Reference is made to letter dated 23 October 1962 sent on your behalf by Mrs. Anne Springer concerning your son, Private Frederick J. Sieber.

Records in this office indicate that your son, a former member of Co "K", 320th Inf., 35th Inf. Division, was officially reported killed in action on 13 August 1944 in the vicinity of Mortain/Manche, France. The circumstances in your son's case have been carefully reviewed and every possible recovery attempt has been made. These efforts, however, have met with negative results, and the Department of the Army was forced to determine that his remains are not recoverable.

A copy of correspondence from Mrs. Springer has been forwarded to The Adjutant General's Office, 9700 Page Boulevard, St. Louis 32, Missouri, for further reply to you concerning circumstances surrounding Private Sieber's death.

Memorialization of World War II dead whose remains have not been recovered or identified or who have been buried at sea is authorized by law. The names of those memorialized are inscribed on the walls of memorials erected in overseas cemeteries closest to the area where death occurred, without any action required on the part of the family of the deceased serviceman. In such instances, the American Battle Monuments Commission, Washington 25, D.C., is the Agency responsible for the memorialization of those who made the supreme sacrifice. The Commission has an official program under which it furnishes pictures of the memorial panels to the next of kin upon request. In this connection, a copy of Mrs. Springer's letter has been forwarded to the Commission for further action.

I am writing to you for information about the son of one of the mothers of our chapter, Mrs. Alice Sieber. This was all brought about when my husband and I were leaving for France last July to visit the grave of my son, who is buried in the cemetery of St. Laurent in Normandy.

She then said that her son's remains were never found, but that he has a memorium in St. Laurent. So I promised to look for his name inscribed in this memorium and if possible photograph it for her.

Well, when after visiting my son's grave and the graves of other mother's sons in this beautiful cemetery, we came to the "Garden of the Missing", we did not find the name of Frederick John Sieber P. F. C., U. S. Army 32 803847, Co K, 320 Inf., Div. 35. However, we inquired in the office and the very friendly and accommodating gentleman in charge, whose name I do not have at hand, looked it up, and told us this boy's remains were transferred to Brittany, France.

Now, if the government send me such explicit details con-
in 1945

coming my son's death, which put me to such ease, because they compared in part with what his buddy wrote me happened, that I promised Mrs. Sieber that I would inquire for her, so perhaps she can also feel more at ease. She is too nervous to write.

She tells that she received a telegram in 1944, telling that her son was slightly wounded and a week or so later, another saying that he was missing in action. Later she heard a rumor from veterans that the hospital, that her son was in, was bombed. Perhaps this describes the conflicting contents of the two telegrams?

I remember after the war receiving a booklet from the government, explaining, if a parent wants more information concerning the death of her loved one, and they are able to give it, they will be glad to do so. I wrote for information and after receiving it, I was glad that God relieved my son of a living death, which would have been certain, from the information you sent to me, that shrapnel pierced his lung and severed his spinal cord.

This, makes me more grateful when I, as Hospital Chair-lady, of my chapter, visit the Veterans Hospital with other mothers and see all these paraplegics there, ever since they were brought back from the battle areas. Most of their mothers are gone now from worry, but thank God we are here to try in a small way, to take their places and visit their sons and bring them some happiness during their eternal confinement on earth.

Please look up the battle record of this boy and send whatever information you have concerning his death, and the burying place of his remains or the place of his memorium.





MEMORANDUM FOR RECORD:

SUBJECT: Review of Circumstances Surrounding the Disappearance of Personnel Presumed Dead.

1. The following-named enlisted men of Company K, 320th Infantry, were reported missing in action on 13 August 1944, by the source given after each name:

Pvt	Sieber, Frederick J.	32803847	ETO No. 293

Pvt Sieber was initially reported slightly wounded in action on 13 August 1944 and his status was subsequently changed as above by the Shipment number shown and by Casualty Branch Message Number 006014.

2. Findings of Death were made in the cases of the above-named persons, under the provisions of Section 5, Missing Persons Act, by S.R. & D. No. 3848, showing the presumed date of death as 14 August 1945.

3. Pfc McDonald's AG 201 file contains a "Missing Report", dated 4 October 1944, by the Company Commander, 1st Lt Homer W. Kurtz, which states that the company was engaged in a mission to secure high ground northeast of Mortain, France on 13 August 1944. The third battalion attacked northeast of Mortain with company K in the lead and the first platoon plus machine gun sections as advance guard. Pfc McDonald was last seen about one and one-half miles northeast of Mortain, when his platoon was surrounded.

4. a. Pvt Sieber's AG 201 file contains a first indorsement from the Regimental Commander to the Commanding General, 35th Division, dated 16 January 1945, which states that Pvt Sieber was originally reported slightly wounded in action on 13 August 1944 in the vicinity of Mortain, France and that the report was later changed to missing in action on the same date when no reports were received indicating that he ever entered the aid station or any other medical units. His company was actively engaged in combat with the enemy at Mortain on 13 August 1944.

b. In an undated report found in the same source, the Company commander states that Pvt Sieber participated in an attack on the village of Mortain on this date. Members of the organization were questioned but no one had any information other than that he was missing in action.

6. Subject enlisted men were awarded the Combat Infantry Badge by Circular 151, WD 1945.

7. An approved recommendation that the remains of subject men be declared non-recoverable is based on the fact that every effort was made to correlate this case with records pertaining to unknown deceased interred in U.S. Military Cemeteries and reported isolated burials, with negative results. The report contains a copy of a first indorsement, dated 23 November 1948, by the HQ 7856 AGRC Zone #2 to the Commanding General, American Graves Registration Command which reveals that searching operations in the Mortain area have been completed and no trace has been found of a remains which might be identified as those of Pvt Sieber; that files indicate that one of the following three unknowns may be associated with Pvt Sieber: X-40 and X-54, Garron and X-154, Marigny.

8. The above-named men participated in a mission to secure and hold high ground northeast of Mortain, France on 13 August 1944. In the ensuing battle, Pvt Sieber was reported slightly wounded. However, the company was cut off and surrounded by the enemy and upon their withdrawal the two men were listed as missing in action. Field investigation in the Mortain area revealed no trace of remains which might be identified as those subject men. Although it appears plausible that subject soldiers were killed in the action in which they were reported missing, no evidence exists to justify a conclusion to this effect, since there is a possibility of capture by the enemy. In view of the above, it is considered that insufficient information is available to justify the issuance of official reports of death in the cases of the subject men, pursuant to the provisions of Section 9 of the Missing Persons Act.
