Dear Mr. Bolyard:

Your letter dated 27 May 1949, addressed to the Army Effects Bureau Kansas City, Missouri, regarding the missing personal effects of your son, the late Private Hayward R. Bolyard, has been forwarded to this Office for reply.

The records from the Army Effects Bureau pertaining to your son's effects reveal that nothing was ever received at the Bureau for him. Further, due to the time which has passed since he became a casualty, it is not plausible to assume that anything will be recovered for him. You may feel confident, however, in the event anything is received at the Bureau, you will be notified.

Private Bolyard was an Infantryman and he, no doubt, had some of his personal belongings on his person at the time of the casualty. I am sure you realize the difficulties encountered in the recovery of personal effects from the battlefield, due to the inevitable confusion attendant upon combat conditions and the possible presence of enemy souvenir hunters.

You have my continued sympathy in the loss of your son.

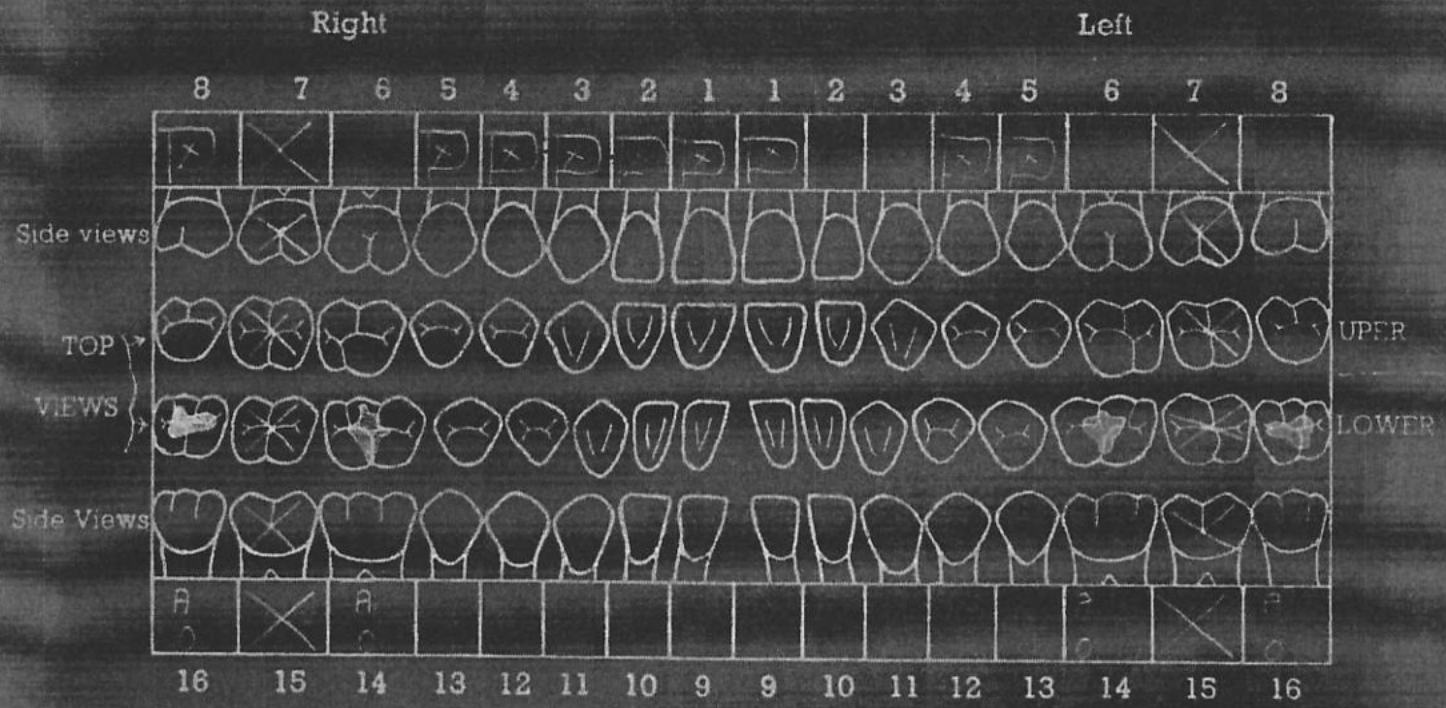

Through Normal searching operations a searching team led by Pfc ZUKOWSKI discovered the body of an American soldier in the woods behind a house of a former by the name of Joseph METTLER who found and buried the body in May 1945. He was working in the woods and found the body under the trees. Because of the conditions of the body he only got close enough to throw some dirt over it. He made a rough cross and put a helmet on top. He claims that the body was fully clothed. Joseph METTLER is the only person who knows any information concerning the burial as he found and buried the same time.

It is impossible to get a statement stating the exact time that this soldier was killed. I believe that he was killed doing the battle of the budge due to the heavy casualties which the Americans suffered in that area during that time.

I, the undersigned, Joseph METTLEN, farmer, 160, in FECKELSBORN, certify having found the body of an American soldier in a wood, behind the house.

In the month May 1945, I was working in the wood, when I found that body under the trees.

In consequence of the high temperature, the body was in bad state of decomposition. So, I covered the remains with earth, made a cross, put in on the grave and placed his helmet on the top. The body was wearing clothes, shoes, gloves, etc... I don't know anything about his identity.

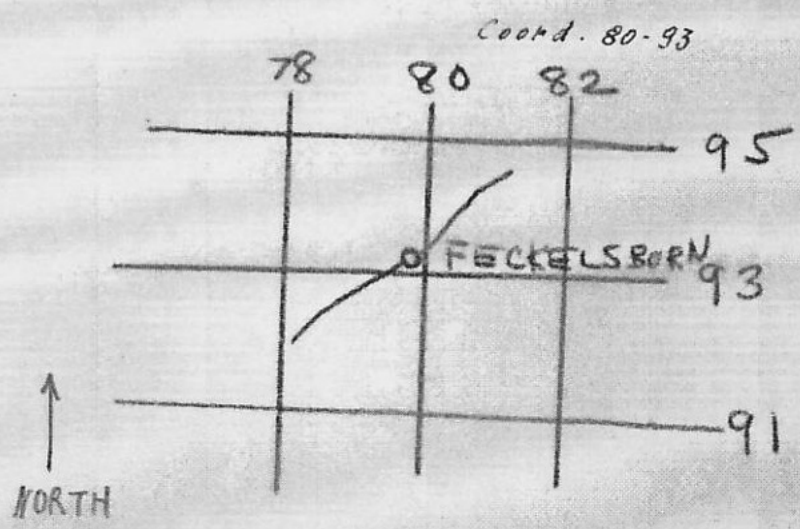

Bolvard but gave an identification tag belonging to Berkley H. Inge, 33 821 309 T 44 44 O. An American body was supposed to have been evacuated from the site where the tag was found several months previously.


The only family living in POTEAU lives in a stable. This investigator got a statement from this Mr. HENRI, declaring that to the best of his knowledge Pvt. BOLVARD is not buried at POTEAU and that there are no allied bodies in or near the hamlet; that he never heard of this soldier; and that he found an identity tag with the following inscription:

BERKLEY H. INGE, 33 821 309 T 44 44 O

This tag was found on the same spot where the Americans evacuated an American body several months before that date.

Through Normal searching operations a searching team led by Pfc LUKOWSKI discovered the body of an American soldier in the woods behind a house of a former by the name of Joseph NETTLER who found and buried the body in May 1945. He was working in the woods and found the body under the trees. Because of the conditions of the body he only got close enough to throw some dirt over it. He made a rough cross and put a helmet on top. He claims that the body was fully clothed. Joseph NETTLER is the only person who knows any information concerning the burial as he found and buried the same time.

It is impossible to get a statement stating the exact time that this soldier was killed. I believe that he was killed during the battle of the bulge due to the heavy casualties which the Americans suffered in that area during that time.


The only family living in POTEAU lives in a stable. This investigator got a statement from this Mr. HENRI, declaring that to the best of his knowledge Pvt. BOLVARD is not buried at POTEAU and that there are no allied bodies in or near the hamlet; that he never heard of this soldier; and that he found an identity tag with the following inscription:

BERKLEY H. INGE, 33 821 309 T 44 44 0

This tag was found on the same spot where the Americans evacuated an American body several months before that date.

Furthermore this investigator obtained a statement from the Burgomaster of the Community of PETIT-THIER, in which he states that there are no allied bodies buried in the territory of the Community of PETIT-THIER, nor in the hamlet of POTEAU; that all allied bodies have been evacuated by the Americans in March 1945; that the last allied body has been evacuated by the Americans in June 1946; and that he does not know whether one of these bodies was identified as INGE or BOLVARD.

In consequence of the high temperature, the body was in bad state of decomposition. So, I covered the remains with earth, made a cross, put in on the grave and placed his helmet on the top. The body was wearing clothes, shoes, gloves, etc... I don't know anything about his identity.

Sketch of Feckelsborn

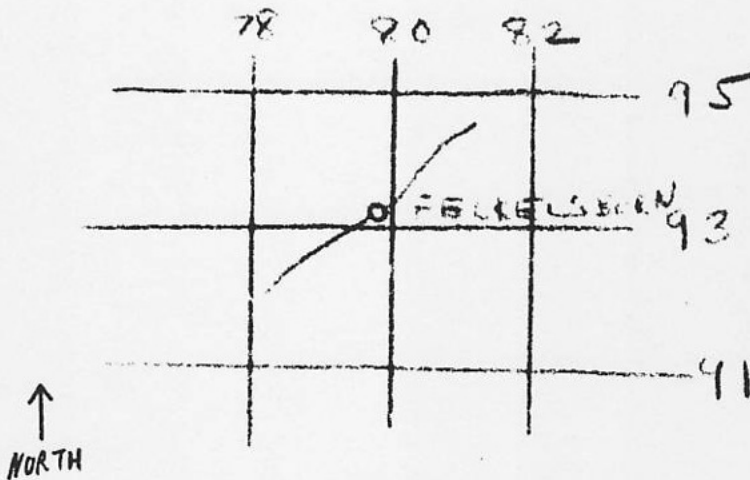
