



I have received your letter dated 12 July 1945, concerning the Purple Heart posthumously awarded to your son, the late Private First Class Terrence M. Coyne.

It is regretted that the Purple Heart and documents were incorrectly engraved. The corrected Purple Heart certificate and the Presidential Accolade are being mailed to you under separate cover showing your son's name to be Private First Class Terrence M. Coyne, and not Terrence N. Coyne. Upon receipt of these properly engraved documents, those now in your possession may be destroyed. It is requested that you return the Purple Heart medal to this office in order that the necessary correction may be made.

There is inclosed a self-addressed frank for your convenience in mailing the decoration postage free.
