Dear Mrs. Schlamp:

An inquiry written in your behalf by Mr. W. E. Schaefer, Dubuque, Iowa, to the Mayor of Dornot, France, concerning your son the late Private First Class Raymond U. Schlamp has been referred to this office for reply.

Units of the American Graves Registration Service are now engaged in searching operations in an endeavor to locate the remains of deceased Americans. As yet, however, no report has been received that your son's remains have been discovered.

Information being utilized by these searching units includes data gathered from captured enemy records, from reports submitted by various commanders as well as fellow soldiers, and from reports rendered after the interrogation of returned prisoners of war.

I sincerely hope that this intensive search will result in the discovery and identification of your son's remains. Please be assured that when further information is received, you will be informed with a minimum of delay.

A copy of Mr. Schaefer's letter has been forwarded to The Adjutant General for direct reply relative to the circumstances surrounding the death of your son as that official has jurisdiction over matters of this nature.

Please accept my sincere sympathy in the loss of your son.

It is with the hope that I can be of assistance to a bereaved mother of one of the United States soldiers that I am writing to you, thinking that you will either have information regarding this soldier, or that perhaps you can obtain some information for us, regarding him and as to what may have become of him.

This soldier's name was Raymond U. Schlamp, and he was a Private First Class, his army serial No., was 36227835, and he was attached to the 11th Infantry, 5th Division. We have received the following information regarding him -

"On September 11, 1944, Private Raymond Schlamp was with a company whose mission was to establish a bridgehead on the east bank of the Moselle River near Fort St. Blaise, France. Our report goes on to say that he was last seen in the vicinity of Dornot, France, but upon reorganization of his company, after withdrawal, he could not be located. We have been told that he was wounded in one leg, apparently from machine gun fire. A thorough search of that area next day revealed no trace of Pvt. 1st Class, Raymond Schlamp.

His mother, Mrs. Mable Schlamp, who lives at 2717 1/2 Central Ave., Dubuque, Iowa, still firmly believes that her son is still alive somewhere, possibly suffering from amnesia, and is in hope of locating him.

In the hope that you or some of the people in your town will know or remember something of this soldier, or that his whereabouts may be known, and we could get in touch with him, we are enclosing a picture of him in his uniform.

Will you please try and be of help to us in our search for information regarding him? Merci! Merci!.

MEMORANDUM FOR RECORD:

SUBJECT: Review of Circumstances Surrounding the Disappearance  
of Pfc Raymond U. Schlamp, 36227835.

1. Private First Class Raymond U. Schlamp, 36227835, Infantry, member of Company G, 11th Infantry Regiment, was reported missing in action, not in flying or jump pay status, in France 11 September 1944 by ETO Shipment Number 202 and presumed dead as of 12 September 1945 under the provisions of Section 5, Missing Persons Act (SR&D Case No. 4049).

2. The AG 201 file of Private Raymond U. Schlamp contains a Missing Report, dated 3 October 1944, which shows that Private Schlamp departed Dornot, France on a mission with his company to establish a bridge head on the east bank of the Moselle River, Fort St. Blaise, France south of Metz. His last known whereabouts was on the east side of the Moselle River three-fourths of a mile east of Dornot. The report shows that a thorough search of the area occupied by the company was made for him without success. A resume of the circumstances surrounding his disappearance reads as follows:

"Pfc Schlamp was wounded in both legs by machine gun fire 8 September 1944 at approximately 1900 hours. The Company at this time was withdrawing from its most forward position. There were a number of casualties at this time and Pfc Schlamp was left behind. On the morning of the 9 September 1944 the Company aid men returned to the position they had left Pfc Schlamp the night before, but he had been moved or had moved."

3. The captured German records contain no information relative to Private Schlamp, nor do the files of the Memorial Division, Office of the Quartermaster General contain any burial information, at the present, on him.

4. The subject person was a member of Company G, 11th Infantry Regiment, whose mission was to establish a bridgehead on the east side of the Moselle River near Dornot, France. Private Schlamp's last known whereabouts was on the east side of the Moselle River about three quarters of a mile east of Dornot. Private Schlamp was wounded in both legs by machine gun fire. About 1900 hours on 8 September 1944 Company "G" withdrew from its most forward positions and Private Schlamp was left behind. On the morning of 9 September 1944 "aid men" of Company "G" searched the area where Private Schlamp was left without finding any trace of him. The captured German records reveal no information of Private Schlamp. Nothing has been seen or heard of him since.

a. The records of this office show that the 11th Infantry Regiment established a bridge-head on the east bank of the Moselle River on or about 8 September 1944 about three quarters of a mile from Dornot, France. On the night of 10 September 1944, their positions having become untenable, it became necessary to withdraw the troops which was done under enemy small arms and artillery fire. Company "G" was mustered on 11 September 1944 and Private Schlamp was reported missing in action as of this date.

5. It is, therefore, concluded that the information of record in the Department of the Army, at this time, does not conclusively establish the place, date and fact of death pursuant to the provisions of Section 9 of the Missing Persons Act and the issuance of an official report of death is not warranted.

S T A T E M E N T

I, the undersigned, BODA Henri, Mayor of Dornot, in reference to your investigation of this day concerning the American soldier by the name of Pfc Raymond U. Schlamp, 36 227 832, declare that I perfectly recall receiving the original of the letter which copy you are showing me, and which came from the American Legion in Dubuque, United States, dated 12 September 1946.

I had at the time transmitted this letter and the picture to your Service in Nancy.

I can positively declare that the body of the abovementioned soldier is not in the territory of my Commune. In fact, all the surrounding area has been searched by the de-miners as well as the population, and also hunters. The surrounding fields are all de-mined, and it seems improbable to me that other bodies of American soldiers will be found in our region. Since the people are back and that the fields are being cultivated again, it would have helped finding other remains, but nothing was reported. I am sorry I cannot furnish any other information and as a conclusion I declare that the soldier SCHLAMP, either dead or alive, is not in our region.



I can certify that since that time I never met an American soldier by the name of Raymond U. Schlamp.

All the inhabitants are back in the village and normally work in their fields and vine-yards. No trace of graves of American soldiers was ever found. The territory is completely de-mined and thus one can go through it all.

Consequently I think that there is no more hope to find a single grave in the territory of Dornot.

Contacted Mr. Boda. He recollects having received original letter from American Legion in September 1946 asking information on subject deceased, which he transmitted to AGRC headquarters. He gave me written statement confirming he never heard of Pfc Raymond U. Schlamp, 30 227 832, and was most emphatic to the effect that no remains of US soldiers are likely to be in territory of his commune.

Dornot is completely de-mined and no surface burial has ever been reported to him since our last visit.

Two (2) more statements concur with above declaration. One from an ex-US-soldier War I, living now in Dornot, Mr. Gient, who would certainly not fail to report the least finding if there should be any.



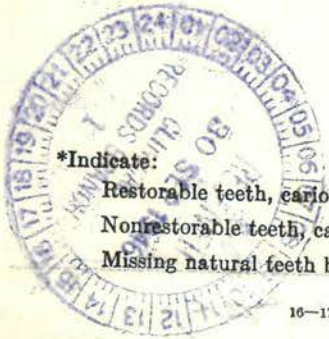

SYNOPSIS: The casualties listed on attached roster are reported by official records as Missing in Action or Killed in Action during ground or air operations in the department of Moselle, France, from the period 5 September 1944 to 16 March 1945. Extensive area searches as well as individual investigation have to date failed to furnish information as to the ultimate disposition of their remains. Efforts to effect association with unidentified recoveries from the area, now interred in U.S. Military Cemeteries, have also proven negative. The lack of specific information regarding the death or burial, limited search in most instances to general localities, however, documents on file in this Office and Office of The Quartermaster General substantiate the fact that numerous investigations covering the entire department of Moselle have been conducted in the course of search operations for all losses, both recovered and unrecovered. The terrain of the Moselle department, for the most part, consists of farm, pasture and forested areas which has been under constant cultivation and supervision by farmers and forest guards, since the cessation of hostilities, thus the possibility of undiscovered graves is remote. It can therefore be concluded that the remains of the deceased in question were reduced by battle action to a state which precludes recovery or identification. The absence of specific information concerning their deaths, the failure of Field Investigations to provide

evidence and the lack of association with recovered unknowns would tend to substantiate these conclusions. It is recommended that the remains of the individuals listed in these Board Proceedings be considered Non-Recoverable under the provisions of paragraph 3b, Letter, Office of The Quartermaster General, file QMGMP 293, Subject: Processing Board Findings of Non-Recoverability Return of World War II Dead Program, dated 25 March 1949.

Reference is made to: OQMG Forms 371; After Action Reports, and Casualty Clearance Plan; concerning each decedent; Reports of Field Investigations previously forwarded to The Office of The Quartermaster General, pertaining to resolved casualties who were killed in action in the Department of Moselle, France; on file in the Office of The Quartermaster General, Washington, D. 

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
