Dear Mr. Brooks:

This is to inform you that the remains of your loved one have been permanently interred, as recorded above, side by side with comrades who also gave their lives for their country. Customary military funeral services were conducted over the grave at the time of burial.

After the Department of the Army has completed all final interments, the cemetery will be transferred, as authorized by the Congress, to the care and supervision of the American Battle Monuments Commission. The Commission also will have the responsibility for permanent construction and beautification of the cemetery, including erection of the permanent headstone. The headstone will be inscribed with the name exactly as recorded above, the rank or rating where appropriate, organization, State, and date of death. Any inquiries relative to the type of headstone or the spelling of the name to be inscribed thereon, should be addressed to the American Battle Monuments Commission, Washington 25, D. C. Your letter should include the full name, rank, serial number, grave location, and name of the cemetery.

While interments are in progress, the cemetery will not be open to visitors. You may rest assured that this final interment was conducted with fitting dignity and solemnity and that the grave-site will be carefully and conscientiously maintained in perpetuity by the United States Government.

We have received and accepted the "Request for Disposition of Remains" form in regard to the final interment of the remains of your son, the late Technician Fifth Grade Hugh T. Brooks.

The official report of burial indicates that the remains of your son were interred in a dignified and solemn manner in Plot Z, Row 12, Grave 279, in the United States Military Cemetery Neuville-en-Condroz, located nine miles southwest of Liege, Belgium.

I deeply regret that you were not informed of the location of your son's grave previous to the "Letter of Inquiry--Return of World War II Dead".

Please be assured that the remains of your son will be permanently interred in the American Military Cemetery Neuville-en-Condroz, Belgium.

I am sure you will understand that it may be necessary to move the remains of your son, during the permanent beautification and consolidation of the cemetery as a shrine in grateful remembrance of our honored dead of World War II.

You may be assured that all necessary movement will be accomplished in a reverent, dignified and solemn manner, with appropriate religious services and military honors.

All necessary arrangements for burial, military honors and religious services will be completed and provided by the Government. Please rest assured that although you have no responsibilities and cannot be present, every detail will be accomplished with all the reverence and dignity traditional for our honored dead.

Dear Mr. Brooks:

The people of the United States, through the Congress have authorized the disinterment and final burial of the heroic dead of World War II. The Quartermaster General of the Army has been entrusted with this sacred responsibility to the honored dead. The records of the War Department indicate that you may be the nearest relative of the above-named deceased, who gave his life in the service of his country.

The enclosed pamphlets, "Disposition of World War II Armed Forces Dead," and "American Cemeteries," explain the disposition, options and services made available to you by your Government. If you are not the next of kin, please complete Part III of the enclosed form.

If you should elect Option 2, it is advised that no funeral arrangements or other personal arrangements be made until you are further notified by this office.

Will you please complete the enclosed form, "Request for Disposition of Remains" and mail in the enclosed self-addressed envelope, which requires no postage, within 30 days after its receipt by you? Its prompt return will avoid unnecessary delays.





NARRATIVE ON NIEDER PRUM, GERMANY CASE

On the 24 July 1947 this searching team proceeded to Nieder Prum, Germany to search for graves of American deceased.

According to information received from First Field Command, six (6) American soldiers were killed during an air raid on a prison camp at Nieder Prum on the 2 January 1945.

In questioning several people of the above town we learned, that approximately 20 ft. from the German Military Cemetery of Nieder Prum several Americans were buried in a field, but they had been disinterred by American troops early in 1945.

As we could not get any positive proof that the deceased had been disinterred, we proceeded to dig up the area and discovered the remains of eleven (11) American deceased in one mass grave.

Nine (9) of the deceased wore their identification tags around the neck but on two (2) of these none could be found.

This casualty wore an identification tag bearing the following: Brooks, Hugh T., 11064869 T 42-43 A.P.

No other information pertaining to the deceased is available.







Acting on information contained in basic communication an investigation was conducted in the REGNE area, which village lies in the Community of BIHAIN, in order to locate the remains of Tex/5 Hugh T. BROOKS, 11 064 869, KIA on 2-1-45.

A statement was obtained from the local president of the Red Cross at RECNE, in which he declares that no American soldiers are buried in or near REGNE:- that deceased in question is not known to him;- that he turned over to this investigator three documents, viz: one (1) picture book, without nomenclature, one (1) Treatment Record of George G. Beck, and one Lodge Membership Card of George G. Beck, containing several pictures. These three documents were turned over to him by a civilian, - he does not remember the civilian's name. Moreover, he declares in this statement that BECK before mentioned has been evacuated by the American Army.

Furthermore, a statement was obtained from the Burgomaster of BIHAIN, under whose jurisdiction falls the village of REGNE, in which he declares that there are no graves of allied military on the territory of his community including REGNE; - that BECK has been evacuated by the American authorities; - and that BROOKS is entirely unknown to him, and is not buried in the Community.

BECK, killed on the territory of the section of BIHAIN, and a third "Photographi" document, without name, which can have belonged to a killed soldier, and which was handed over to him by a third person who found it on the territory of the section of FRAITURE.

Finally he states that BECk before mentioned has been evacuated by the American Army and has been buried in a cemetery unknown to him. Moreover he states that seven American soldiers have been evacuated from the road at "FRAITURE AU MOULIN", another one from the mill, - all were transported by the American Army to a cemetery unknown to him. To the best of his knowledge there are no American bodies left in this section.






