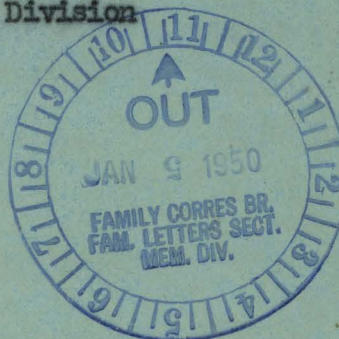

STATEMENT OF INVESTIGATION

1. Subject decedent was killed in action on 8 September 1944 in the vicinity of Talange, near Metz, France, as a result of mortar shell fragment wounds, received while participating with his platoon in an attack upon a small town just south of Talange, Moselle, France.

2. The platoon of which subject deceased was a member was subjected to heavy mortar and small arms fire. As they were withdrawing the enemy laid down an extra barrage of mortar fire and subject decedent received a direct hit from several bursts of machine gun fire, killing him instantly. The Platoon leader personally checked and found subject decedent dead. Heavy enemy fire prevented any attempt to recover the remains.

3. An investigation conducted by the Field in an endeavor to recover the remains of subject decedent as well as an attempt made by this office to associate subject deceased with unknown remains X-6010, interred in USMC St. Avoild, France, have been negative; and in view of the fact that no association can be made with unknowns recovered from the area, it is logical to conclude that the remains of subject decedent are Non-Recoverable.

4. All information obtained by this office confirms the recommendation of Non-Recoverability made by the Field Board of Review.






FINDINGS: The Board having carefully considered the evidence before it, finds the remains of said casualty/casualties, are non recoverable.



48TH ARMORED INFANTRY BN

After Action Report

On 2 September 44 we received a very rigged ration of fuel, enough to move us to a Division Assembly Area north of Verdun in the town of Bras. We remained in that position until the morning of 6 September by which time sufficient gasoline had arrived to permit most of the elements of the Combat Command to proceed on.

Lt. Col. Chappuis' force consisted of his own 48th Armd. Inf. Bn. less "A" and "B" Companies of the 40th Armd Bn., the 695th Armd. Field Arty. Bn., a platoon of "A" Company of the 33rd Armd Engr. Bn., and a platoon of "A" Company of the 814th T.D. Bn. The movement was East of Briey and then to the Moselle River; However, the bridge at Briey had been blown and the force had to go South to Hatrise, thence North to Joeuf and East to Malacourt which it reached at 0130 on the 7th.

Later on the morning of the 7th the force moved thru Aierrvillers, Mondeange and Hagondange to a position just South of Talange.

Here began a rather unique bit of soldiering. We were told we were to remain in position to keep the German units in this area for falling back against the 5th Inf. Div. which was attacking Metz to our South. The 695 AFA went into position and fired steadily thru a 270° and sometimes larger arc, always with the certainty of striking some German positions. The Germans had perfect observation over one entire area and made excellent use of it. We remained here thru the 14th of September suffering rather heavy casualties in both men and vehicles. Inasmuch as the occupation was strictly defensive and the dispositions were directed by the terrain, no particular orders were issued. Our mission was merely to sit and let the enemy throw observed fire on us the rebuy keeping some of his batteries occupied while other U. S. forces attempted frontal and flank attacks on Metz.

On 10 September 44 a platoon of "C" Company attempted to push South from Talanges to Maisieres in an effort to destroy some of the enemy's OP's, mortar positions, and snipers. Immediately heavy concentrations were laid on our troops and the platoon was compelled to withdraw after suffering 25 casualties.

Each night German patrols, some in strength as great as 40 men, attempted to penetrate into the town of Magondange and Talanges. Each time they were driven off and only once did we secure any prisoners from them.

Later on the morning of the 7th the force moved from Hattviller, Monseigneur and Hazonange to a position just south of Tange.

Div. which was attacking east to our south. The 9th Inf. went into position and fired steadily from a 270 and some other heavy guns. Along with the certainty of making some German positions. On 10 September a platoon of "C" Company attempted to push north from Tange to Hattviller in an effort to destroy one of the enemy's main mortar positions, and snipers. Immediately heavy concentrations were laid on our troops and the platoon was compelled to withdraw after suffering 25 casualties.

Each night certain elements, some in strength as great as 40 men, attempted to penetrate into the town of Hazonange and Tange. Each time they were driven off and only once did we catch any prisoners from them.

TO MR MOYLE,

IN REGARD TO S/SGT HAACK, PFC MARUSCOK.

Co C was ordered to take a small town just south of Talange, France. Capt Harrison S. Forrester gave the 2nd Platoon the mission to take this small town. T/Sgt Blazier advanced his platoon into the edge of this town and then got orders to withdraw. As they were withdrawing the enemy laid down an extra large barrage of mortar fire, and then the enemy came out of the houses and started firing small arms at the platoon, Pfc Maruscok was just behind S/Sgt Haack and a mortar shell fell between them, and at the same time they were fired on by enemy M-Guns. T/Sgt Blazier said he checked them and were both dead. So he left bodies behind and tried to get the rest of his platoon out. After he withdrew a MD said he would go get the bodies, and the MD was captured. So we did not attempt to get the bodies anymore.

DATE OF DEATH: 8 September 1944

PLACE OF DEATH: Talange, near Metz, Moselle, France.


SYNOPSIS OF CASE: The above mentioned unresolved casualty was a member of a platoon which was on an assigned mission to capture a small town just south of Talange (near Metz), Moselle, France, on 8 September 1944. Town was occupied by the enemy in superior force and the platoon was subjected to heavy mortar and small arms fire. Subject deceased received a direct hit from a mortar shell and also several bursts of machine gun fire. Two casualties resulted from this action. Pfc Maruscok and S/Sgt Haack. Platoon leader personally checked both men and found them dead. Enemy fire prevented any attempt to recover the remains. Unknown X-19, Grand Faily found at MAIZIERS-LES-METZ has been identified as S/Sgt HAACK. Field Investigations were conducted in the appropriate areas in August 1947 and February 1948 with negative results. One unknown X-6010 St Avoild recovered from Maiziers-les-Metz cannot be associated with Pfc Maruscok. It is logical to conclude that Pfc Maruscok was killed by enemy mortar and small arms fire and that his remains were disposed of by the enemy at some unknown location and have not been recovered. The fact that Field Investigations have been negative and the fact that no association can be made with unknowns recovered from the area would tend to substantiate this conclusion. It is therefore recommended that this case be deemed non-recoverable.

Reference is made to: OCMG Form 371; Missing Report, dtd 12 Oct 44; Statement of Sgt Virgil N. McCrary; After Action Report, 48th Armd Inf; Ltr. Hq 3rd Zone, dtd 19 Mar 48.

2. All attached supporting documents are copied from records in file headquarters American Graves Registration Command.

3. Every effort has been made to correlate this case with records in this headquarters pertaining to unknown deceased interred in U S Military Cemeteries and reported isolated burials. The results are negative.

4. It is recommended that the remains, based upon the above information and research, be declared non-recoverable.

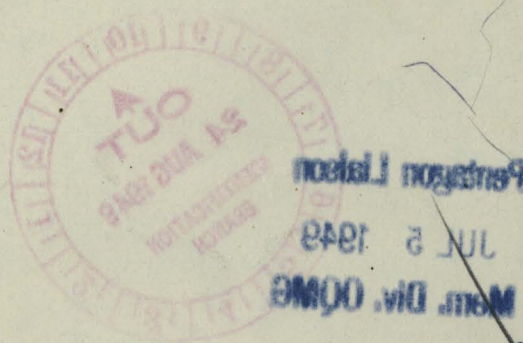

After Action Report

On 2 September 44 we received a very rigged ration of fuel, enough to move us to a Division Assembly Area north of Verdun in the town of Bras. We remained in that position until the morning of 6 September by which time sufficient gasoline had arrived to permit most of the elements of the Combat Command to proceed on.

Lt. Col. Chappuis' force consisted of his own 48th Armd. Inf. Bn. less "A" and "B" Companies of the 40th Armd. Bn., the 695th Armd. Field Arty. Bn., a platoon of "A" Company of the 33rd Armd. Engr. Bn., and a platoon of "A" Company of the 814th T.D. Bn. The movement was East of Briey and then to the Moselle River; however, the bridge at Briey had been blown and the force had to go South to Hatrize, thence North to Jœuf and East to Malacourt which it reached at 0130 on the 7th.

Later on the morning of the 7th the force moved thru Aierrvillers, Mondeange and Hagondange to a position just South of Talange.

Here began a rather unique bit of soldiering. We were told we were to remain in position to keep the German units in this area for falling back against the 5th Inf. Div. which was attacking Metz to our South. The 695 AFA went into position and fired steadily thru a 270° and sometimes larger arc, always with the certainty of striking some German positions. The Germans had perfect observation over one entire area and made excellent use of it. We remained here thru the 14th of September suffering rather heavy casualties in both men and vehicles. Inasmuch as the occupation was strictly defensive and the dispositions were directed by the terrain, no particular orders were issued. Our mission was merely to sit and let the enemy throw observed fire on us, thereby keeping some of his batteries occupied while other U. S. forces attempted frontal and flank attacks on Metz.

On 10 September 44 a platoon of "C" Company attempted to push South from Talanges to Maizieres in an effort to destroy some of the enemy's OP's, mortar positions, and snipers. Immediately heavy concentrations were laid on our troops and the platoon was compelled to withdraw after suffering 25 casualties.

Each night German patrols, some in strength as great as 40 men, attempted to penetrate into the town of Hagondange and Talanges. Each time they were driven off and only once did we secure any prisoners from them.

Co C was ordered to take a small town just south of Talange, France. Capt Harrison S. Forrester gave the 2nd Platoon the mission to take this small town. T/Sgt Blazier advanced his platoon into the edge of this town and then got orders to withdraw. As they were withdrawing the enemy laid down an extra large barrage of mortar fire, and then the enemy came out of the houses and started firing small arms at the platoon, Pfc Maruscok was just behind S/Sgt Haack and a mortar shell fell between them, and at the same time they were fired on by enemy M-Guns. T/Sgt Blazier said he checked them and were both dead. So he left bodies behind and tried to get the rest of his platoon out. After he withdrew a MD said he would go get the bodies, and the MD was captured. So we did not attempt to get the bodies anymore.
