SYNOPSIS: The casualties listed on attached roster are reported by official records as Missing in Action or Killed in Action during ground operations in the department of Meurthe-et-Moselle, France, from the period 7 September through 3 December 1944. Extensive area searches as well as individual investigations have to date failed to furnish information as to the ultimate disposition of their remains. Efforts to effect association with unidentified recoveries from the area, now interred in U.S. Military Cemeteries, have also proven negative. The lack of specific information regarding the death or burial, limited search in most instances to general localities, however, documents on file in this Office and Office of The Quartermaster General substantiate the fact that numerous investigations covering the entire department of Meurthe-et-Moselle, have been conducted in the course of search operations for all losses, both recovered and unrecovered. The terrain of the Meurthe-et-Moselle department, consists of farm, pasture and forest land which has been under constant use since the cessation of hostilities, thus the possibility of undiscovered graves is remote. It can therefore only be concluded that the remains of the deceased in question were reduced by battle action to a state which precludes recovery or identification, with the exception of two men listed on attached roster who were known to have drowned and their remains never recovered. absence of specific information concerning their deaths, the failure of Field Investigations to provide evidence, and the lack of association with recovered unknowns would tend to substantiate these conclusions. It is recommended that the remains of the individuals listed on these Board Proceedings be considered Non-Recoverable under the provisions of paragraph 3b, Letter, Office of The Quartermaster General, file QMCMP 293, Subject: Processing Board Findings of Non-Recoverability Return of World War, II Dead Program, dated 25 March 1949. Secured statements from mayor M. Antoni who declared the bridge referred to in basic communication must be either at Meriville where some fighting took place, or more likely at Flavigny sur Moselle where the Germans offered stiff resistance.

- 1100. Proceeded to Meriville See M. Eveillard's statement, who owns a cafe at bridgehead on opposite bank and was present during combat. The two skulls he found in bushes could not possibly be identified as none had any teeth left. M. Eveillard accompanied me to the spots where he had discovered remains but no trace of bones or clothes was available.
- 1230. Went to Flavigny and received negative statement from mayor M. Henri Fau. Area is reported to have been thoroughly searched by deminers and this fact leaves very little chance of ever recovering remains of Pvt. Farmer if he actually was killed in this sector. There is no American grave in vicinity.

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

I, the undersigned, FAU Henri, Mayor of FLAVIGNY-sur-Moselle, referring to today's investigation concerning the disappearance of an American soldier called FARMER Leroy T., declare that I do not know anything about the death of said soldier in the territory of the commune. I add that no military graves exist in Flavigny-sur-Moselle.

As section-chief F.F.I.I. I was visited on Sunday 10 September 1944 at about 1500 hrs by two American soldiers coming from Frolois, a sergeant and a common soldier who spoke some French. After having furnished them some information I showed them the way back to Frolois. I doubt if the soldier FARMER was one of these two as at that time there were no more Germans between Flavigny and Frolois.

Moreover I declare that in March 1947 I discovered a human skull, identification of which was impossible; this skull was removed by the Gendarmes of Neuves-Maison whom I had informed. About three weeks later I found another skull in a bush bordering the right bank of the Moselle river in a place called "Les blancs de Hollande", territory of Richardmenil, I recovered these human remains from an American cardboard box. Today we only found the box, the skull had disappeared, probably removed by some wild animals. Both skulls were without teeth.

NARRATIVE OF INVESTIGATION

AUTHORITY AND MATTERS INVESTIGATED:

Pursuant to instructions Chief, Isolated Burials Section, investigation was conducted at Frolois and vicinity, in an effort to locate the remains of Private Leroy T. Farmer, 33 660 024.

FACTS AND CIRCUMSTANCES:

SR and D Report 4049 on Farmer (in 201 File on Smith, James S.) states that Pvt Farmer departed Frolois 10 September 1944 on a mission to take and hold the bridge near Frolois, across the Moselle River. His last known whereabouts were given as "crossed bridge across Moselle River." A resume of the circumstances surrounding his disappearance as set forth in the report, follows: 2nd Bn launched attack to seize and hold high ground E of Frolois across the Moselle River. At 2000, 10 September 1944, F Company encountered heavy enemy resistance with artillery, mortar, small arms and machine gun fire." small arms and machine gun fire."

III. FINDINGS:

Proceeded directly to Frolois where contact was made with the Mayor who declared that since the last investigation, made a year ago, he had personally instigated a search which was without result. He was unable to furnish any clues regarding the disappearance of Pvt Farmer.

The next town visited was Flavigny. Mme Francin, Marguerite, Secretary of the town-hall declared that, to the best of her knowledge, there were no longer any American graves in the territory of the commune. The 12 September, approximately twenty men(German and American) were killed in the assault of the bridge on route No 57 which crosses the Moselle. The Americans were removed immediately by their own troops. Fifteen days later, an American soldier who succeeded in crossing the bridge, was found in the shrubbery alongside the road. He too was evacuated.

If Farmer is the only unresolved casualty in the attack on the bridge, and X-33 (Andilly) is the only unknown from Flavigny (where the bridge is located), the association appears strong.

V. RECOMMENDATION:

Review of Circumstances Surrounding the Disappearance SUBJECT: of Private Leroy T. Farmer, 33660024.

- Private Leroy T. Farmer, 33660024, Infantry, member of Company F, 134th Infantry Regiment, was reported missing in action, not in flying or jump pay status, in France on 11 September 1944 by ETO Shipment Number 201 and presumed dead as of 12 September 1945 under the provisions of Section 5, Missing Persons Act (SR&D No. 4049).
- 2. The Casualty Section file of Private Leroy T. Farmer contains a Missing Report, undated, which shows that Private Farmer departed Frolois, France, on 10 September 1944 on a mission to take and hold the bridge across the Moselle River near Frolois. His last known whereabouts was given as "Crossed bridge across Mosselle River." A resume of the circumstances surrounding his disappearance follows:

"2nd Bn launched attack to seize & hold high ground, E of Froilois across Mosselle R. At 2000, 10 Sept 44 'F' Co. encountered heavy enemy resistance with arty, mortar, small arms and machine gun fire. 'F' Co. was either captured or wounded & has not been heard of since."

- 3. The captured German records contain no information relative to Private Farmer nor do the files of the Memorial Division, Office of the Quartermaster General contain any burial information, at the present, on him.
- The subject person was a member of Company F, 134th Infantry Regiment, whose mission was to take and hold the high ground east of the Moselle River near Frolois, France. Company "F" with the other units of the "2nd Bn" crossed the bridge across the Moselle River at 2000 hours on 10 September 1944. Company "F" encountered heavy enemy artillery, mortar, machine gun and small arms fire. Private Farmer was not seen again after he crossed the bridge. Nothing has been seen or heard of him since.

5. It is, therefore, concluded that the information of record in the Department of the Army, at this time, does not conclusively establish the place, date and fact of death pursuant to the provisions of Section 9 of the Missing Persons Act and the issuance of an official report of death is not warranted.
