Mr. James F. Dickey, 404 South Newton Street Road, Newton Square, Pennsylvania, visited this Office on 31 January 1964 in regard to his brother, PFC George T. Dickey, SN 33 587 715, a World War II casualty. Our records indicate that Pvt Dickey was killed in action on 9 Sep 44; however, his remains were not recovered.

During our conversation, it was pointed out that a deceased serviceman, whose remains were not recovered, is appropriately memorialized by your Commission. He advises that his mother and father are both dead at this time and wishes to be considered next of kin.

We shall appreciate your sending Mr. Dickey a photograph of the memorial and any other information available. A copy of our letter to Mr. Dickey is inclosed for your information.

After cessation of hostilities many searches were conducted in the general area in an endeavor to locate and recover the remains of our honored dead. Field investigations conducted during October and December 1946 in the immediate area where your brother lost his life revealed that the area was mined and inaccessible to any searching team. A further investigation was carried out in February 1947, after the mines had been removed but no remains were found. The battle area was searched again in September 1950 with negative results.

The Department of the Army has used every scientific means at its disposal in attempts to recover and identify your brother's remains. These investigations were supplemented with examinations and comparison of identification data for your brother against all unidentified remains recovered from the general area, but none of the deceased could be scientifically associated with Private First Class Dickey. Since all searches and investigations failed to recover remains identifiable as those of Private First Class Dickey it was necessary for the Department of the Army to conclude that he was not recoverable. Your mother was informed of this in a letter from this Office dated 7 February 1951 (copy enclosed).

I can well understand how deeply this matter concerns you, and I wish to assure you that findings of nonrecoverability were issued in your brother's case only after every means to recover and identify his remains was exhausted.

Memorialization of World War II dead whose remains have not been recovered or identified or who have been buried at sea is authorized. The names of those memorialized are inscribed on the walls of memorials erected in overseas cemeteries closest to the area where death occurred, without any action required on the part of the family of the deceased serviceman. In such instances, the American Battle Monuments Commission, Washington, D. C., 20360 is the Commission responsible for the memorialization of those who made the supreme sacrifice. The Commission has an official program under which it furnishes pictures of the memorial panels to the next of kin. I am asking the Commission to furnish you photographs and additional information pertaining to the memorial.

Dear Mr. Dickey:

This is in reference to your visit to this Office 31 January 1964 and your inquiries concerning your brother, Private First Class George T. Dickey, who was killed in action during World War II.

Official records reveal that your brother a former member of the 11th Infantry Regiment, 5th Infantry Division was killed in action on 9 September 1944, 18 yards west of Ft. Blaise, south of Metz Moselle, France. Records of the activities of his organization indicate that on 8 September 1944, the 2nd Battalion, 11th Infantry Regiment supporting elements of the 3rd Battalion, 11th Infantry Regiment, made a crossing of the Moselle River near the small town of Dornot, France five miles south of Metz in an area under observation of Fort St. Blaise and Fort Souzy. This operation resulted in a fierce and fanatical resistance by the enemy. From 8 September to 10 September 1944 counterattack after counterattack was launched with artillery and mortars.

The records do not contain an eye witness report of your brother's death. It was reported to the Graves Registration Officials overseas that he was killed by small arms fire that struck him in the side of his head. It is assumed that this information was obtained from some member of his organization who saw him fall, however, the name of the informant is not known.

Needless to say, it was not possible to evacuate the known dead from the area because of the violence of the battle. It was believed that the casualties were buried in the immediate area by the Germans because a number of unmarked mounds were seen in the area by a member of the 11th Infantry Regiment.

Proceedings of a Board of Officers appointed in accordance with letter AGAO-S 293.9 (27 Mar 47) D-M, War Dept, TAGO, 9 April 1947.

The Board convened pursuant to par 2, SO 133, headquarters, 7887 Graves Registration Detachment, APO 757, US Army, 20 October 1950, at Liege, Belgium on *- 8 NOV. 1950*. The purpose of the Board was to determine the non-recoverability status of certain casualties now under jurisdiction of this command.

The Board reviewed report of investigation, statements of witness and other papers, contained in the files of 7887 Graves Registration Detachment, EA, pertaining to the case of the following named casualty/casualties, the remains of which have not been recovered. The case records and other data considered, are attached.

SYNOPSIS: The above mentioned casualties are reported by OCMG Form 371 as Killed in Action, in the vicinity of Dornot, Moselle, France, on the date cited above.

An account of the action in which Lt. Hillyard and Pfc Dickey were reported as killed, is quoted from After Action Report as follows: "On the 8th September 1944 the 2nd Battalion, 11th Inf. supported elements of the 3rd Battalion, 11th Infantry, made a crossing of the Moselle River near the small town of Dornot, France, five miles south of Metz in an area under observation of Fort St. Blaise and Fort Sommy. This operation resulted in a fierce and fanatical resistance by the enemy. From the 8th September 44 to 2100 hours, 10 September 1944, counterattack after counter-attack was launched with tanks, artillery and mortars. Many casualties were suffered by 3rd Battalion, 11th Infantry, during this period".

From information contained in Letter: Subject: Isolated Burials, dated 29 April 1945, it is indicated that the bodies of Lt. Hillyard and Pfc Dickey were left exposed to intense shell fire for approximately three (3) days. It was believed that these men were interred by the enemy in the approximate location of where they were killed due to a number of unmarked mounds observed in the area by a member of their Battalion. Two identified members of the 11th Infantry Regiment; Lt. Nathan Drake and Lt.

SUBJECT: Non-Recoverable

Stephen Lowry were recovered from the area and are now interred in US Military Cometeries, St. Avold, France and Hamm, Luxembourg, respectively.

Field Investigations conducted in the appropriate locality in October and December 1946 revealed that the area was mined and inaccessible to any searching team. Further investigation was carried out in February 1947, after mines had been removed, but no remains were found.

A Field Investigation was again conducted in September 1950, and the area in which the subject casualties were reported killed was thoroughly investigated. Physical search of the area was negative and records kept by town halls and Office of the Demining Service did not disclose any direct information. It is further brought out by the investigation that there is a possibility that graves of one or more American deceased are now under water in a swamp area caused by the overflowing of the Moselle river during periods of high water, however these areas are now under several feet of water which obviates further field investigation.

It is therefore concluded that 1st Lt. Johnny R. Hillyard and Pfc George T. Dickey were killed in action in the vicinity of Dornot, France, and their remains were interred by the enemy in a location which has todote defied recovery. This conclusion can be further substantiated by the fact that no unknowns recovered from the area can be associated with either of the two decedents.

1. The following information was received at this office concerning military personnel believed interred in your section:

a. Death of 1st Lt. Johnny R. HILLYARD, )-450246, 11th Inf. Regt. reported KIA as of 10 September 1944, occurred in woods 1800 yards west of Fort St. Blaise, south of Metz, Moselle, France, coordinates O49348, sheet 6902 ARS a.d. Mosel, reproduced by 664th Engr. Top. Co. (Corps) Sept 1944.

Death was caused by shell fragment entering right side of forehead and right eye, emerging beneath chin.

From information available, subject officer was approximately 5'10" in height, weighed 175 lbs, had dark brown hair. (Dental form #79 is inclosed).

Death was caused by small arms fire, hit three times in side of head, side unknown.

From information available, subject enlisted man was 5'7" in height, weighed 170 lbs, had light wavy hair. Clothing size: shoes 9, shirt 15 1/2 - 33, trousers 33-31.

With reference to both paragraphs a and b above, after death occurred, the bodies were left exposed to intense shell fire for approximately three (3) days. It is believed that these men were buried by the Germans in the approximate location of where they were killed due to a number of unmarked mounds observed in the area by a member of their battalion.

c. Death of Nathan F. DRAKE, O-382849, 11th Inf. Regt. reported KIA as of 8 September 1944, occurred near Dornot, Moselle, France M/R 1/100,000 Central Europe, Saarbrucken, sheet V-1, 798512, approximately 20 yards from southwest corner of the moat at Fort St-Blaise of the Verdun Group.

Death was caused by small arms fire through the head. The body was not evacuated by American forces.

Lt. Drake was moving with forward element of the company and moved to 20 yards of the moat when a German automatic weapon fired from a pillbox about 25 yards away.



11TH INFANTRY REGIMENT

On the 8th of September 1944 the 2nd Battalion, 11th Infantry supported elements of the 3rd Battalion, 11th Infantry, made a crossing of the MOSELLE RIVER near the small town of DORNOT, FRANCE, five miles south of METZ in an area under observation of FORT ST BLAISE and FORT SOMMY. This operation resulted in a fierce and fanatical resistance by the enemy. From the 8th September 44 to 2100 hours, 10 September 1944, counterattack after counterattack was launched with tanks, artillery and mortars. Many casualties were suffered by 3rd Battalion, 11th Infantry, during this period.
