

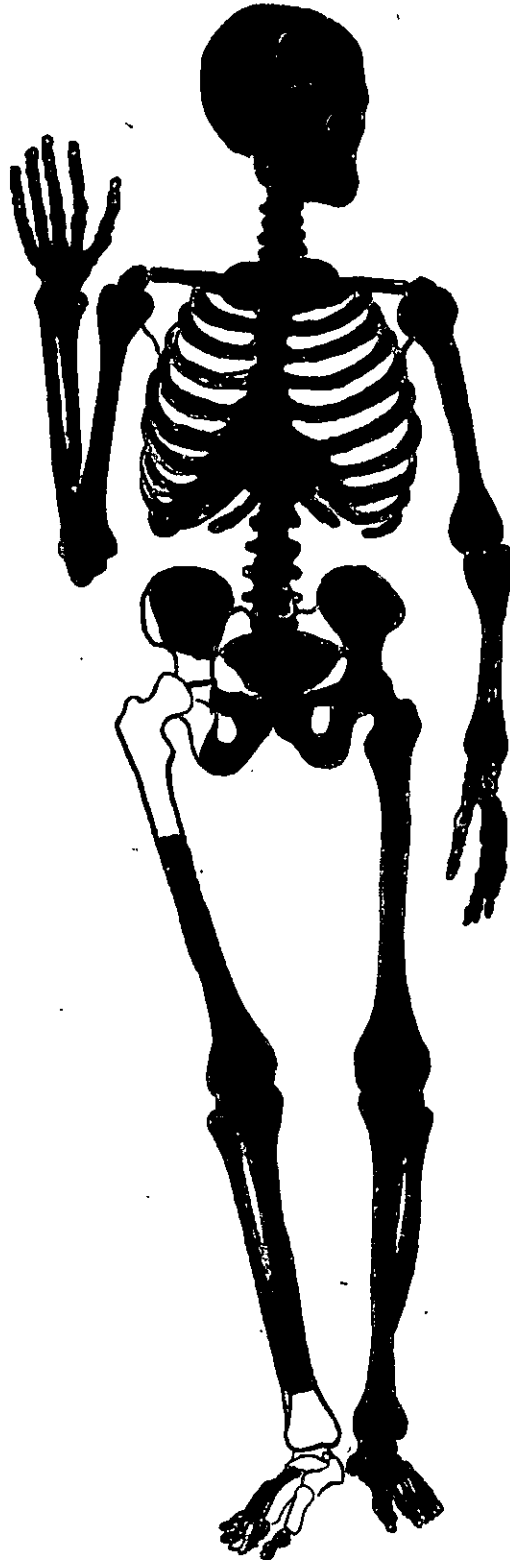

The Burgomaster of Overloon, Community of Vierlingsbeek, was contacted in regards to American isolated burials in his area.

He declared that in August and July 1947 Mr. Chatelain, investigator from Liege, First Zone, conducted a very extensive and thorough investigation in the Overloon - Vierlingsbeek area.

Each and every tank was examined and charred human remains were recovered from three of them.

Each and every isolated grave of which the nationality of the body in it was not definitely known was investigated by Mr; Chatelain, Mr. Hilljegerdes and Lt. Richard Wunck, all this Headquarters. One American was found. All the other graves contained German bodies.

Since this last investigation no other graves or tanks have been found.

Result investigation: Negative.

S T A T E M E N T

The Burgomaster of Vierlingsbeek, including the villages of Vierlingsbeek, Maashees, Holthees, Overloon, Groeningen and Vortum-Mullem, declares, that, according to a statement of the American investigator Chatelain, in July and August 1947 all destroyed American tanks and present graves which are in the Community of Vierlingsbeek, and which probably contain the body of a German soldier, have been closely examined, and that since this investigation he did not obtain any further information or indication concerning deceased American soldiers, or if other tanks have been found.

## REMARKS

Casualty reports for T/4 Darrell E. Frye of the 40th Tk. Bn. reveal that he was KIA on 2 Oct. 1944 when the tank which he was driving was hit by enemy fire near Overloon, Holland. All other crew members of tank #3010365 escaped, leaving FRYE as the only casualty.

The remains of X-5855 Neuville, consisting of a few charred bones, were recovered from inside of tank USA 3010365 in the vicinity of Overloon, Holland. One ID tag for T/4 FRYE was found in the tank.

According to case papers, remains were recovered from two other tanks located in the immediate vicinity: X-5785 Neuville, identified as Allan J. Persons, 37300978 and X-5577 Neuville, remains of which consist of only a very minute quantity of burned bone fragments. The area around each tank was searched but no additional remains were discovered.

An attack begun by this force on 30 September 44 in vicinity of OPL00, HOLLAND, with a mission of taking OVERLOON, HOLLAND, was resumed at 06301 October 44. Operating in conjunction with another task force on its right, this force moved south-east on the north side of the OPL00-OVERLOON road to approximately one mile northwest of OVERLOON, where it held without material change of position from the night of 1 October 44 through the night of 5 October 44. During that period, to reach and maintain its position, this force made attacks against strong opposition on the mornings of 1-2 and 3 October 44, co-ordinated with the Task Force on the right and on the first two mornings, following artillery serenades on OVERLOON. Opposition included heavy anti-tank, artillery, small arms, tanks, mortar and sebelwerfer fire. Enemy occupied dug-in positions in woods. Our tanks operated in close co-ordination with infantry. At night, tanks were outposted by infantry and Company "A", 814th Combat Engineers (in support of "CCA"). Mortar platoon was in close support. Assault guns were attached to C/40th Tank Battalion. Extensive artillery support was received. Tank Destroyers were employed to protect rear and flanks of force. For first time in history of battalion an air force pilot riding in tank, directed fighter planes on at least six tactical missions. Force was relieved in early morning hours on 6 October 44. The Tank Force, which began the operation with a total of 25 medium tanks and 4 assault guns lost three medium tanks and one assault gun. Losses were attributed to anti-tank guns and tanks.

c. At the time of recovery of the remains referred to in sub-paragraph (a) above, a further search of the area was made, on the basis of Mr Gerrits' statement, but no additional remains were recovered.

d. It is assumed that the tank called "Carouse" and tank #3010365 are the same since the field investigator listed "Carouse" in one report and #30103651 in his Investigation Area Search Report. It appears that only one tank was found on Mr Gerrits' property.

2. In view of above, it is requested that this headquarters be informed if it is still desired that a field search be made in an effort to recover additional remains. The remains of T/4 FRYE will continue to be held in suspense status, pending further instructions from your office.

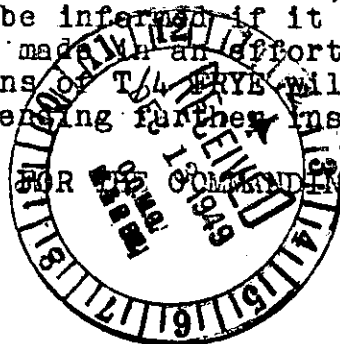


5. It has also been noticed that in a related case a statement pertaining to the tank on the property of Mr. Gerrits was made. An excerpt of this statement is inclosed.



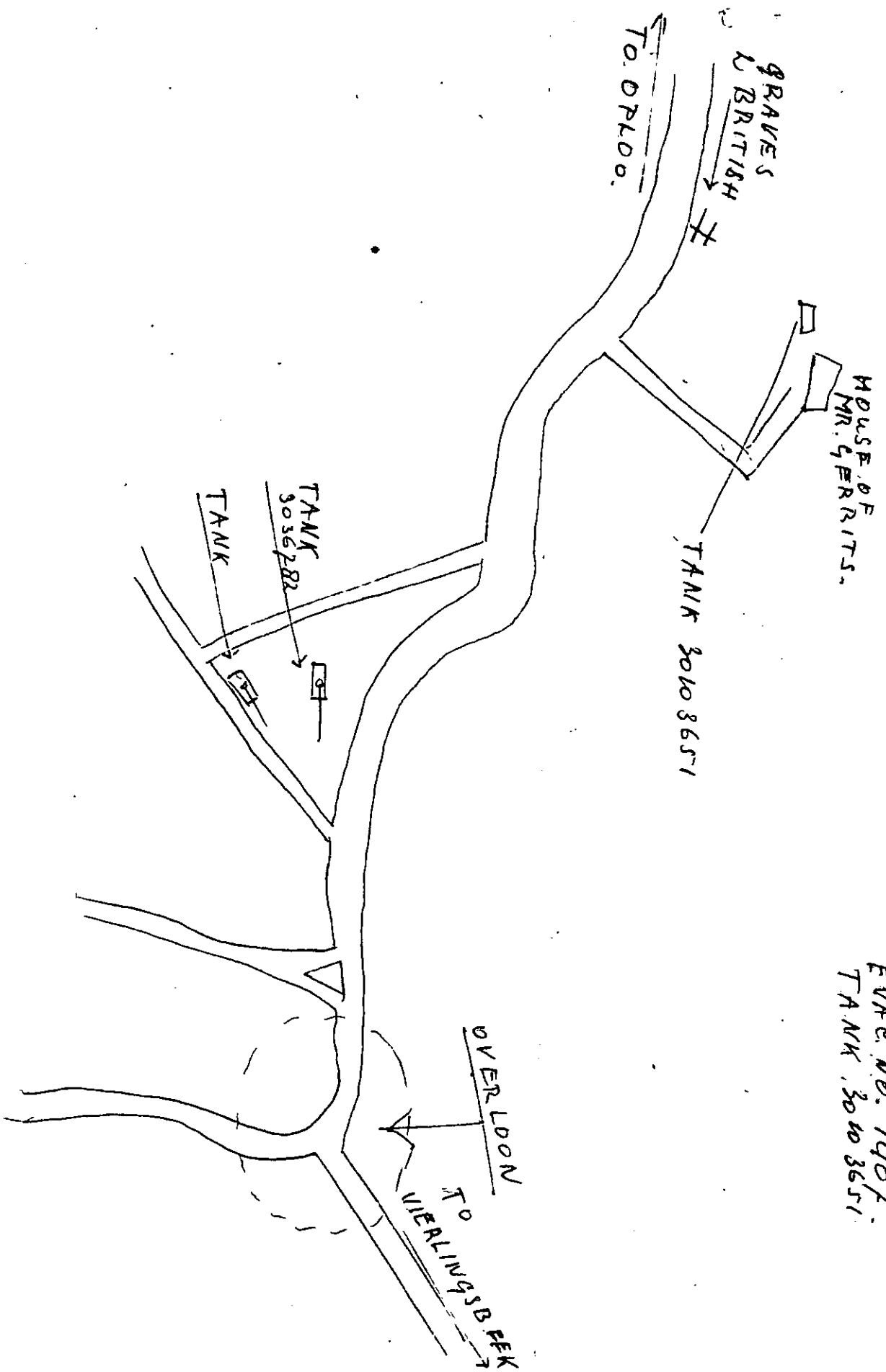



OVERLOON, 14 March 1947

I the undersigned declare that there is an American tank on my grounds, at approximately 50 meters from my house. This tank was destroyed during fights in the first days of October 1944.

The tank was hit by enemy weapons, and I saw that about half an hour later the tank which was burning exploded, probably in consequence of it's own ammunition.

About 4 days later I visited the wreckage, and saw parts of a human body scattered over the field. Approximately 14 days later these remains were gathered and buried by English soldiers in the field near the tank. These soldiers gave me the idea that there were survivors of this accident. I cannot say that for sure because I do not understand the English language.

The spot where the remains are buried is not marked. Therefore the correct location is not known. However, I can point out the place within 20 meters.

Considering the nature of the explosion I can declare with certainty that there still are remains in the tank. This case has never been investigated before, and to my knowledge the remains are still in the field.

After the action, the burned hull was examined, no trace of him could be found, the tank which burned exploded and destroyed all the hull.




