SYNOPSIS: The casualties listed on attached roster are reported by official records as Missing in Action or Killed in Action during ground or air operations in the department of Moselle, France, from the period 5 September 1944 to 16 March 1945. Extensive area searches as well as individual investigation have to date failed to furnish information as to the ultimate disposition of their remains. Efforts to effect association with unidentified recoveries from the area, now interred in U.S. Military Cemeteries, have also proven negative. The lack of specific information regarding the death or burial, limited search in most instances to general localities, however, documents on file in this Office and Office of The Quartermaster General substantiate the fact that numerous investigations covering the entire department of Moselle have been conducted in the course of search operations for all losses, both recovered and unrecovered. The terrain of the Moselle department, for the most part, consists of farm, pasture and forested areas which has been under constant cultivation and supervision by farmers and forest guards, since the cessation of hostilities, thus the possibility of undiscovered graves is remote. It can therefore be concluded that the remains of the deceased in question were reduced by battle action to a state which precludes recovery or identification. The absence of specific information concerning their deaths, the failure of Field Investigations to provide

evidence and the lack of association with recovered unknowns would tend to substantiate these conclusions. It is recommended that the remains of the individuals listed in these Board Proceedings be considered Non-Recoverable under the provisions of paragraph 3b, Letter, Office of The Quartermaster General, file QMGMP 293, Subject: Processing Board Findings of Non-Recoverability Return of World War II Dead Program, dated 25 March 1949.

Reference is made to: OQMG Forms 371; After Action Reports, and Casualty Clearance Plan; concerning each decedent; Reports of Field Investigations previously forwarded to The Office of The Quartermaster General, pertaining to resolved casualties who were killed in action in the Department of Moselle, France; on file in the Office of The Quartermaster General, Washington, D. 

MEMORANDUM FOR RECORD:

SUBJECT: Review of Circumstances Surrounding the Disappearance of Pvt Willie G. Nash.

1. ETO Casualty Shipment No 210 reported that Pvt Willie G. Nash, 34899335, Infantry, Co E, 11th Infantry, was slightly wounded in action, in France, on 8 September 1944. When he could not be located in a hospital, his status was changed to missing in action on 8 September 1944 by ETO Shipment No 045. Under the provisions of Section 5, Missing Persons Act, a Finding of Death was issued for Private Nash, setting the presumed date of his death as 9 September 1945.

2. Under date of 25 February 1945, a Missing Report was submitted for Private Nash, giving the circumstances surrounding his disappearance substantially as follows:

On 8 September 1944 Company E, 11th Infantry, had for its mission establishing a bridgehead across the Moselle River one-quarter mile east of Dornot, France, and taking command of high ground beyond the river bank. As the attack to establish the bridgehead began, the enemy laid down a heavy barrage of artillery, mortar, and small arms fire. Private Nash was last seen about 500 yards before the east bank of the Moselle River, when he reported to his 1st Sgt Claud W. Hembree, 6652877, that he had been wounded and was able to walk back to an aid station for medical treatment. The first sergeant gave him permission to leave the area to have his wound treated and saw him depart.

Aid stations or clearing stations were checked, but had no record of admitting Private Nash for treatment. The area in which he was wounded was under constant heavy enemy fire. The attack continued until 10 September 1944 and the bridgehead established, but heavy enemy fire repulsed the attack and the company withdrew back across the river.

3. No report has been received from any source that Private Nash was a prisoner of war. The Quartermaster General has no burial report for Private Nash on file at the present time.

4. Since Private Nash was alive and only slightly wounded when he was last reported seen, no conclusion is possible concerning his ultimate

fate until further information has been received. It is possible that he was captured as the company was forced to withdraw, and this possibility needs to be offset before a determination of the date and manner of Private Nash's death can be made under the provisions of Section 9 of the Missing Persons Act.
