

Dear Mrs. Rice:

The Commander of the Veterans of Foreign Wars, Bristol, Virginia, has informed us of your desire for a memorial marker to be erected in a family plot to honor your brother, the late Corporal Charles H. Bowen.

Legislation was approved by the President on 14 August 1958 which authorizes the Secretary of the Army to furnish memorial markers for erection in private or national cemeteries to commemorate any member of the Armed Forces of the United States dying in the service, whose remains have not been recovered and identified or were lost at sea. Under this suthority, Corporal Bowen is eligible for a memorial headstone or marker.

The approved regulations provide that an applicant for a memorial marker shall be the next of kin and shall be no more distantly related to a decedent than his widow, if she has not remarried; adult children, father, mother, adult brothers, adult sisters or grandparents. The preceding listing indicates the order in which relatives are recognized as the next of kin.

Inclosed is a partly completed DA Form 1815, Application for Headstone or Marker. We shall appreciate your having the information which we have typed on the form verified, having the information in the spaces checked in blue added; attaching a list of Corporal Bowen's survivors, according to the above order of priority; having his next of kin sign the form as the applicant; and returning the form to the Office of The Quartermaster General, Washington 25, D. C. As soon as the form is returned, steps will be taken to have the memorial febricated and shipped.

If the memorial is to be erected in a national rather than a private cemetery items 12, 14, 15, 16, and 17 on the form need not be completed. Only one type of marker is authorized for erection in each national cemetery, and the type furnished will be determined by the regulations in effect for the national cemetery selected.

Dear Mr. Bowen:

The Department of the Army desires that you be informed of the final determination of the investigation in the case of your son, the late Corporal Charles H. Bowen.

Realizing that this is a matter of great importance to you, may I review the pertinent facts of the case as revealed by Department of the Army records received from our overseas command.

Your son was a member of Company B, 40th Tank Battalion, and comprised part of the five man crew of a tank which was engaged in action against the enemy in the vicinity of Metz, France, on 9 September 1944. This tank was in a defensive position when it was fired upon by the enemy and suffered a direct hit from an anti-tank gun. The tank was set afire and continued to burn during the entire course of the engagement. Two crew members escaped from the burning vehicle and although they watched the tank burn for some time, they did not see any of the other crew members leave. After the tank had stopped burning, it was examined by the Commanding Officer of Company B, and no trace of the remains of your son and the other two men could be found. It is logical to conclude, therefore, that these men were killed or seriously wounded by the shell which struck their tank, that they were unable to leave the vehicle and that their remains were completely consumed by the ensuing fire.

These unfortunate circumstances surrounding the death of your son have been thoroughly reviewed and, based upon the information presently available, the Department of the Army has been forced to conclude that his remains are not recoverable. I wish to assure you that, should any additional evidence come to our attention indicating that his remains are in our possession, you will be informed immediately.



#### STATEMENT OF INVESTIGATION

- 1. This case pertains to the non-recoverability of the remains of the three (3) decedents listed above, of the crew of five of a tank, which was engaged in action against the enemy, in the vicinity of Metz, France 9 September 1944.
- 2. During the encounter the tank suffered a direct hit and was set afire, burned throughout the engagement and for some time after.
- 3. Tec/5 James W. Logan, 34 188 604, a crew member of subject tank, states that he and Private Robert Millerwise, 36 869 646 escaped to safety by emerging from the tank through the bow gunner's side. He watched the tank burn and did not see the remaining crew members leave it.
- 4. Records show that an examination of the interior of the tank, after it had stopped burning, revealed no trace of any bodies.
- 5. The Field Board and this Office have made every effort to associate subject decedents with remains recovered from the pertinent area, with negative results.

SYNOPSIS OF CASE: The above mentioned unresolved casualties comprised part of the crew of a tank which was engaged in action against the enemy in the vicinity of Metz, France on 9 Sept. 1944. This tank was in a defensive position when it was fired upon by the enemy and suffered a direct hit from an anti-tank gun. Tank was set afire and continued to burn during the entire course of the engagement. Two crew members escaped from the burning vehicle and although they watched the tank burn for some time, they did not see any of the other crew members leave. After tank had stopped burning, it was examined by Commanding Officer of Co "B", 40th Tank Bn, and no trace of the remains of the above mentioned casualties could be found. A Field Investigation was conducted in the appropriate area in May and June 1947 with negative results. It is logical to conclude that these men were killed or seriously wounded by the shell which struck their tank, that they were unable to leave the vehicle and that their remains were completely consumed by the ensuing fire. The fact that association with unknowns recovered from the area was also negative would tend to substantiate this conclusion: It is therefore recommended that this case be deemed Non-Recoverable.

Reference is made to: OQMG Forms 371; 5th Ind Hq 7th Armd Div, dtd 6 Mar 1945; Report of Investigation dated 13 June 1947 with attached statements.

- 2. All attached supporting documents are sopied from records in file Headquarters American Graves Registration Command.
- 3. Every effort has been made to correlate this case with records in this headquarters pertaining to unknown deceased interred in U.S. Military Cemeteries and reported isolated burials. The results are negative.

4. It is recommended that the remains, based upon the above information and research, be declared non recoverable.
