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



Dear Mrs. Lalopat

This Office is in receipt of an inquiry made in your behalf by Mr. George N. Hope, Superintendent of Veterans' Graves, concerning the remains of your son, the late Private First Class Frank Lalopa.

The Department of the Army records disclose that your son was a member of Company K, lith Infantry Regiment, and was killed in action on 9 September 1944, in the vicinity of Moselle, France.

The American Graves Registration Service, in an effort to recover the remains of your son, conducted extensive investigations in the area where he was reported killed. These investigations met with negative results. All unidentified remains recovered as a result of these operations were examined by an accredited anthropologist in an endeavor to establish an association between one of these unknowns and your son. I regret to inform you, however, that such an association could not be made.

After a careful review of the pertinent facts in this case, the Department of the Army has been forced to conclude that the remains of your son are not recoverable.

Realizing the extent of your great loss, it is regretted that there is no grave at which to pay homage. May the knowledge of your son's honorable service to his country be a source of sustaining comfort to you.

"I am very sorry I can't give you the information you need, as I don't have it myself. The Gov. never did give me the full details on my son, Frank Lalopa. Perhaps they will be able to help you and if you should get the information you need, I'd appreciate it very much if you would forward that same information to me, as I would love to have the full details pertaining to my son, Frank Lalopa."

The above letter and answer was in connection with a request that she advise us the name and location of the U. S. Military Cemetery in which this Veteran was finally interred overseas.

The casualties listed on attached roster are re-SYNOPSIS: ported by official records as Missing in Action or Killed in Action during ground or air operations in the department of Moselle, France, from the period 5 September 1944 to 16 March 1945. Extensive area searches as well as individual investigation have to date failed to furnish information as to the ultimate disposition of their remains. Efforts to effect association with unidentified recoveries from the area, now interred in U.S. Military Cemeteries, have also proven negative. The lack of specific information regarding the death or burial, limited search in most instances to general localities, however, documents on file in this Office and Office of The Quartermaster General substantiate the fact that numerous investigations covering the entire department of Moselle have been conducted in the course of search operations for all losses, both recovered and unrecovered. terrain of the Moselle department, for the most part, consists of farm, pasture and forested areas which has been under constant cultivation and supervision by farmers and forest guards, since the cessation of hostilities, thus the possibility of undiscovered graves is remote. It can therefore be concluded that the remains of the deceased in question were reduced by battle action to a state which precludes recovery or identification. The absence of specific information concerning their deaths, the failure of Field Investigations to provide

evidence and the lack of association with recovered unknowns would tend to substantiate these conclusions. It is recommended that the remains of the individuals listed in these Board Proceedings be considered Non-Recoverable under the provisions of paragraph 3b, Letter, Office of The Quartermaster General, file QMGMP 293, Subject: Processing. Board Findings of Non-Recoverability Return of world War II Pead Program, dated 25 March 1949.

It is with deep regret on the part of all associated with your loved one that we write concerning your and our loss. As you know, Frank was killed in action on the 9th of September 1944. It may be of comfort to you to know that chaplains accompany our troops into battle to provide spiritual ministration and such other assistance as is possible.

As a Catholic Chaplain, I wish to assure you that every comfort dear to our Faith was provided. Confessions were heard, Our Lord was received in Holy Communion and the Sacrament of Extreme Unction was administered to the seriously wounded. Since the first day of the conflict soldiers have been offering their prayers in the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass that Eternal Rest be granted their deceased comrades. They have prayed and fought for a speedy and successful peace in the world; they join you in prayers for your loved one for Eternal Peace in the world to come.

"Eternal Rest grant unto him, O Lord, and perpetual light shine upon him. May he rest in Peace."

Information regarding place of burial is furnished by the Quartermaster General, ASF, Washington 25, D. C., when security and censorship permits.

May our Mother of Sorrows comfort you in your hour of need.

AFTER ACTION REPORT

#### 11TH INFANTRY REGIMENT

On the 8th of September 1944, the 2d Battalion, 11th Infantry, supported elements of the 3d Battalion, 11th Inf, that made a crossing of the MOSELLE RIVER near the small town of DORNOT, FRANCE, five miles south of METZ, in an area under observation of FORT ST BLAISE and FORT SOMMY. This operation resulted in a fierce and fanatical resistance by the enemy. Companies "E", "F", "G", and "K", and majority of "H" were crossed when heavy enemy counterattack at dusk compressed bridgehead and stopped crossing of additional elements of 3d Bn. 1st and 3d Battalions continued to hold position on the W bank of the MOSELLE RIVER.

On the 9th September 1944 2nd Battelion and Company "K", 11th Infantry, continued to hold the bridgehead against intense enemy fire and counterattacks. Enemy fire prevented further crossing. Heavy casualties were suffered by the 11th Infantry.
