

The Board convened pursuant to par 2, Sn 103, Headquarters, 7887 Graves Registration Detachment, APO 757, US Army, 29 August 1950, in Liege, Belgium on 1 - SEPT 1950.  
The purpose of the Board was to determine the non-recoverability status of certain casualties now under jurisdiction of this command.

The Board reviewed report of investigation, statements of witness and other papers, contained in the files of 7887 Graves Registration Detachment, EA, pertaining to the case of the following named casualty/casualties, the remains of which have not been recovered. The case records and other data considered, are attached.

1. It is recommended that the Board take action on the following cases:

SYNOPSIS: The casualties listed on attached roster are reported by official records as Missing In Action or Killed In Action during ground air or naval operations in the department of Manche, France, from the period of 5 June 1944 to 15 August 1944. Extensive area searches as well as individual investigations have to date failed to furnish information as to the ultimate disposition of their remains. Efforts to effect association with unidentified recoveries from the area, now interred in U.S. Military Cemeteries, have also proven negative. The lack of specific information regarding the death or burial, limited search in most instances to general localities, however, documents on file in this Office and Office of The Quartermaster General substantiate the fact that numerous investigations covering the entire department of the Manche, have been conducted in the course of search operations for all losses, both recovered and unrecovered. The terrain of the Manche department, for the most part, consists of farm and pasture land which has been under constant cultivation and daily use since the cessation of hostilities, thus the possibility of undiscovered graves is remote. It can therefore only be concluded that the remains of the deceased in question were reduced by battle action to a state which precludes recovery or identification. The absence of specific information concerning their deaths, the failure of Field Investigations to provide evidence, and the lack of association with recovered unknowns would tend to substantiate these

conclusions. It is recommended that the remains of the individuals listed in these Board Proceedings be considered Non-Recoverable under the provisions of paragraph 3b, Letter, Office of The Quartermaster General, file QMGP 293, Subject: Processing Board Findings of Non-Recoverability Return of World War II Dead Program, dated 25 March 1949.

Reference is made to: OQMG Forms 371; After Action Reports, and Casualty Clearance Plan, concerning each decedent; Reports of Field Investigations previously forwarded to The Office of The Quartermaster General, pertaining to resolved casualties who were killed in action in the department of Manche, France: On file in the Office of The Quartermaster General, Washington, D. C.

2. It is recommended that the remains, based upon the above information and research, be declared non-recoverable.



## 320TH INFANTRY REGIMENT

### After Action Report

9 July 44: Regiment was ordered to move by marching and motor from its bivouac south of Treviers to an assembly area west of St. Clair Sur L'Elle. From this area, the relief of the 175th Infantry, 29th Division, began at dark and continued through the night. The 175th occupied a defensive line extending across the north slopes of Hill 108 and west across the road leading to Le Mesnil Rouxelin, then running north to the vicinity of La Riviere.

Field Order No. 1 was issued at the regimental Command Post, 1800, 10 July 1944 by the regimental Comdr., Col. B. A. Byrne.

Mission: The order directed the advance of the regiment to attack the enemy in the immediate front, and to advance to the north bank of the Vire River just west of St. Lo.

Information of enemy: During the operations, the regiment was opposed by units of the 897th, 898th and 899th Infantry Regiments. These troops were extremely well dug in, and supported by both mobile and heavy artillery. Their machine gun protective lines were very effective and their mortar fire extremely accurate. Their morale was not good, however, and the presence in their ranks of a good proportion of Poles and Russians resulted in the surrender of many prisoners.

Decision on tactical maneuver: The initial line occupied by the 320th was L-shaped, and the plan of maneuver included bringing the right flank, which ran north-south into a line with the left flank running east-west. The 1st Bn. which operated initially on the right was continually confronted with the problem of executing a turning movement while attacking a very tough salient. The 2nd Bn., later replaced by the 3rd, on the left flank, also met very stiff resistance, and any advance in its line created a threat of losing contact with the right battalion.

Units: All three battalions were committed in this action.

Weapons used: The bazooka and hand grenades, and the BAR were found to be very useful in the peculiar type of fighting required by the hedge-rows.

Artillery, tank and air support: In addition to excellent artillery support, M-10 Tank Destroyers were used with good effect in blasting out hedge-row corners. 4.2 chemical mortar gave excellent support during the closing days of the battle. Air support kept the sky clear of planes on a large scale, cloudy weather and poor visibility prevented use of planes in direct support.

Weather: The weather was, for most of the battle, cool and fairly dry. One day of rain, however, left the battlefield and supply roads wet and slippery for several days.

Supply: Supply problems were not acute at any time during the action, because little actual forward movement was involved.

Signal supply especially wire, presented the greatest problem, and this principally because a very complete telephone system was maintained during the early phase of the battle. A tendency among the men to leave their equipment behind during an advance or a withdrawal threatened to create a serious problem until the men learned to appreciate the need for the items they had been issued.

Communications: An unusually complete wire net, both telephone and telegraph, was employed. Communications by wire was maintained throughout the operation; except for about 3 hours when one battalion's wire was cut. Wire was frequently broken by shelling and by tanks, but double lines kept excellent communication.

Radio was used very little, both because several SCR 300 sets were destroyed by shell bursts or bullets, and also because the wire net afforded a quicker means of transmittal in most cases.

Morale and troop efficiency: In this first action, the morale was excellent in the beginning. As familiar leaders were killed or wounded, and especially during the extremely heavy mortar and artillery fire of the 12th and 13th of July 1944, the strain of battle was felt quite severly in some units. The men fought well, but had to take some losses and spend some time in learning the technique of hedge-row fighting.





a. No legal representative or widow of decedent being present at decedent's camp or quarters, effects of decedent were forwarded to this Summary Court-Martial.

b. Local debtors owed decedent's estate \$ None, of which the sum of \$ None was collected. (If nothing was found due or collected, state "None"; otherwise attach itemized statement of sums owing and collected.) (Incl. None.)


