AWARDS OF MERITORIOUS SERVICE UNIT PLAQUE

I. Under the provisions of Section I, Circular No. 345, War Department, 23 August 1944, as amended, the Meritorious Service Unit Plaque is awarded to the 7th Armored Division Band for superior performance of duty in the accomplishment of exceptionally difficult tasks, from 10 August 1944 to 9 May 1945, in France, Belgium, Holland and Germany.

From the time the 7th Armored Division first engaged the enemy in France until the surrender of the German Armed Forces, the members of the 7th Armored Division Band rendered exceptionally meritorious service. Unable to function as a musical organization due to combat conditions, the members of the Band were called upon, as individual soldiers or groups of soldiers, to perform varied and unfamiliar duties for which no other personnel was available. As utilities repairmen, rations handlers, drivers and at other essential tasks, all bandsmen acquitted themselves in highly commendable fashion. The devotion to duty and high standards of discipline displayed by the members of the band are a credit to themselves and their organization.

II. Under the provisions of Section I, Circular No. 345, War Department, 23 August 1944, as amended, the Meritorious Service Unit Plaque is awarded to the 77th Armored Medical Battalion for superior performance of duty in the accomplishment of exceptionally difficult tasks, from 10 August 1944 to 9 May 1945, in France, Belgium, Holland and Germany.

The 77th Armored Medical Battalion rendered invaluable service to the 7th Armored Division and made material contribution to its combat efficiency during the European Campaigns. Evacuation of casualties was rapid and efficient under the most difficult and harrassing field conditions. The Battalion, on its own initiative, devised a system whereby two of its companies were used for evacuation and the third functioned as a mobile treatment and recuperation center. This center returned to duty sixty-three per cent of all casualties admitted, an outstanding accomplishment and one of great importance to the effectiveness of the whole Division. This center also returned to duty sixty-six per cent of combat exhaustion cases admitted, again providing the immediate services of personnel which would otherwise have been lost to the command for a period of weeks. The prompt treatment afforded at Division level obviated the delay occasioned by evacuation through normal channels with consequent loss of the services of the personnel. This conservation of manpower Was of especial importance at the times when personnel replacements were difficult to obtain. As a military organization, the 77th Armored Medical Battalion achieved and maintained a high standard of technical proficiency and military discipline, reflecting great credit upon each of its members.

III. Under the provisions of Section I, Circular No. 345, Mar Department, 23 August 1944, as amended, the Meritorious Service Unit Plaque is awarded to the 129th Ordnance Maintenance Battalion for superior performance of duty in the accomplishment of exceptionally difficult tasks, from 10 August 1944 to 9 May 1945, in France, Belgium, Holland and Germany.

The 129th Ordnance Maintenance Battalion furnished the units of the 7th Armored Division with outstanding ordnance support during all of their campaigns in Europe. Continuous, superior third echelon maintenance kept the tanks and vehicles of the Division rolling throughout the fast, sustained drives which characterized much of the Division's action. At times no ordnance parts were available in the Army to which the Division was assigned, but the Division always had a supply, due to the initiative of the 129th in obtaining them from adjacent Army Supply Depots, or from the Depots of Allied Armies. Liaison Detachments from the Battalion, working with Combat Command Headquarters, insured close and well-informed support of the combat elements. Battlefield recovery of vehicles and equipment was always rapid and thorough. Outstanding work of this nature was demonstrated in the vicinity of Meijel, Holland, when ordnance crews recovered tanks and vital parts from areas in advance of the allied lines and under heavy enemy fire. The ingenuity and tenacity of the 129th is exemplified by their considerable contribution to the recapture of St. Vith, Belgium, during the battle of the Ardennes, when, standard equipment being unobtainable, the Battalion designed, constructed and installed ice-cleats on all medium tanks in the Division, enabling them to successfully maneuver across the snowcovered terrain. The high standard of technical proficiency and military achievement demonstrated by the 129th Ordnance Maintenance Battalion reflect great credit upon each of its members.

IV. Under the provisions of Section I, Circular No. 345, War Department, 23 August 1944, as amended, the Meritorious Service Unit Plaque is awarded to the 147th Armored Signal Company for superior performance of duty in the accomplishment of exceptionally difficult tasks, from 10 August 1944 to 9 May 1945, in France, Belgium, Holland and Germany.

The 147th Armored Signal Company was an outstanding factor in the success of the 7th Armored Division during its combat operations in Europe. The company wire personnel, often operating under enemy fire, accomplished with their small number of men the same work accomplished in other Armored Divisions with crews several times as large. Wire communications were promptly and efficiently installed at all locations. The radio operations platoon handled expeditiously an enormous volume of traffic. The Division Message Center processed more than one hundred thousand messages and dispatches. In addition to its normal duties, the Message Center assumed responsibility for delivery of "Stars and Stripes" and "Yank" to the units of the Division, and by its rapid and reliable deliveries contributed in considerable degree to the Division morale. The expert radio repair and timely supply of signal equipment provided by the company was highly important in combat operations, especially with regard to the Armored Field Artillery Battalions. The high standards of military discipline maintained by the 147th reflects the highest credit upon each of its members. During the sixty-day period from 8 March 1945 to 8 May 1945, there were no cases of venereal disease, no courts-martial cases, no punishments under the 104th Article of War, and no absonces without leave within the Company. Each Officer and Enlisted Man of the 147th Armored Signal Company has cause for deep pride in himself and his organization.
