The Commission also will have the responsibility for permanent construction and beautification of the cemetery, including erection of the permanent headstone. The headstone will be inscribed with the name exactly as recorded above, the rank or rating where appropriate, organization, State, and date of death. Any inquiries relative to the type of headstone or the spelling of the name to be inscribed thereon, should be addressed to the American Battle Monuments Commission, Washington 25, D. C. Your letter should include the full name, rank, serial number, grave location, and name of the cemetery.

You may rest assured that this final interment was conducted with fitting dignity and solemnity and that the grave site will be carefully and conscientiously maintained in perpetuity by the United States Government.

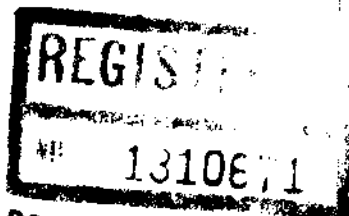

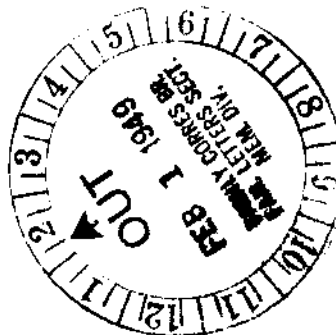

Will you please complete the enclosed form, "Request for Disposition of Remains" and mail in the enclosed self-addressed envelope, which requires no postage, within 30 days after its receipt by you? Its prompt return will avoid unnecessary delays.

To explain about the use of two names.....Kaye is a professional name my husband has used for some fifteen years. He also used it in the army and they said that it became his name legally by long use, however, the department that handles my insurance checks from Lt. Steinberg felt that it had to be changed by law civilly and in that connection I am therefore using the name of Kosachiner that is his father's name. I have notified them that as soon as I could afford to, I would have it changed by a lawyer and inform them of the change which I have not had an opportunity to do to date. That is, I have not had an opportunity to have the name changed legally and therefore am still Kosachiner.

You do not mention whether I am legally the person who will dictate the disposition of the remains of Lt.
