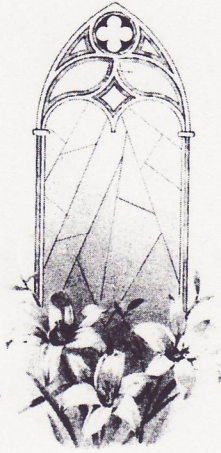

Your letter of June 3rd to Mr. Carmelo Orlando regarding the disposition of the remains of his deceased son was referred to me.

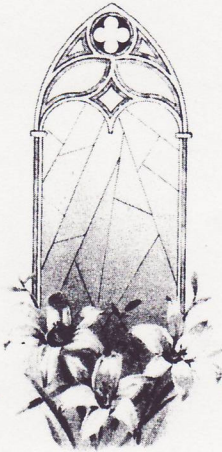
Since the original filing of the application the family has come to another decision which entails an amendment to their original application. In contradiction to my advice, they have decided to relinquish the privilege of burial in a national cemetery and have already selected a family plot in our local Catholic cemetery. Dear Mr. Orlando:

We have received the "Request for Disposition of Remains" form, in regard to the final interment of the remains of your son, the late Private Philip Orlando.

The form has been accepted, and action is being taken on your request that your son's remains be returned to the United States for final interment in the Long Island National Cemetery, Farmingdale, New York.

The Commanding Officer of the Distribution Center will notify you, as well as Mr. August G. Pagnozzi, of the arrival of the remains of your son and of the expected date of delivery of the remains at the destination previously named by you. You will be afforded ample time to complete all personal arrangements you may desire.

Military honors and services will be provided by the Army, when desired by the next of kin, for all decedents buried in a National Cemetery. An Army Chaplain of your faith may officiate; and an Army firing squad and bugler may render full military honors at the grave. The flag used to drape the casket of your son, during the burial ceremony, will be presented or sent to you immediately following the services.

I must advise you that reservations for an adjoining grave site to that of a deceased serviceman interred in a National Cemetery may only be made for his widow and minor children. Therefore, it will not be possible to have a grave site adjoining that of your son reserved for his mother.

May I extend my deepest sympathy to you in your great loss.

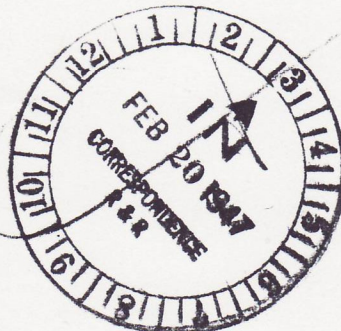

Your letter to the War Department concerning your son, the late Private Philip Orlando, has been referred to this office.

The official report of burial shows that the remains of your son were originally interred in the Ittenbach, Germany Cemetery, but were later disinterred and moved to a more suitable site where constant care of the grave can be assured by our Forces in the field.

The report of burial further discloses that the remains of your son are now interred in Plot WW, Row 3, Grave 54, in the US Military Cemetery Margraten, Holland, located ten miles west of Aachen, Germany.

In view of the fact that Congress has approved legislation which will permit the repatriation of all American dead who have lost their lives while serving overseas, the War Department does not contemplate the sponsoring of pilgrimages to the American Cemeteries abroad. At the proper time, the legal next of kin will be contacted by this office in order to obtain their wishes regarding the final disposition of the remains.

This office would have no objection to your visiting the grave of your son, should you be able to arrange a visit overseas. There is no authority or law whereby the Government could pay the expenses of your trip overseas for such a pilgrimage. It is suggested that for information regarding foreign travel you contact the State Department, Washington 25, D. C., or a reliable commercial travel agency.

Please accept my sincere sympathy in the loss of your son.

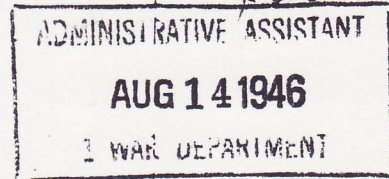

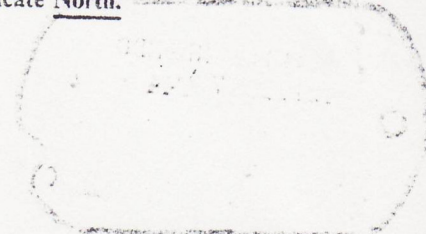


