THE FACTS AND CIRCUMSTANCES HAVE BEEN FOUND TO BE SUBSTANTIALLY AS PRESENTED IN THE ATTACHED PROCEEDINGS OF THE FIELD BOARD OF REVIEW, WITH THE FOLLOWING EXCEPTIONS:

MIA on 15 July 1944 in the vicinity of St. Lo, France.

In an effort to establish the place of burial of the decedent, and to confirm the information which Sgt Russell Bianchi had given to the mother of the decedent that he saw the grave of Pvt Stanislaus J. Makowski on top of a hill near St. Lo, Sgt Bianchi was contacted by telephone. He stated that he visited an American Military Cemetery in the St. Lo Area, the name of which he did not remember, and while there he saw a grave with the name on the marker similar to Makowski. He further stated that since Pvt. Makowski was a family friend he wrote to his mother and stated that he thought he saw the grave of Makowski on top of a hill near St. Lo. However, since he did not know the correct spelling of the name, he could not state positively that he saw the grave, and he further believes that it was the grave of someone with a name similar to Makowski and not Pvt Stanislaus J. Makowski.

SYNOPSIS: The casualties listed on attached roster are reporte by official records as Missing In Action or Killed In Action during grouair or naval operations in the department of Manche, France, from the period of 5 June 1944 to 15 August 1944. Extensive area searches as wel. as individual investigations have to date failed to furnish information as to the ultimate disposition of their remains. Efforts to effect association with unidentified recoveries from the area, now interred in U.S. Military Cemeteries, have also proven negative. The lack of specifi information regarding the death or burial, limited search in most instances to general localities, however, documents on file in this Offic and Office of The Quartermaster General substantiate the fact that numerous investigations covering the entire department of the Manche, have been conducted in the course of search operations for all losses, both recovered and unrecovered. The terrain of the Manche department, for the most part, consists of farm and pasture land which has been under constant cultivation and daily use since the cessation of hostilities, thus the possibility of undiscovered graves is remote. It can therefore only be concluded that the remains of the deceased in question were reduced by battle action to a state which precludes recovery or identification. The absence of specific information concerning their deaths, the failure of Field Investigations to provide evidence, and the lack of association with recovered unknowns would tend to substantiate these

conclusions. It is recommended that the remains of the individuals listed in these Board Proceedings be considered Non-Recoverable under the provisions of paragraph 3b, Letter, Office of The Quartermaster General, file QMGMP 293, Subject: Processing Board Findings of Non-Recoverability Return of World War II Dead Program, dated 25 March 1949.

Makewski was a family friend Sgt. Bianchi wrote to his mother and stated that he thought he saw the grave of Makewski on top of a hill near St. Lo. However since he did not know the correct spelling of the name, he could not state positively that he saw the grave and further believes it was the grave of someone with a name similar to Makewski and not Pvt. Stanislaus J. Makewski.

MEMORANDUM FOR RECORD:

SUBJECT: Review of the Circumstances surrounding the Dissappearance of Privat Stanislaus J. Makowski, ASN 32 562 358, Engrs.

1. Shipment No. 142, ETO, reported the above named soldier a member of Company A, 60th Engineer Battalion, Missing in Action, in France on 15 July 1944, and under the provisions of Section 5, Public Law 490, 7 March 1942, as amended, a Finding of Death was made in his case (SR&D 3511), showing the presumed date of death as 16 July 1945.

2. The records show that the above named soldier was with a tank-infantryengineer team which left their station on 15 July 1944 on a demolition mission to blow gaps in the hedgerows at coordinates 49 9' N 1 4' W approximately 2 miles northeast of St. Lo, Normandy, France. He was a member of a squad, under the command of T/4 Olsen, and with 2 other soldiers was to blow gaps in a hedgerow for approaching tanks. About 30 minutes later T/4 Olsen found that Makowski's two comrades were wounded and he (Makowski) had disappeared. Due to enemy fire, mounting casualties and confusion in the area, the whereabouts of Makowski could not be checked at the time. In reply to an inquiry for circumstances concerning the disappearance of Private Makowski, Pfc Bellasalmo, one of his comrades on this mission and who was wounded at the time, stated that it was about 6:00 am on 15 July 1944, and the ground mist was rapidly rising making it very light with visibility good when he was ordered where to place his charge. This he did and observed that the enemy was approximately 100 to 200 yards to the front and flanks of their position. After placing his charge he moved along the hedgerows behind him to the right still wearing his pack loaded with 20 pounds of TNT. He passed from his sight and at that minute the enemy started a barrage which was so intense that, even though wounded he (Ballasalmo) could not be evacuated for 6 hours. He never saw Makowski again. PFC Henry who was also with Makowski at the time makes practically the same statement, however he was wounded and evacuated immediately.

3. There is no record found that Makowski was every reported a Prisoner of War of the German government, nor, is there any record that his body was located and identified. Nothing has been found in the captured German records pertaining to this soldier. There is a notation in the SR&D 3511 case folder to the effect that Sergeant Russell Bianchi, ASN 32 762 062 informed Mrs. Gladdys Makowski, mother of this soldier, that he saw Stanislaus Makowski's grave on top of a hill near St. Lo, France. Chief, Memorial Branch, OQMG was notified by this office under date of 18 July 1945, and upon my inquiry by telephone 5 October 1949, Mr. Newbaker reported that he would try and contact Sgt. Bianchi

MEMORANDUM FOR: Chief, Casualty Branch

SUBJECT: Review and Determination of Status Under the Missing Persons Act.

I. - FACTS

1. The enlisted man named below of Company A, 60th Engineer Combat Battalion, was reported missing in action in France by ETO Shipment No. 142, and has been carried on the War Department records as missing in action since 15 July 1944:

- 2. A "Missing Report", dated 18 July 1944, from the Commanding Officer, Company A, 60th Engineer Combat Battalion, is filed in Private Makowski's AG 201 file. This report states that on 155July 1944 a tank-infantry-engineer team left a place disignated as 6F/2 526666 (St. Lo Sheet) on a mission to breach hedgerows. Private Makowski was a member of a squad under the command of Technician Fourth Grade Lester W. Olsen. The subject enlisted man and Privates Bellasalmo and Henry were to blow gaps in the hedgerow for approaching tanks while three other members of the squad went to place a charge about 75 yards away. About 30 minutes later Technician Fourth Grade Olsen found that Privates Bellasalmo and Henry were wounded and that Private Makowski had disappeared. It was stated that due to enemy fire, mounting casualties and confusion the whereabouts of Private Makowski could not be checked at the time, but that the enlisted men who were with him should be able to furnish additional information. The last known whereabouts of Private Makowski was given as 6F /2 525660 (St. Lo Sheet).
- 3. Army Map service advised that the map reference 526666 locates a point at the coordinates $49^{\circ}09^{\circ}$ North, $1^{\circ}04^{\circ}$ West, about 32° miles northeast of St. Lo, France, and that the location 525660 is about 30 seconds south of the first position.
- 4. Message form, dated 21 April 1945, from this office to the Commanding General, U.S. F., European Theater of Operations, requested that statements concerning the disappearance of Private Makowski be obtained from Private First Class Marco A. Bellasalmo and Private John J. Henry. By 4th Indorsement, dated 4 May 1945, Headquarters, 60th Engineer Combat Battalion, forwarded the statement as Inclosures Nos 1 and 2. These statements read as follows:

Statement of Private First Class Marco A. Bellasalmo

"Makowski and I were part of a demolition squad whose mission was to blow gaps in hedgerows to permit tanks to advance. We were attached to the 134th Infantry Regiment and the attack toward St. Lo, Normandy, France, started at approximately 0500 hours, 15 July 1944. The squad was split into demolition sections and we advanced with the lead infantrymen until we were stopped by a hedgerow. At this time it was close to 0600, very light and visibility was good as the ground mist was rapidly rising. The tank commander told me where to place our demolition charges and I did so. The enemy at this time was about 100-200 yards to our front and also on our flanks.

"After placing my charges I went about twenty yards away, along the hedgerow and knelt beside Pfc Henry, awaiting further orders. I noticed Makowski walk along the hedgerow behind me to my right. He was still wearing his pack on his back. The pack was loaded with 20 pounds of TNT. He passed from my sight and at that minute the enemy started dropping in mortars and machine guns opened up. The first mortar shell wounded me in the arm and leg and I crawled to a nearby fox-hole. The blast of the exploding shell stopped my watch at exactly 0600. The barrage was so intense that it was not possible to evacuate me until approximately 1200. I did not see him after being wounded, and have not seen him since."

Statement of Private First Class John J. Henry

"Stanislaus Makowski and I were in the same squad and we were given the job of blowing gaps in the hedgerow so tanks could go through. Each of us carried 20 pounds of TNT in packs on our backs. We attacked near St. Lo, Normandy, France around 0500 on 15 July 1944. We came to our hedgerow around 0600 and it was very light and the air was clear at this time. Pfc Bellasalmo placed his explosions in the hedgerow and I walked about 20 yards away, knelt on the ground next to the hedgerow and placed my 20 pounds of TNT on the ground beside me, awaiting further orders. Bellasalmo placed his charges in the hedgerow and walked over and knelt beside me. At this time, Makowski walked behind us from left to right and I told him to get down on the ground because the Germans were pretty close. I should judge that at that the Germans were

about 1500 yards away. Makowski didn't pay any attention to me though, and kept walking away from me, down the hedgerow. I noticed that ht was still carrying his 20 pounds of TNT on his back in the pack. At that moment, the enemy opened up with mortar and machine gun fire. The first mortar shell landed near me and wounded me in the back. Two men from my squad ran over from the left and immediately evacuated me. I did not see him after being wounded and have not seen him since."

5. An examination of the Enlisted Branch and Casualty Branch files of this enlisted man and the index in the Prisoner of War Information Bureau, PMGO, revealed no pertinent information not considered herein.

II - CONCLUSIONS

- 1. On 15 July 1944 Private Makowski was a member of a demolition squad on a mission to blow gaps in the hedgerows near St. Lo, France. Each member of the squad carried 20 pounds of TNT in a pack on his back. Private Makowski was last seen about 0600 walking down a hedgerow, still carrying his pack of explosives. At approximately the same time the area came under intense mortar and machine gun fire from enemy positions about 150 yards away.
- 2. A period of twelve months has now elapsed since this enlisted man has been seen or heard from by any one. In view of the foregoing, it is concluded that he may not reasonably be presumed to be living.

III - RECOMMENDATIONS

It is recommended that a finding of death be made, as of 16 July 1945, in the case of Private Stanislaus J. Makowski, 32,562,358, under the provision of Section 5 of the Missing Persons Act.

SWORN STATEMENT

1

Private First Class John J. Henry, 32,790,822, Company A, 60th Engineer Combat Battalion, having had his rights and privileges under the provisions of the 24th Article of War explained to him, made the following statement:

Stanislaus Makowski and I were in the same squad and we were given the job of blowing gaps in the hedgerow so tanks could go through. Each of us carried 20 pounds of TNT in packs on our backs. We attacked near St Lo, Normandy, France, around 0500 on 15 July 1944. We came to one hedgerow around 0600 and it was very light and the air was clear at this time. Pfc Bellasalmo placed his explosives in the hedgerow and I walked about 20 yards away knelt on the ground next to the hedgerow and placed my 20 pounds of TNT on the ground beside me, awaiting further orders. Bellasalmo placed his charges in the hedgerow and walked over and knelt beside me. At this time, Makowski walked behind us from left to right and I told him to get down on the ground because the Germans were pretty close. I should judge that at that time the Germans were about 150 yards away. Makowski didn't pay any attention to me though, and kept walking away from me, down the hedgerow. I noticed that ht was still carrying his 20 pounds of TNT on his back in the pack. At that moment, the enemy opened up with mortar and machine gun fire. The first mortar shell landed near me and wounded me in the back. Two of the men from my squad ran over from the left and immediately evacuated me. I did not see him after being wounded and have not seen him since.

Dear Mrs. Makowski:

I am again writing you concerning your son, Private Stanislaus J. Makowski, 32,562,358, who was previously reported missing in action since 15 July 1944.

It distresses me to have to inform you that no report of any change in his status has yet been received. If at the expiration of twelve months a missing person has not been accounted for, all available information regarding the circumstances attending his disappearance is reinformation regarding the circumstances attending his disappearance is reviewed under theorovisions of Public Law 490, 77th Congress, as amended, at which time a determination of his status is made. Before the twelve months' period has elapsed all data or evidence obtainable from any source which may be of any significance in the case is carefully considered. Occasionally relatives and friends of missing personnel receive communications containing pertinent and reliable information not officially reported to the war Department. If you have received any such communications and will send them or photostatic copies of them to this office, it will be greatly appreciated. After their review they will be returned to you if you so desire.

The War Department is mindful of the anguish you have so long endured and you may rest assured that, without any further request on your part, you will be advised promptly if any additional information concerning your loved one is received. Should it become necessary to establish his status in accordance with the provisions of the law cited, you will be notified of the findings shortly after the expiration of the twelve months absence.

You have my heartfelt sympathy in your sorrow and it is my earnest hope that the fortitude which has sustained you in the past will continue through this distressing period of uncertainty.

I am writing you concerning your son, Private Stanislaus
J. Makowski, who has been reported missing in action in France since
15 July 1944.

It is sincerely regretted that up to the present time no further infofmation regarding the status of your son has reached the War Department. A report has now been received, however, which discloses that on 15 July Private Makowski was a member of a squad on a mission to blow gaps in hedgerows on the approach of enemy tanks, in the vicinity of St. Lo, France. Enemy mortar fire was encountered during the mission and your son failed to return, but the report contains no other details surrounding the disappearance of Private Makowski.

Lists of prisoners of war received from the enemy, through the International Red Cross, have been carefully checked, but Private Makowski's name has not been found on any of them. The Military authorities are utilizing all the means at their disposal to locate our men missing in action, and you may be assured that if any information is received in this office concerning your son, it will be communicated to you without delay.

My sympathy is with you during this long and difficult period of anxiety.

You may be certain that when any information is received, it will be promptly transmitted to you. In the event no additional information is received within the next three months, I will again communicate with you.

Dear Mrs. Makowski:

This letter is to confirm my recent telegram in which you were regretfully informed that your son, Private Stanislaus J. Makowski, 32,562,358, Corps of Engineers, has been reported missing in action in France since 15 July 1944.

I know that added distress is caused by failure to receive more information or details. Therefore, I wish to assure you that at any time additional information is received it will be transmitted to any time additional information is received, and, if in the meantime no additional information you without delay, and, if in the meantime no additional information is received, I will again communicate with you at the expiration of three months.

The term "missing in action" is used only to indicate that the whereabouts of status of an individual is not immediately known. It is not intended to convey the impression that the case is closed. It wish to emphasize that every effort is exerted continuously to clear up the status of our personnel. Under war conditions this is a difficult task as you must realily realize. Experience has shown that many persons reported missing in action are subsequently reported as prisoners of war, but as this information is furnished by countries with which we are at war, the War Department is helpless to expedite such reports. However, in order to relieve financial worry, Congress has enacted legislation which continues in force the pay, allowances and allotments to dependents of personnel being carried in a missing status.

Permit me to extend to you my heartfeld sympathy during this period of uncertainty.



Private First Class Marco A. Bellasalmo, 32787818, Company A, 60th Engineer Combat Battalion, having had his rights and privileges under the provisions of the 24th Article of War explained to him, made the following sworn statement:

Makowski and I were part of a demolition squad whose mission was to blow gaps in hedgerows to premit tanks to advance. We were attached to the 134th Infantry Regiment and the attack toward St Lo, Normandy, France, started at approximately 0500 hours, 15 July 1944. The squad was split into demokition sections and we advanced with the lead infantrymen until we were stopped by a hedgerow. At this time it was close to 0600, very light and visibility was good as the ground mist was rapidly rising. The tank commander told me where to place our demolition charges and I did so. The enemy at this time was about 100-200 yards to our front and also on our flanks.

After placing my charges I went about twenty yards away, along the hedgerow and knelt beside Pfc Henry, awaiting further orders. I noticed Makowski walk along the hedgerow behind me to my right. He was still wearing his pack on his back. The pack was loaded with 20 pounds of TNT. He passed from my sight and at that minute the enemy started dropping in mortars and machine guns opened up. The first mortar shell wounded me in the arm and leg and I crawled to a nearby fox-hole. The blast of the exploding shell stopped my watch at exactly \$600. The barrage was so intense that it was not possible to evacuate me until approximately 1200. I did not see him after being wounded, and have not seen him since.

BRIEF RESUME OF CIRCUMSTANCES SURROUNDING DISAPPEARANCE; One half squad was performing mission with 3rd Plat. Co "G" 134th Inf. under command of Tec 4 Lester W. Olsen, 32797100. Pfc Ballasalmo, Pvts Henry & Makowski were left to blow gap in Hedgerow on approach of tanks. Tec 4 Olsen, Pfc Famiglietti, & Pvt Ferraro left to place another charge approximately 75 yds away. Approximately 30 minutes later Tec 4 Olsen returned and found Pfc Bellasalmo & Pvt. Henry wounded from enemy mortar fire, and Pvt Makowski had dissappeared.

STATEMENTS OF WITNESSES, IF ANY: To the best of my knowledge the above resume are the facts concerning the dissappearance of Pvt Makowski. Due to enemy fire, mounting casualties, and confusion to check upon the whereabouts of Pvt. Makowski at the time. Pfc Marco A. Bellasalmo, 32787818, and Pvt. John J. Henry, 32790822 who were with Pvt Makowski and wounded in this action and evacuated, should be able to furnish more information.

REMARKS: (Any information not covered above, including details and results of search, if any, conducted)

Above information is as complete as this unit knows. More information could be obtained from above wounded men.

Dear Mrs. Makowski:

Since your son, Private Stanislaus J. Makowski, 32,562,358, Corps of Engineers, was reported missing in action 15 July 1944, the War Department has entertained the hope that he survived and that information would be revealed dispelling the uncertainty surrounding his absence. However, as in many cases, the conditions of warfare deny us such information. The record concerning your son shows that he was a member of a demolition squad on a mission to blow gaps in hedgerows about two miles northeast of St. Lo. France, on 15 July 1944. He was walking down a hedgerow to place his charge when the enemy opened fire with mortars and machine guns. Your son was not seen again.

Full consideration has recently been given to all available information bearing on the absence of your son, including all records, reports and circumstances. These have been carefully reviewed and considered. In view of the fact that twelve months have now expired without the receipt of evidence to support a continued presumption of survival, the War Department must terminate such absence by a presumptive fiding of death. Accordingly, an official finding of death has been recorded under the provisions of Public Law 490, 77th Congress, approved March 7, 1942, as amended.

The finding does not establish an actual or probable date of death; however, as required by law it includes a presumptive date of death for the termination of pay and allowances, settlement of accounts and payment of death gratuities. In the case of your son this date has been set as 16 July 1945, the day following the expiration of twelve months' absence.

I regret the necessity for this message but trust that the ending of a long period of uncertainty may give at least some small measure of consolation. I hope you may find sustaining comfort in the thought that the uncertainty with which war has surrounded the absence of your son has enhanced the honor of his service to his country and of his sacrifice.

60TH ENGINEER COMBAT BATTALION

After Action Report

On 5 July 1944, the Battalion embarked for the beaches of Normandy, loaded into 4 LST's. The Channel crossing was rough but otherwise uneventful. Omaha Beach was reached on 7 July 44.

Immediately after disembarking, liaison was established with Division and XIX Corps Headquarters, to which the Division was attached. On 10 July 44, the Division and Battalion started active participation in the battle for St. Lo, France about 1/4 miles east of Aire and experienced its first enemy artillery fire that night. Thus commenced the travels of the 60th on the European Continent; moving its Command Post 63 times across the face of Europe until finally reaching American shores again in September 1945 via the QUEEN MARY.

The primary mission of the Engineers is to facilitate the movement of our own troops, impede the movement of the enemy and provide for shelter and comfort for our own troops. To best accomplish this; one Company, A,B or C, was normally placed in direct support of each attacking Regiment, the 134th, 137th and 320th respectively. What's an Engineering Mission? Well, let's take a road; The Engineers made that road, and there were many of them in Europe, passable to both foot troops and mechanized traffic. In all cases, the road had to be swept for mines. When mines were found, they had to be cleared. When the Engineers found a road block, it had to be eradicated. When a bridge was out, the Engineers put one in. Making the European roads passable, and they were almost all bad, was done under constant enemy observation and continuous danger. But read weren't all. There were many rivers to be crossed, and the Engineers manned theboats that took the assaulting Infantry across those rivers. There was water to be supplied to the entire Division -15,000 thirsty G.I.'s, and the Engineers filled the canteen cups. And there were thousands of enemy mines to be found, blown up and deactivated, and C.P.'s to be dug in and defense works to be constructed and demolition charges to be placed, and pillboxes blown up and many friendly minefields to be laid to confront the Naze. To accomplish all this the Battalion inner structure had to run smoothly; supplies had to be gotten and distributed and the motors of ninety- vehicles had to be ready to start rolling at a minute's notice.

The Division was attached to the First Army when a hill at St. Lo appeared over the horizon. Hill No. 122 to the Engineers who supplied 5 platoons under command of Major Thomas E. Virgin, forming an Engineer Task Force which assisted in it taking. The Normandy hedgerows were an obstacle that the 60th Engineers successfully breached, paving the way for the advance of the tanks and Infantry. Easy to read on paper, but our first heavy casualties occurred in this attack on St. Lo., mostly from Company A, encurred from anti-personnel mines and mortar fire while sweeping for mines. Thus ended the battle for Normandy.

MEMORANDUM FOR RECORD:

SUBJECT: Review of the Circumstances Surrounding the Disappearance of Private Stanislaus J. Makowski, ASN 32 562 358, Engrs.

- 1. Shipment No. 142, ETO, reported the above named soldier a member of Company A, 60th Engineer Battalion, Missing in Action, in France on 15 July 1944, and under the provisions of Section 5, Public Law 490, 7 March 1942, as amended, a Finding of Death was made in his case (SR&D 3511), showing the presumed date of death as 16 July 1945.
- The records show that the above named soldier was with a tank-infantryengineer team which left their station on 15 July 1944 on a demolition mission to blow gaps in the hedgerows at coordinates 49° 9' N 1° 4' W approximately 2 miles northeast of St. Lo, Normandy, France. He was a member of a squad, under the command of T/4 Olsen, and with 2 other soldiers was to blow gaps in a hedgerow for approaching tanks. About 30 minutes later T/4 Olsen found that Makowski's two comrades were wounded and he (Makowski) had disappeared. Due to enemy fire, mounting casualties and confusion in the area, the whereabouts of Makowski could not be checked at the time. In reply to an inquiry for circumstances concerning the disappearance of Private Makowski, Pfc Bellasalmo, one of his comrades on this mission and who was wounded at the time, stated that it was about 6:00 am on 15 July 1944, and the ground mist was rapidly rising making it very light with visibility good when he was ordered where to place his charge. This he did and observed that the enemy was approximately 100 to 200 yards to the front and flanks of their position. After placing his charge he moved along the hedgerow awaiting further orders. At this time Makowski was walking along the hedgerows behind him to the right still wearing his pack loaded with 20 pounds of TNT. He passed from his sight and at that minute the enemy started a barrage which was so intense that, even though wounded he (Ballasalmo) could not be evacuated for 6 hours. He never saw Makowski again. PFC Henry who was also with Makowski at the time makes practically the same statement, however he was wounded and evacuated immediately.
- 3. There is no record found that Makowski was ever reported a Prisoner of War of the German government, nor, is there any record that his body was located and identified. Nothing has been found in the captured German records pertaining to this soldier. There is a notation in the SR&D 3511 case folder to the effect that Sergeant Russell Bianchi, ASN 32 762 062 informed Mrs. Gladdys Makowski, mother of this soldier, that he saw Stanislaus Makowski's grave on top of a hill near St. Lo, France. Chief, Memorial Branch, OQMG was notified by this office under date of 18 July 1945, and upon my inquiry by telephone 5 October 1949, Mr. Newbaker reported that he would try and contact Sgt. Bianchi

In view of the foregoing, it is concluded that the information on record in the Department of the Army, at this time, does not warrant the issuance of an official report of death pursuant to the provisions of Section 9, of the Missing Persons Act.




