I'm ATTACHING THIS LETTER TO THE BRONZE STAR AWARD LETTER TO EXPLAIN AND PROVE FOR HOW LONG I SPENT IN THE HOSPITAL AFTER MY INJURY IN FRANCE, THE JEEP THAT I WAS IN HIT A LAND MINE AUG. 30 1944 PUT ME INTO THE HOSPITAL FOR THE MONTHS OF (SEPTEMBER OCTOBER AND MOST OF NOVEMBER) I RETURN TO MY OUTFIT EITHER LAST WEEK IN NOVEMBER OR FIRST WEEK IN DECEMBER 1944

SENATOR ROBERT BYRD (D) W.V. CONGRESSMAN NICK RAHALL (D) W.V. AND I MADE MANY ATTEMPTS TO GET MY MILITARY RECORDS WITH ABSOLUTELY NO SUCCESS WHAT SO EVER, THE ARMY RECORD OFFICE IN ST. LOUIS CLAIMED THERE ~~IS~~ WAS A FIRE AND SOME RECORDS WAS DESTROYED. THESE ARE THE ONLY OFFICIAL MILITARY DOCUMENTS THAT I POSSESS.

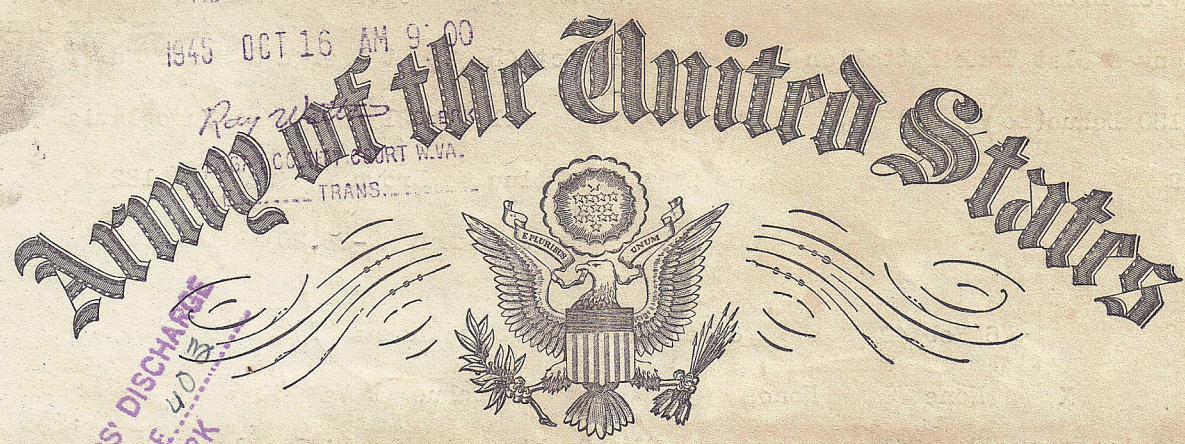

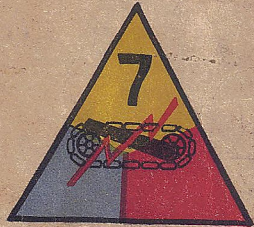

By direction of the President, and under the provisions of AR 600-45, as amended, and Circular No. 25, Headquarters Seventh United States Army, 7 November 1944, as amended, the Bronze Star Medal is awarded to:

CAPTAIN GLENN W. GRIER, JR. (Army Serial Number 01011403), Infantry, 40th Tank Battalion, United States Army, for distinguishing himself by meritorious service in connection with military operations against an enemy of the United States in France, Belgium, Holland and Germany, from 11 August 1944 to 8 May 1945. Entered the military service from North Carolina.

CAPTAIN EVERETT ROBERTS (Army Serial Number 0374550), Cavalry, 87th Cavalry Reconnaissance Squadron Mechanized, United States Army, for distinguishing himself by meritorious service in connection with military operations against an enemy of the United States in France, Belgium, Holland and Germany, from 11 August 1944 to 8 May 1945. Entered the military service from Illinois.

CAPTAIN DAVID J. TRAYNHAM (Army Serial Number 01168954), Field Artillery, 440th Armored Field Artillery Battalion, United States Army, for distinguishing himself by heroic service in connection with military operations against an enemy of the United States in Belgium, from 17 December 1944 to 21 December 1944. 
Enclosed is the additional report I just received from the Internal Revenue Service regarding my inquiry into the whereabouts of the two men who served in the military with your father.

87 th Cavalry Reconnaissance Squadron , Mechanized,

1. By direction of the President, and under the provisions of AR 600- 45, as amended, and Circular No. 25 , Headquarters Seventh United States Army , 7 November 1944, as amended, the Bronze Star Metal was awarded per General Orders No. 100, this headquarters , Dated 15 June 1945, to:

Sergeant Bronk Vidovich (Army Serial Number 15090001), Cavalry, United States Army, for distinguishing himself by heroic Achievement in connection with military operations against an enemy of the United States from 12 August 1944 to 30 August 1944 and from 10 December 1944 to 8 May 1945 in France , Belgium and Germany. During his many months of combat Sergeant Vidovich ably performed as a reconnaissance Corporal , and later the duties of Section Sergeant with grace of personal courage, commanding leadership , and individual resourcefulness. On numerous occasions he demonstrated his outstanding ability to lead men in combat under the most difficult and dangerous circumstances. On 20 December 1944 at St Vith, Belgium, Sergeant Vidovich's platoon was forced to withdraw in the face of overwhelming enemy fire , at which time two members of the platoon were wounded. Sergeant Vidovich at once returned to their aid and despite the fact the enemy was closing in rapidly, he calmly gave them first aid and then succeeded in moving them safely to the rear. By repeated performances of similar nature, Sergeant Vidovich made a definite contribution to the combat efficiency of his unit. His accomplishments reflect high credit upon himself and his organization.
