Hepding, in Mess County Veteran's Cometery, Grand Junction, Colorado. The authorization for the furnishing of Government stones provides they be used for the unmarked graves in which the remains of those dying in the service or for those honorably discharged therefrom are interred. There is no authority to furnish a stone to be erected as a memorial in a family plot when the remains of the decedent are In a case where a member of the armed Forces has lost his life outside the continental limits of the United States, when the remains outside the continental limits of the United States, when the remains were recovered, they were interred and the grave marked with a temporary marker. Plane are boing made to remove these remains to a final resting place in compliance with the expressed desire of the next of kin. Should the final burial take place in a cometery under Government control, either in the United States or foreign country, the grave will be permanently marked without further action on the part of the family. However, if final interment is made in a private cometery, a stone will be furnished by the Government upon request. In view of the above, your application is returned. In the event the Femains of this veteran are returned to the United States, per-manently interred in a private cometery and you desire a Government stone, your application should then be resubsited to this office for processing, whereupon it will be given every consideration.
