1. It is recommended that the Board take Action on the following cases:

SYNOPSIS: The casualties listed on attached roster are reported by official records as Missing in Action or Killed in Action during ground or air operations in the department of Moselle, France, from the period 5 September 1944 to 16 March 1945. Extensive area searches as well as individual investigation have to date failed to furnish information as to the ultimate disposition of their remains. Efforts to effect association with unidentified recoveries from the area, now interred in U.S. Military Cemeteries, have also proven negative. The lack of specific information regarding the death or burial, limited search in most instances to general localities, however, documents on file in this Office and Office of The Quartermaster General substantiate the fact that numerous investigations covering the entire department of Moselle have been conducted in the course of search operations for all losses, both recovered and unrecovered. The terrain of the Moselle department, for the most part, consists of farm, pasture and forested areas which has been under constant cultivation and supervision by farmers and forest guards, since the cessation of hostilities, thus the possibility of undiscovered graves is remote. It can therefore be concluded that the remains of the deceased in question were reduced by battle action to a state which precludes recovery or identification. The absence of specific information concerning their deaths, the failure of Field Investigations to provide

evidence and the lack of association with recovered unknowns would tend to substantiate these conclusions. It is recommended that the remains of the individuals listed in these Board Proceedings be considered Non-Recoverable under the provisions of paragraph 3b, Letter, Office of The Quartermaster General, file QMGMP 293, Subject: Processing Board Findings of Non-Recoverability Return of World War II Dead Program, dated 25 March 1949.

Reference is made to: OQMG Forms 371; After Action Reports, and Casualty Clearance Plan; concerning each decedent; Reports of Field Investigations previously forwarded to The Office of The Quartermaster General, pertaining to resolved casualties who were killed in action in the Department of Moselle, France; on file in the Office of The Quartermaster General, Washington, D. C.



1. The following named persons, Infantry, members of Company F, 11th Infantry Regiment were reported missing in action, not in flying or jump pay status, in France on 10 September 1944 by ETO Shipment Numbers 201 and 206, and presumed dead as of 11 September 1945 under the provisions of Section 5, Missing Persons Act (SR&D No. 4042).

2. Filed in the Casualty Section file and AG 201 file of First Lieutenant Matthew Wirtz are duplicate missing Reports, dated 23 September 1944, signed by Captain K.C. Doty, Personnel Officer 11th Infantry. These reports reveal that Lieutenant Wirtz departed Dornot, France on 8 September 1944 on a mission to establish a bridgehead across the Moselle River. The intended destination was Fort Saint Blaise. Lieutenant Wirtz was last known to be in the Moselle River on the night of 10 September 1944 under the following circumstances as described in the reports:

"Brief Resume of Circumstances Surrounding Disappearance:

When ordered to withdraw from the bridgehead, it was necessary for some personnel to swim across the Moselle River to the West Bank.

"Statements of Witnesses, if any: 1st Lt Wirtz was heard by Sgt M.Wm Smith to call for help when he (Lt Wirtz) had swum about half way across the river. Due to extreme darkness, it was impossible to judge Lt Wirtz's exact position when he called for help."

a. Filed in the Casualty Section file of Private Standridge is a Missing report dated 23 September 1944, signed by Captain K. C. Doty, Personnel Officer 11th Infantry. The report is substantially the same as the Missing Report on Lieutenant Wirtz, the other subject person. The report shows that Private Standridge departed Dornot, France on 8 September 1944 with Company F, 11th Infantry to establish a bridgehead across the Moselle River and the intended destination was Fort Saint Blaise, France. The report further shows that Private Standridge

was last seen entering the Moselle River on the night of 10 September 1944 when Company F was ordered to withdraw from the bridgehead. The following "Remarks" appear on the report:

"A search of the area around the river was made the following day but Pvt. Standridge could not be found. A check was also made with the Aid station and they had no record of having evacuated Pvt. Standridge."

3. The captured German documents contain no information relative to the subject persons, nor do the files of the Memorial Division, Office of the Quartermaster General contain any burial information, at the present, on them.

4. The fourth indorsement, dated 18 April 1945, from Headquarters 11th Infantry Regiment, in reply to a letter from this office, relative to Technical Sergeant James S. Smith, 6,985,951, Company G, 11th Infantry, who was on the same mission as the subject persons, gives the width of the river as 100 yards, depth 10 feet and swiftness of current 15 to 20 miles per hour (file reference AG 201 Smith, James S. 6985951, 23 Mar 45)

5. The subject persons were members of Company F, 11th Infantry Regiment which departed Dornot, France on 8 September 1944 to establish a bridgehead across the Moselle River on the east bank, about three quarters of a mile east of Dornot, France. The 11th Infantry was under constant enemy artillery and small arms fire and their positions becoming untenable they were ordered to withdraw to the west bank of the Moselle River, under cover of darkness, on the night of 10 September 1944. The records indicate that some of the men had to swim the river due to a scarcity of boats. The river at this point was 100 yards wide with a current running 15 to 20 miles per hour. Lieutenant Wirtz was seen to enter the river and swim about half way across when he was heard to call for help. Private Standridge was seen to enter the river to swim to the west bank. Due to the extreme darkness the subject soldiers were not seen after entering the river. When the organization was mustered on the morning of 11 September 1944 the subject persons were missing and search for them was futile. The captured German records contain no information of Lieutenant Wirtz or Private Standridge. Nothing has been seen or heard of them since. Considering the above facts and the lapse of time it is reasonable to believe that they died in their attempt to swim the river.

6. It is recommended, therefore, that pursuant to the provisions of Section 9, Missing Persons Act, the foregoing information be accepted as an official report of death stating that the personnel named in paragraph one, above, Infantry,

FINDINGS: The Board having carefully considered the evidence before it, finds the remains of said casualty/casualties are non-recoverable.

SYNOPSIS: The casualties listed on attached roster are reported by official records as Missing in Action or Killed in Action during ground or air operations in the department of Moselle, France, from the period 5 September 1944 to 16 March 1945. Extensive area searches as well as individual investigation have to date failed to furnish information as to the ultimate disposition of their remains. Efforts to effect association with unidentified recoveries from the area, now interred in U.S. Military Cemeteries, have also proven negative. The lack of specific information regarding the death or burial, limited search in most instances to general localities, however, documents on file in this Office and Office of The Quartermaster General substantiate the fact that numerous investigations covering the entire department of Moselle have been conducted in the course of search operations for all losses, both recovered and unrecovered. The terrain of the Moselle department, for the most part, consists of farm, pasture and forested areas which has been under constant cultivation and supervision by farmers and forest guards, since the cessation of hostilities, thus the possibility of undiscovered graves is remote. It can therefore be concluded that the remains of the deceased in question were reduced by battle action to a state which precludes recovery or identification. The absence of specific information concerning their deaths, the failure of Field Investigations to provide

evidence and the lack of association with recovered unknowns would tend to substantiate these conclusions. It is recommended that the remains of the individuals listed in these Board Proceedings be considered Non-Recoverable under the provisions of paragraph 3b, Letter, Office of The Quartermaster General, file QMGMP 293, Subject: Processing Board Findings of Non-Recoverability Return of World War II Dead Program, dated 25 March 1949.



The following named persons Infantry, members of Company F and Company K, 11th Infantry Regiment were reported missing in action, not in flying or jump status, in France on 10 September 1944 by ETO Shipment Number 201 and presumed dead as of 11 September 1945 under the provisions of Section 5 Missing Persons Act (SR&D Case Number 4042):

2. A "Missing Report", dated 23 September 1944, signed by Captain K.C. Doty, Personnel Officer 11th Infantry filed in Technical Sergeant Spear's Casualty Section file shows that he was a member of Company F, 11th Infantry and was reported missing in action on 10 September 1944. The pertinent part of the report is quoted:

"Mission: To establish bridgehead across the Moselle River.

"Point of Departure: Dornot, France." Date 8 September 1944

"Intended Destination: St. St. Blaise

"Last Known Whereabouts: Company C. P. the night of 10 September 1944.

"Brief Resume of Circumstances Surrounding Disappearance: This man was last seen at Company C. P. the night of 10 September 1944 just before withdrawal from bridgehead.

"Remarks: A search of the area was made after the withdrawal from the bridgehead but T/Sgt Spear could not be found. A check was made with the aid station to see if T/Sgt Spear had been evacuated but they had no record of having evacuated T/Sgt Spear."

a. The records indicate that First Lieutenant James E. Wright, also a member of Company F, 11th Infantry, was reported missing under the same circumstances as Sergeant Spear, although his files do not contain a "Missing Report."

b. Filed in the respective AG 201 files of Sergeant Matuszak and Private First Class Williams are "Missing Reports," dated 1 October 1944, signed by Captain K.C. Doty, Personnel Officer 11th Infantry. The "Missing Reports" are the same in essential detail in each case. The report concerning Sergeant Thaddeus S. Matuszak reads in pertinent part:

"Org: Co 'K', 11th Infantry

"Mission: Duty w/Co. in defense of bridgehead.

"Point of Departure: Bridgehead Ebb Moselle River
3/4 Mi from Dornot, France.

"Intended Destination: On the East bank of the River,
to recross to the West Bank, With the
Company.

"Last Known Whereabouts: on the east bank of the River.

"Brief Resume of Circumstances Surrounding Disappearance:
Company withdrawing across river from bridgehead at
night under enemy fire with scarcity of boats, many of the
men swam the river.

"Statement of Witnesses, If Any: Last seen at dark on the
night of withdrawal. At that time he was in good
health and had not been wounded.

"Remarks: Search of records of aid stations failed to
reveal his evacuation as wounded. Records of
other organizations do not show that he turned in any-
where. No physical check of the ground has been
possible."

c. Filed in the AG 201 file of Bennie Ruffolo is a first indorsement, dated 10 February 1945, from Headquarters, 11th Infantry, signed by Captain K.C. Doty, 11th Infantry Personnel Officer to the Commanding General, 5th Infantry

Division, which contains the following pertinent information surrounding the disappearance of this enlisted man:

"c. Private Bennie Ruffolo, Company 'K', 11th Infantry, was last seen after dark on the night of 10 September 1944 on the east bank of the Moselle River, at a point about three quarters of a mile east of the village of Dornot, France. Under constant enemy artillery and small arms fire, the temporary bridgehead established on the east bank of the river became untenable and under cover of darkness, units of our forces were disengaging and withdrawing to the east (sic) bank of the Moselle. Because of the scarcity of boats and the fierce artillery barrage raking the riverbank, a number of men attempted to swim the river. When last seen Private Ruffolo was in good health and had not been wounded. A search of records of aid stations treating casualties failed to reveal his evacuation as wounded. No physical check of the ground was possible."

3. The captured German records contain no information relative to the subject persons, nor do the records of the Memorial Division, Office of the Quartermaster General contain any burial information, at the present, on them.

4. The subject persons were members of Companies F and K, 11th Infantry Regiment which departed Dornot, France on 8 September 1944 to establish a bridgehead across the Moselle River, on the east bank about three quarters of a mile east Dornot, France. The 11th Infantry was under constant enemy artillery and small arms fire, and their positions becoming untenable they were ordered to withdraw to the west bank of the Moselle River, under the cover of darkness, on the night of 10 September 1944. The records indicate that some of the men had to swim the river due to a scarcity of boats although there is no available record of any of the subject persons having attempted to swim the river. The subject persons were last seen on the east bank of the river just prior to the evacuation to the west bank. When the organizations were mustered on the morning of 11 September 1944 they were missing. The captured German records contain no information pertaining to the subject persons. Nothing has been seen or heard of them since.

5. It is, therefore, concluded that the information of record in the Department of the Army, at this time, does not conclusively establish the place, date and fact of death pursuant to the provisions of Section 9 of the

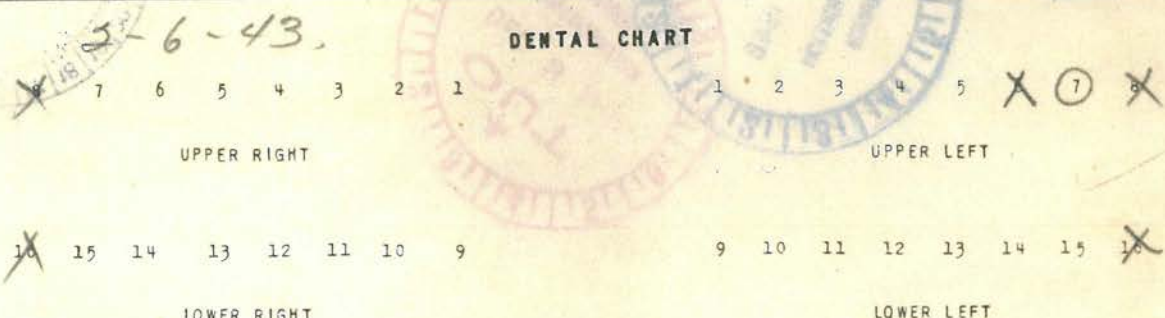
