries from the area, now interred in U.S. Military Cemeteries, have also proven negative. The lack of specific information regarding the death or burial, limited search in most instances to general localities, however, documents on file in this Office and Office of The Quartermaster General substantiate the fact that numerous investigations covering the entire department of Meurthe-et-Moselle, have been conducted in the course of search operations for all losses, both recovered and unrecovered. The terrain of the Meurthe-et-Moselle department, consists of farm, pasture and forest land which has been under constant use since the cessation of hostilities, thus the possibility of undiscovered graves is remote. It can therefore only be concluded that the remains of the deceased in question were reduced by battle action to a state which precludes recovery or identification, with the exception of two men listed on attached roster who were known to have drowned and their remains never recovered. 
absence of specific information concerning their deaths, the failure of Field Investigations to provide evidence, and the lack of association with recovered unknowns would tend to substantiate these conclusions. It is recommended that the remains of the individuals listed on these Board Proceedings be considered Non-Recoverable under the provisions of paragraph 3b, Letter, Office of The Quartermaster General, file QMGFP 293, Subject: Processing Board Findings of Non-Recoverability Return of World War II Dead Program, dated 25 March 1949.

Reference is made to: OQMG Forms 371; After Action Reports, and Casualty Clearance Plan concerning each decedent; Reports of Field Investigations previously forwarded to the Office of The Quartermaster General, pertaining to resolved casualties who were killed in action in the department of Meurthe-et-Mosell, France: On file in The Office of The Quartermaster General, Washington, D. C.

2. It is recommended that the remains, based upon the above information and research, be declared non-recoverable.



MEMORANDUM FOR RECORD:

SUBJECT: Review of Circumstances Surrounding the Disappearance
of Personnel Presumed Dead

1. The following persons, Infantry, members of Company B, 38th Armored Infantry Battalion, were reported missing in action, not in flying or jump pay status, in France on 21 September 1944 by ETO Shipment Number 211 and presumed dead as of 22 September 1945 under the provisions of Section 5, Missing Persons Act (SR&D Case No. 4108):

2. A letter from this office, dated 27 June 1945, to the Commanding General, European Theater of Operations, file reference AGPC-S 704 (27 Jun 45), requested that all facts and circumstances surrounding the disappearance of Private First Class Charles T. McGuire, 33158351, be furnished. The sixth indorsement to the above correspondence inclosed a "Missing Report", dated 27 November 1944, signed by Lieutenant E. F. Hovis which shows that Private McGuire was on a mission with his organization, Company B, 38th Armored Infantry Battalion to capture Werningen, France where he was last seen on 21 September 1944. The following statement appears on the report:

"Co attacked & occupied town of Werningen, France. Enemy counterattacked. Co. sustained heavy losses of personnel believed to have been captured by enemy forces. * * *

"No search could be made as enemy forces occupied the town and surrounding areas."

a. Filed in Private Godfrey C. Westcott's, 31337874, AG 201 file is a letter, dated 22 October 1944, from Mrs. Elizabeth S. Westcott to the Commanding Officer, Company "B", 38th Armored Infantry Battalion which requested any available facts upon the disappearance of Private Westcott. The reply by first indorsement, dated 2 December 1944, contains the following pertinent statement:

"* * * 2. Private Westcott was engaged in a military operation against the enemy in the vicinity of Arry, France. Heavy losses of personnel, most believed to have been captured by enemy forces, were suffered by the company at the time."

3. The captured German records contain no information relative to Private First Class Charles T. McGuire or Private Godfrey C. Westcott, nor do the files of the Memorial Division, Office of the Quartermaster General contain any burial information, at the present, on these soldiers.

4. The subject persons were members of Company B, 38th Armored Infantry Battalion. The "Missing Report" on Private McGuire shows that he participated with Company "B" in an attack upon Werningen, France on 21 September 1944 and that "Private Westcott was engaged in a military operation against the enemy in the vicinity of Arry, France" on 21 September 1944. Company "B" was counterattacked by the enemy and forced to withdraw after having suffered heavy losses. When Company "B" was mustered the subject persons were found missing but search for them was not made due to the fact that the enemy held the ground where they were last seen. The captured German records contain no information pertaining to them. Nothing has been seen or heard of them since.

5. It is, therefore, concluded that the information of record in the Department of the Army, at this time, does not conclusively establish the place, date and fact of death pursuant to the provisions of Section 9 of the Missing Persons Act and the issuance of an official report of death is not warranted.
