SYNOPSIS: The casualties listed on attached roster are reported by official records as Missing in Action or Killed in Action during ground operations in the department of Meurthe-et-Moselle, France, from the period 7 September through 3 December 1944. Extensive area searches as well as individual investigations have to date failed to furnish information as to the ultimate disposition of their remains. Efforts to effect association with unidentified recoveries from the area, now interred in U.S. Military Cemeteries, have also proven negative. The lack of specific information regarding the death or burial, limited search in most instances to general localities, however, documents on file in this Office and Office of The Quartermaster General substantiate the fact that numerous investigations covering the entire department of Meurthe-et-Moselle, have been conducted in the course of search operations for all losses, both recovered and unrecovered. The terrain of the Meurthe-et-Moselle department, consists of farm, pasture and forest land which has been under constant use since the cessation of hostilities, thus the possibility of undiscovered graves is remote. It can therefore only be concluded that the remains of the deceased in question were reduced by battle action to a state which precludes recover; or identification, with the exception of two men listed on attached roster who were known to have drowned and their remains never recovered. The

absence of specific information concerning their deaths, the failure of Field Investigations to provide evidence, and the lack of association with recovered unknowns would tend to substantiate these conclusions. It is recommended that the remains of the individuals listed on these Board Proceedings be considered Non-Recoverable under the provisions of paragraph 3b, Letter, Office of The Quartermaster General, file QMGMP 293, Subject: Processing Board Findings of Non-Recoverability Return of World War II Dead Program, dated 25 March 1949.

Reference is made to: OQMG Forms 371; After Action Reports, and Casualty Clearence Plan concerning each decedent; Reports of Field Investigations previously forwarded to the Office of The Quartermaster General, pertaining to resolved casualties who were killed in action in the department of Meurthe-et-Mosell, France: On file in The Office of The Quartermaster General, Washington, D. C.

Unfortunately, reports of this nature contain only the briefest details as they are prepared under battle conditions and the means of transmission are limited.

I know the sorrow this message has brought you and it is my hope that in time the knowledge of his heroic service to his country, even unto death, may be of sustaining comfort to you.

I extend to you my deepest sympathy.

Outposted Verdun and protected bridge crossing over Meuse River. approximately three (3) enemy bombers attacked at 2300. Casualties - three (3) killed, 14 wounded, no vehicles.

- b. 13452 September 44 to 1330 6 September:
 - 1. 40th Tenk Battalion less Companies "B" and "D" attached: 489th FA Bn., a/A8th Inf., 1 platoon A/814th TD Bn., 1 platoon A/33rd Engineers.

Moved to bivouse sres vicinity of Bras, France, Personal hygiene, care and cleaning of clothing and equipment and first echelon maintenance was performed.

- c. 13306 September 44 to 10007 September 44:
- 1. 405h Tank Battalion less Companies "B" and "D"
 Attached: 489th FA Bn., A/48th Inf, 1 platoon A/814 TD
 Bn 1 platoon A/33rd Engineers.

Moved from vicinity of Bras, France sest through Verdun, Etain to-ward Metz. Strong enemy resistance met at St Privat. AT guns, automatic weapons, bezookss, riflemen, mines and road blocks in the form of craters and these were well coordinated. Infantry closedly supported by tanks and artillery overcame their resistance by 19007 September 44. Casualties- 3 Enlisted Men killed, 1 Enlisted man missing in action, 1 Officer and 10 enlisted men wounded in action, 3 medium tanks (one by mines and two by AT guns) and one 105MM Assult gun (by mines).

- d. 10007 September 44 to 18008 September 44:
- 1. 40th Tank Battelion less Compenies "B" and "D".
 Attached: 489th FA Bn., A/48th Inf, 1 platoon A/814 TD
 Bn. 1 platoon A/33rd Engineers

Moved from St Privat, France to the northeast, toward the Moselle River and halted in the vicinity of Silvange, France because of heavy artillery and mortar fire. Remained in this position receiving fire periodically. The 40th tank Battalion except S-3 half-trackland Company "C" remained in this area until 060015 September 44 under periodical fire. Casualties - 1 Enlisted Man killed, 3 Enlisted Men wounded 3 Medium tanks (one by bazooka fire and two by AT guns), 1 light tank (bazooka)

e. 18008 September 44 to 090010 September 44:

1. Task force - S-3 half-track, C/40th Tank Battalion,
489th TA Bn., and Company "A" 48th Infantry Battalion.

Moved from vicinity of Silvange to position west of Roncourt with mission of assisting 1st Bn., 2nd Infantry attacked from the southwest from the vicinity of Nabonville. The attack was launched at 13159 September 44 but was stopped by extremely heavy AT and artillery fire. At least part of AT guns and artillery were located in strong concrete fortifications and emplacements which surround the city of Metz. Casualties - 1 Enlisted Man killed 7 Enlisted Men missing in action, 1 Officer and 8 Enlisted Men wounded in action, 6 medium tanks (AT guns).

f. 090010 September 44 to 141511 September 44:

1. Task force - S-3 halftrack, Company "C" 40th Tank Battalion 489th FA Bn., A/48th Armored Infantry Battalion.

Moved from vicinity west of Roncourt to vicinity of Habonville with mission of assisting 1st Bn, 2nd Infantry to seize Amonville by attacking in coordination with them on their right flank. Attack launched at 1800 10 September 44. Tanks were met with heavy artillery and AT fire. Tanks were able to penetrate to the outskirts of Amonville but were forced to withdraw because Infantry could not move in with them. Casualties 1 Enlisted Man missing in action, 2 Enlisted Men wounded in action 3 Medium Tanks (AT guns).


