Dear Mrs. Van Horn:

This office desires to furnish you information concerning the results of the investigations which have been conducted in an effort to recover and/or identify the remains of your son, the late First Lieutenant James B. Van Horn, Jr.

Realizing that this is a matter of great importance to you, may I review the pertinent facts of the case as revealed by Department of the Army records received from our overseas command.

Your son, who was a member of Company B, 11th Infantry Regiment, was engaged in action against the enemy in the vicinity of Fort Briant, France, on 3 October 1944; he was killed by small arms fire approximately twenty yards from the North corner of the main fort at Fort Briant. Due to the stress of combat at the time the incident occurred and, the fact that the enemy regained and occupied the fort for a period of three months, it was not possible to evacuate the remains.

Subsequent to that time, units of the American Graves Registration Service have conducted thorough investigations throughout the Fort Briant area in an attempt to locate the remains of your son; however, no trace of his remains could be found. During these investigations, all available identifying data for unidentified remains recovered in that area, was compared with the dental charts for your son, submitted to this office by Mrs. John Vicent Cogan, but this comparison failed to reveal any remains which could be identified as his. In addition, every effort has been made to correlate his records with the records of unknowns interred in United States Military Cemeteries and reported isolated burials. All efforts have, however, proven futile.

After a careful review of the pertinent facts of the case and the negative results of the investigations, the Department of the Army has been forced to determine that the remains of your son are not recoverable. I wish to assure you that, should any additional evidence come

STATEMENT OF INVESTIGATION

1. 1st Lt. James B. Van Horn, Jr. was reported killed in action by enemy small arms fire approximately twenty (20) yards from the North corner of the main fort at Fort Driant, Moselle, France on 3 October 1944. His identifiable remains have not been recovered.

2. No attempt could be made to evacuate the remains at that time due to the tactical situation, as the Germans regained and occupied the fort for a period of three months. A Field investigation, conducted in the appropriate area in November 1946, disclosed no unknowns that could be associated with subject decedent. Subsequent demining of this area resulted in the recovery of no additional American remains.

3. All attempts by the field to associate unknowns recovered from this area proved negative. Burial Reports for unknowns on file in Identification Branch have been checked for subject deceased, with negative results.

4. All information secured confirms the Findings and substantiates the recommendations made by the Field Board.

The Board convened pursuant to par 2, SO No. 1, Headquarters American Graves Registration Command, APO 757, U.S. Army, 2 January 1950, at the Astoria Hotel, Paris, France, on 23 FEB. 1950. The purpose of the Board was to determine the non-recoverability status of certain casualties now under jurisdiction of this command.

The Board reviewed report of investigation, statements of witnesses and other papers, contained in the files of American Graves Registration Command, EA, pertaining to the case of the following named casualty/casualties, the remains of which have not been recovered. 1. It is recommended that the board take action on the following case:

PLACE OF DEATH: Vic. of Fort Driant, Moselle
France

DATE OF DEATH: 3 October 1944

SYNOPSIS OF CASE: The above mentioned unresolved casualty was a member of Co "B", 11th Inf. Regt., which was engaged in action against the enemy in the vicinity of Fort Driant, France, on 3 October 1944. Information furnished in a report by the Office of the Chief Quartermaster, Com. Zone, indicates that Lt. Van Horn was killed by enemy small arms fire approximately twenty (20) yards from the North corner of the main fort at Fort Driant. Due to the tactical situation at the time this incident occurred, the fact that the enemy regained and occupied the fort for a period of three months, no attempt could be made to evacuate the remains and no subsequent search of the area could be made by the unit concerned. A Field Investigation was conducted in the appropriate area, in November 1946, with negative results. It disclosed the fact that no unknowns recovered from this area could be associated with the subject casualty, and also the fact that there were no additional remains of American deceased recovered during demining operations carried out in this area.

SUBJECT: Non-Recoverable Remains, Cont'd

It is logical to conclude that Lt. James B. Van Horn Jr., was killed in the vicinity of Fort Driant, France, on 3 October 1944, and that his remains were disposed of by the enemy at an unknown location in a manner which precludes recovery. The fact that Field Investigations were negative and the fact that there are no unknown on record that may be associated with subject casualty, would tend to substantiate this conclusion. It is therefore recommended that this case be deemed Non-Recoverable.

Reference is also made to: Report, OCQM Com.Z., dated 26 Apr 1945; Report of Field Investigation, dated 5 Nov. 1946. Copies ATTACHED.

2. All attached supporting documents are copied from records on file Headquarters American Graves Registration Command.

3. Every effort has been made to correlate this case with records in this headquarters pertaining to unknown deceased interred in U.S. Military Cemeteries and reported isolated burials. The results are negative.

4. It is recommended that the remains, based upon the above information and research, be declared Non-Recoverable.

- a. Pfc Anthony J. Shery, 35530540 was killed in action, 4 October 1944 at Fort Driant in the vicinity of Metz, France. See attached copy of 2nd Ind., headquarters, 735th Tank Bn and copy of affidavits, also overlay for additional information.

It is requested that a search be made of the area mentioned in the 2nd Indorsement, to locate the remains or the isolated grave of Anthony J. Shery 35530540.

- b. James B. Van Horn, Jr., O-1303233, 11th Inf was killed 3 October 44 by a German Burp Gun. Death occurred approximately 20 yards from the north corner of the main fort at Fort Driant, France. Map reference sheet #13, Chambley 1/50,000, 771539.

Description: Height - 5'8" Hair - Sandy; wore GI glasses and a school ring.

Request a search be made of area mentioned.

- c. Casimir P. Lobacz, 36228207, 11th Inf Regt was killed 27 September 44 on west side of Fort Driant Metz, Moselle, near moat. MR 1/25,000 Chambley sheet (U770537). It is believed deceased was buried by the Germans.

- 1030 Left Headquarters Nancy to investigate case 184
- 1130 Arrived Gravelotte, where I contacted mayor Mr. Charles Lemoine, who did not have any information regarding the disposition of nine American remains. He could only state that two American remains had been evacuated from the commune sofar and reinterred in St. Avold US Military cemetery. As far as he knew there were no more American isolated burials located in his commune.
- 1400 Interrogated Mr. Rene Lind, secretary of the commune of Ancy-sur-Moselle, who was only able to tell me that the remains of one American had been removed sofar from the commune's territory; therefore the nine remains concerned were not recovered in this commune.
Contacting numerous people reveals that no information of any value could be obtained regarding the burial of nine American bodies. Some people I've questioned seem to have the conception that they were buried in the US Military Cemetery St Avold, but there is nothing definite to this effect.
Have to postpone investigation till the entire area is clear of mines and it can be stated for sure that the nine remains are not buried in this vicinity.

I, the undersigned, LIND Rene, secretary of the commune of Ancy-sur-Moselle, living at Ancy-sur-Moselle, Rue de l'Eglise (boy's school) certify that the American authorities removed the body of an American soldier which was found in the vicinity of Fort Driant (commune of Ancy-sur-Moselle) at the end of April 1946.

I do not know the name of the Unit which removed the remains or the place they transported them to. I do not know either if this soldier has been identified because we did not receive any notice of disinterment.

To the best of my knowledge I declare that there are no more graves of American soldiers in the territory of my commune.

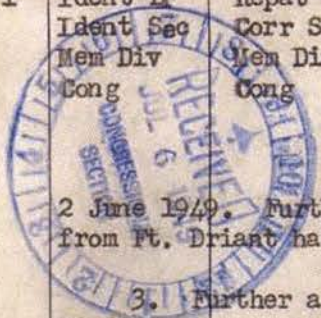

NARRATIVE

A Fr Driant, Ars-s-Moselle (moselle) Mr. Paul FERRY, caretaker of Ft Driant was contacted. He led the investigator to a spot within the fort where a tank had previously been removed by the French Authorities.

On the ground where the tank had been were a few small human bones, pieces of metal from a blown up tank, a portion of shoe, size 11B, a burned shoe, size 9EE, a shattered mess can with the initials J.V.Z. and the name James ZAYER, or ZAYEC.

At a distance of 10yds from the spot the investigator found a few other bones (including the radius).

The area was carefully searched but no other clues or remains were found. Two others destroyed tanks that were within an area of 50 yards had also been removed. All three tanks had been removed to be cut up for salvage and no records of their numbers or markings were ever taken.

Mr. Ferry stated that the tank had probably been blown up by mines and burned during combat in September 1944. No remains had previously been removed from within these three tanks.

Reference is made to your letter requesting information concerning your son, the late First Lieutenant James B. Van Horn, Jr.

It is regretted to have to advise you that, up to the present time, information pertaining to the burial of the remains of your son has not been received at this office. An inquiry is being made to ascertain information regarding the remains of all of our deceased military personnel where burial information has not been received. Upon completion of this inquiry you will be advised as to the results.

At the outbreak of the war it became necessary to adopt the policy that the remains of our military personnel who die at stations outside the United States, shall be interred locally until after the cessation of hostilities, and remain buried there until such time as appropriate means become available for their return. A notation has been made on the official records that it is your desire to have the remains of your son returned to the United States, if possible, for final interment. At the proper time, the legal next of kin will be contacted by this office in order to obtain their wishes regarding the final disposition of the remains.

This office regrets, sincerely, the delay in answering your letter and wishes to extend its deepest sympathy in the loss of your son.

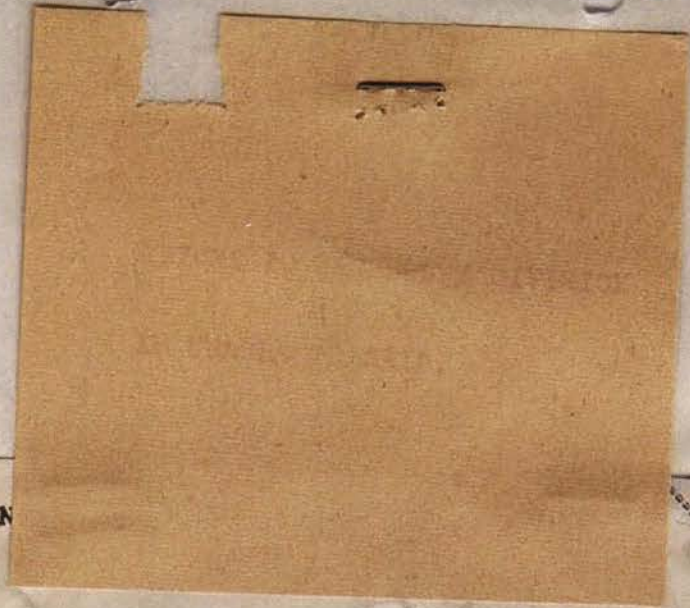
