The casualties listed on attached roster are reported by official records as Missing in Action or Killed in Action during ground or air operations in the department of Moselle, France, from the period 5 September 1944 to 16 March 1945. Extensive area searches as well as individual investigation have to date failed to furnish information as to the ultimate disposition of their remains. Efforts to effect association with unidentified recoveries from the area, now interred in U.S. Military Cemeteries, have also proven negative. The lack of specific information regarding the death or burial, limited search in most instances to general localities, however, documents on file in this Office and Office of The Quartermaster General substantiate the fact that numerous investigations covering the entire department of Moselle have been conducted in the course of search operations for all losses, both recovered and unrecovered. terrain of the Moselle department, for the most part, consists of farm, pasture and forested areas which has been under constant cultivation and supervision by farmers and forest guards, since the cessation of hostilities, thus the possibility of undiscovered graves is remote. It can therefore be concluded that the remains of the deceased in question were reduced by battle action to a state which precludes recovery or identification. The absence of specific information concerning their deaths, the failure of Field Investigations to provide

evidence and the lack of association with recovered unknowns would tend to substantiate these conclusions. It is recommended that the remains of the individuals listed in these Board Proceedings be considered Non-Recoverable under the provisions of paragraph 3b, Letter, Office of The Quartermaster General, file QMGMP 293, Subject: Processing Board Findings of Non-Recoverability Return of world war II Dead Program, dated 25 March 1949.

Report of Death

- 1. Technical Sergeant James S. Smith, 6985981, Infantry, member of Company G, 11th Infantry Regiment, was reported missing in action, not in flying or jump pay status, in France on 11 September 1944 by ETO Shipment Number 202 and presumed dead as of 12 September 1945 under the provisions of Section 5, Missing Persons Act (SR&D Case Number 4049).
- 2. The Casualty Section file of Sergeant Smith contains a Missing Report, dated 3 October 1944, signed by Captain K.C. Doty, Personnel Officer 11th Infantry, which shows that he was on duty with his company, as platoon sergeant, which was withdrawing from the east bank of the Moselle River to the west bank 11 September 1944. The resume of circumstances surrounding his disappearance follows: "Company 'G' was moving from the East bank of the river to the West bank. T/Sgt Smith had his platoon on boats so that they could cross the river. There was not room in the boat for T/Sgt Smith, so he sent the boats on across and he started to swim the river. When the company reorganized on the west side of the river T/Sgt Smith was not to be found present."
- a. The 4th Indorsement, dated 18 April 1945, to a letter from this office, AG 201 Smith, James S. (23 Mar 45) 6985951, gives the width of the river as 100 yards; depth 10 feet; swiftness of current 15 to 20 miles per hour. The belief is presented that Sergeant Smith tried to swim the river with all of his clothes, consisting of OD's, leggings and shoes, but that he left his equipment behind. It is stated that he was known to be a good swimmer, but that he was extremely fatigued having been without sleep for sixty hours. The possibility that he may have drifted downstream was presented but that was thought to be improbable.
- b. The records of this office indicate that Company "G" lith Infantry Regiment was on a mission to establish a bridgehead on the east bank of the Moselle River about three quarters of a mile east of Dornot, France.
- 3. The captured German records reveal no information, relative to Sergeant Smith nor do the files of the Quartermaster General coatain any burial information, at the present, on Sergeant Smith.

AC 201 Smith, James S. 6985951 (1 May 50) 4. The subject person was acting as a platoon sergeant on duty with Company C, 11th Infantry Regiment, which was evacuating the east bank to the west bank of the Moselle River on the night of 10 September 1944 near Dornot, France. Sergeant Smith had his platoon loaded on boats for the crossing, when he found that there was not room in the boats for him, he ordered the boats across and started to swim the river with his clothes on. The records indicate that Sergeant Smith was "extremely fatigued, having been without sleep for sixty hours." The Moselle River at this point was about 100 yards wide with a very swift current running about fifteen or twenty miles an hour. The organization was under enemy fire during the crossing of the river. When the Company was mustered Sergeant Smith was found to be missing and no trace of him could be found. The captured German records contain no information of Sergeant Smith. Nothing has been seen or heard of him since. Considering the above facts and the lapse of time it is reasonable to believe that Sergeant Smith died in his attempt to swim the river. 5. It is recommended, therefore, that pursuant to the provisions of Section S, Missing Persons Act, the foregoing information be accepted as an official report of death, stating that the person named in paragraph one, above, Infantry, was killed in action, not in flying or jump pay status, on 11 September 1944 while attempting to swim the Moselle River near Dornot, France. The official report of death will include the following statement: "Finding of Death has been issued previously under Section 5, Public Law 490, 7 March 1942, as amended, showing presumed date of death as 12 September 1945. This 'Report of Death' is issued in accordance with Section 9 of said Act and its effect on prior payments and settlements is as provided in Section 9.
